# TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—President Truman's side and supporters believe that the administration's domestic and foreign policies are in a state of confusion and that a presidentially appointed fact-finding commission is the only way to clear up the confusion in the field of labor politics if it works. They seem to think that it will.

President Truman's first official act was to appoint a commission to study the administration's domestic and foreign policies. The commission is headed by a former labor leader, Philip H. Hoff, and includes other prominent labor figures.

**"LACK OF PURPOSE" LIVING**—Robert M. Hutchins, chancellor of the University of Chicago, has always been an energetic critic of America's failings, as he sees them. Recently, out in Aspen, Colo., the gentleman was among many things, the "lack of purpose" in American living.

Hutchins complained that we fritter away pointlessly the growing surplus of leisure time in our leisure-loving techniques.

He added: "It is possible to apply atomic energy to peacetime purposes we shall have more vacant time. Atomic energy, therefore, confronts mankind with this dreadful choice: either we shall be blown to bits; if we have peace we shall be bored to death."

Part of the blame for the state of leisure which Hutchins attacked to the specialists who dominate our age. Too often, he said, these individuals remain "uneducated men" despite their admittedly great contributions to science, medicine and technology.

Repeating, it means in effect that our scientific scholars and educators generally are so busy piling up isolated grounds of expertise that they never find time to lump them together into well-molded mass.

By ignoring this task they obscure the basic unity of all knowledge. Knowledge is simply the story of the world as it is, and it is to be told in cohesive style and human terms to have its greatest impact.

The world offers rich human satisfactions. But the average man can be accused if he fails to see where those rewards lie. On every hand he meets frightening complexities that discourage his effort to understand himself, his place in society, his relation to the stream of history.

To find his niche he needs to fit himself into the larger framework of life. It is the educator's chore not merely to teach the structures but to bring to the student's mind clear and recognizable. The man who sees that unity has the best chance of a satisfying existence. It gives him a sense of belonging.

It is his duty to see that the student's mind is not merely a receptacle for facts. He should find no real satisfaction in his work. He seeks spectacular diversion in his spare time to compensate for the emptiness of his work. Instead of being a rich complement to rewarding work, becomes a frenzied escape. And boredom builds upon boredom.

Every inch added to the rising mound of specialized knowledge heightens our complexities. Educators had better address themselves firmly to their job before it becomes well-nigh hopeless.

**UNPREPARED TO BARGAIN**—Cyrus Ching, director of the federal mediation service, says he thinks it is fair to conclude that unions come to the bargaining table better prepared than employers.

He told the United States News: "I think that the unions are better prepared for a more persuasive background of figures and facts, whereas the employer, though well and ably represented, is frequently unfamiliar with the statistics of the industry, the area, or the price in other establishments."

Ching cannot easily be accused of pro-labor bias. He was once labor relations director of the United States Rubber Company. Furthermore, his mediation service is an inside look at more labor disputes than any other agency does.

Thus management's labor relations experts ought to feel some embarrassment at his statement.

Ching thinks too many employers are not specially prepared for bargaining because they will consider labor relations a side issue. On the other hand, he believes that union negotiators often acquire wide familiarity with an industry's problems that most employers do not.

Ching cannot easily be accused of pro-labor bias. He was once labor relations director of the United States Rubber Company. Furthermore, his mediation service is an inside look at more labor disputes than any other agency does.

Thus management's labor relations experts ought to feel some embarrassment at his statement.
