

## Steel's "Big Five" Accept President's 60-Day Truce Bid

PITTSBURGH, July 15 (AP)—The CIO United Steel Workers today called off its strike against the nation's basic steel mills, as the steel industry's "big five" accepted President Truman's bid for a 60-day truce at the last minute.

The "big five" to accept was U. S. Steel, largest of all American steel industries, which had not even after the other four members of the industrial quintet had given in.

President Philip Murray said he had instructed all local unions to accept the truce at once by all companies except those who had not accepted the truce. He said he did not know of a single company which had refused to accept the truce.

## Crisis in Paralysis Declared

## Attorney General Pushes Tightening of Spud Laws On Packing and Shipping

BOISE, July 15 (AP)—Two important changes clarifying the potato grading and packing law and increasing the penalty for violation have been recommended by Attorney General Robert E. Smylie, in hopes of strengthening the act's application.

The recommendations were included in a letter to D. A. Stubbfield, commissioner of agriculture, after a study of the law. Smylie recommended that the act be amended to include intra-state shipment of potatoes by persons other than the grower. The attorney general also urged designating the violation of the act a felony and increasing the punishment to a fine of not less than \$500 or more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed one year and a day.

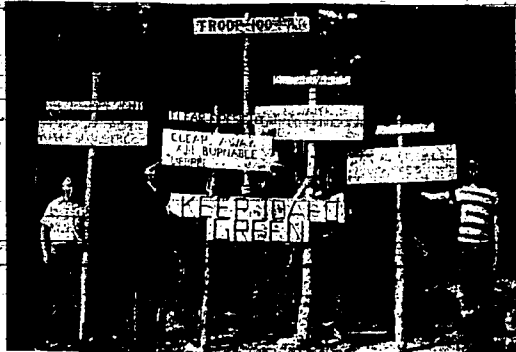
