Eden Man Finds Law Provides Jail Sentences for Motorists

Editor, Times-News:
 Through a copy of "Motor Vehicle Laws of Idaho," I am informed that the law provides for imprisonment on conviction, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county or municipal jail for not less than 15 days nor more than 60 days nor more than \$100 nor more than \$200, or both.

Reckless driving, on conviction, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county or municipal jail for not less than 15 days nor more than 60 days nor more than \$100, or both.

The penalty for failure to stop at a stop sign is about the same as for reckless driving. This book also says that failure, refusal or neglect of justice of peace, or judge of probate courts to issue out sentences in accordance with the laws, make them liable to misconduct in office and subject to removal.

I have been in this predicament a long time but I can't recall being arrested or convicted drunk or working a convict driver's license.

It seems to be an unwritten law among the judges to say away from a jail sentence for a car driver, so they imagine they have done their duty by imposing a small fine, or by depriving the culprit of their driver's license for a few days.

The law should be made liberal if they do not know that everybody has friends who will furnish transportation to friends who have been held up on the judge to permit them to leave the jail, or to permit them to stay on out highways, they must do more than give the violator a slap on the wrist.

If a hungry person picks up a loaf of bread or half frozen pork or eaters a loaf of bread, so to keep warm he is hauled to jail for more than 15 days. In the question of a fine these small offenders do no harm to the community at large, while an irresponsible driver is not only a menace to himself but to the life and property of every law-abiding citizen who uses the highway.

When a man is convicted of a crime he is caught, he or his friends can visit for the money for a fine but a jail sentence is something a law-abiding working man, businessman or tenant cannot afford to leave his job or business for 30 days, without serious loss, besides getting the stigma of a criminal record.

Potential violators would stop, look and listen before risking their reputations or occupation, they know a jail sentence awaited them if caught.

It is a mystery to me why honest, conscientious men will take a job as traffic officers when they have an alright case and take his taxpayer's

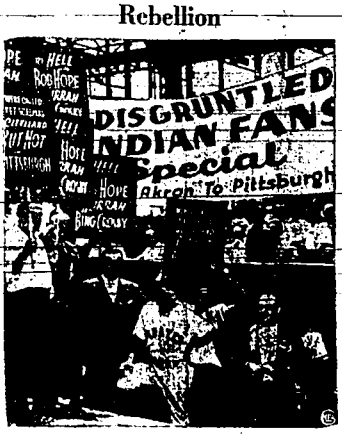
