WASHINGTON, July 26 (AP)—Secretary of State Acheson left it strictly up to congress today to make the explanation—if any are made—about top-level secret talks on atomic matters with Great Britain.

All the secretary himself would do was agree that that was the subject for a hush-hush session at the cabinet level.

He was asked at his news conference if he could "provide any enlightenment on this government's atomic relations with Britain and Canada."

It was a matter that would be discussed with the senate-house joint committee on atomic energy.

Acheson categorically rejected claims made in a Soviet news release that the pact is directed against Russia and that Italy's participation violates its peace treaty with the victors.

## 6 Killed by Coast Plane Crash, Fire

SEATTLE, July 26 (AP)—An air transport with 82 persons aboard crashed into five houses last night in a takeoff from Seattle's Boeing field.

The coroner's office reported many hours later that six bodies had been found in the wreckage of the twin-engine C-46 and the debris of the wrecked homes. The search was continuing. Thirty-six were known to be injured.

Miraculously, most—if not all—of the persons aboard the Chicago-bound, non-schedule plane escaped with their lives. Most of the victims were believed to have perished in the houses.

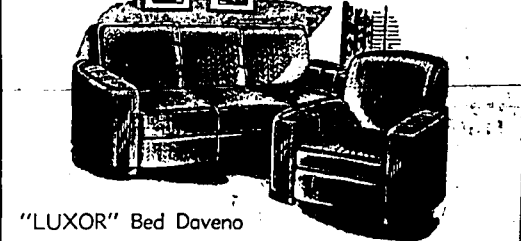

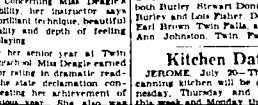

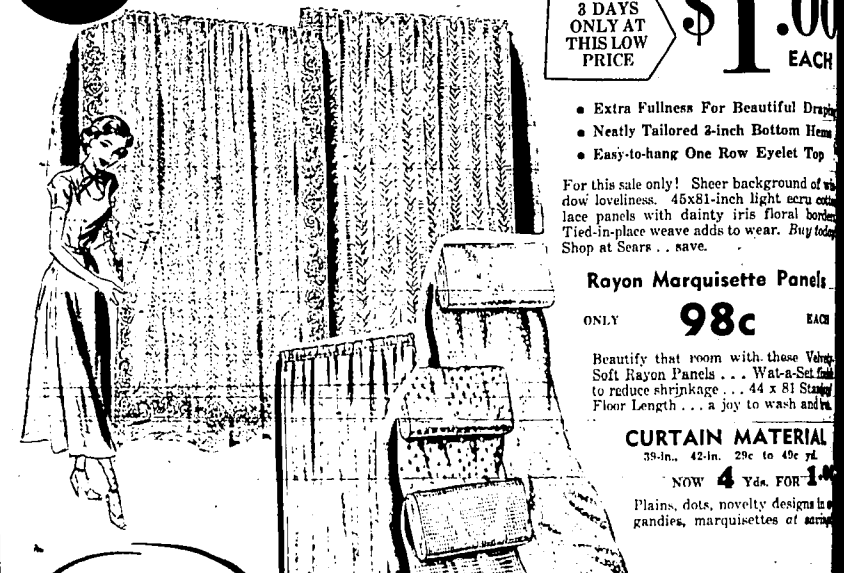

### DDT Doesn't Take Care of Polio Carrier

Doctors said Paul P. Ellis, United Press writer, in his article in the San Antonio Express-News, July 18, that the polio epidemic in San Antonio has been tough on flies and mosquitoes. Today the city is virtually free of the pests as a result of DDT, still the No. 1 insecticide.
