Farm Official Views Water Conservation

RUPTURE July 27—One of the purposes of the agricultural conservation committee is to help farmers in carrying out practices to conserve water, according to County Administrator C. E. Dwyer, county agricultural conservation committee.

In some instances, measures which conserve water also conserve soil, but to increase the productivity of the land, it is necessary that there be enough moisture to grow crops to the point of harvest.

From 1900 to 1937 about 150,000 gallons of water are applied to the land, but the regular rainfall is less than that amount and at the right time, conservation measures are needed to conserve the amount of water available for crops.

Water in the soil in the soil is in condition to absorb it—the moisture moves downward quickly. The water that is left depends on the amount of rainfall and the condition of the soil. But within a few days the moisture is distributed fairly evenly to the depth of the soil.

Conservation measures which hold the moisture on the land until it can be used by the crop are the best. If there is more moisture than the land will hold, the water will run off. The best method of getting rid of the excess water without washing the soil away is to build a levee.

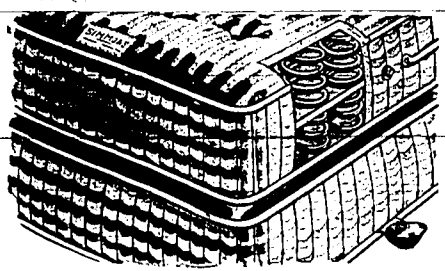

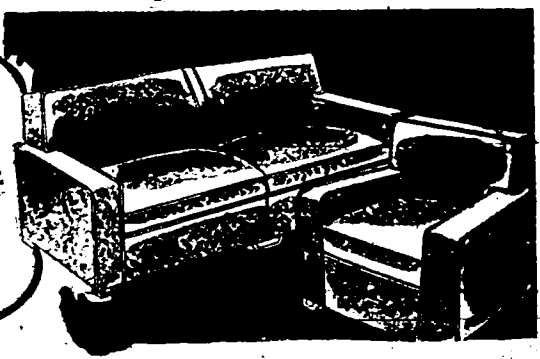

FDR's Widow Issues Reply For Cardinal

NEW YORK, July 27 (AP)—Mrs. Roosevelt replied today to Cardinal Spellman's charge that she was a "university American" by writing him: that she is not a member of the "university" because she is not a member of the "university of God."

Mrs. Roosevelt wrote him in a letter dated last Saturday in answer to his open letter Cardinal Spellman had written her last week in which he charged her with being anti-Catholic and for standing on proposed federal aid to education.

She said: "If you carefully studied my record, Mrs. Roosevelt replied, 'I think you would not find it one of anti-Catholic or anti-religious group. I assure you that I have no access of being a university American member. The first judgment, my dear Cardinal Spellman, is the kindness of all human beings in the hands of God.'

Mrs. Roosevelt told the cardinal she would continue to stand for the things in her treatment which she thought are right.

Mrs. Roosevelt added in a postscript that she had, in her last letter, given copies of her letter to the press but the cardinal had written to her to say he had not. Copies arrived at headquarters of the press associations and were being read by Mrs. Roosevelt's staff.

Cardinal Spellman, however, had stated specifically in his open letter that "I shall not again publicly acknowledge you."

French Panel Okays Treaty Despite Fight

PARIS, July 27 (AP)—The French national assembly today approved ratification of the Atlantic pact and to 197, ending the marathon debate punctuated by name-calling and accusations between communists and anti-communists.

The ratification measure now goes to the consultative council of the republic for approval. It then will be returned to the assembly for a final reading.

The vote began Friday morning and originally was expected to lead to a vote Saturday night.

Opposers shouted at each other and twice exchanged punches, necessitating recesses. Only after an all-night session from 10:30 p. m. last night until 8:34 a. m. today was the vote finally taken.

From the beginning, ratification was considered a certainty. But communists and non-communists tense from days of oratory, started trading punches. When President Edouard Herriot suspended a session, they continued fighting in the lobby outside.

Police said no one was injured, but there were several black eyes and bloody noses.

When the vote came, it was the communists who lined up against ratification, as expected.

Ratification already has been given to the pact by the United States, Canada, Britain, Belgium, Norway, Luxembourg and Ireland.

ASTORIA, Ore., July 27 (AP)—The Oregon coast city has a home-grown television network. The network is owned by a local man who has set up his own station in the city.

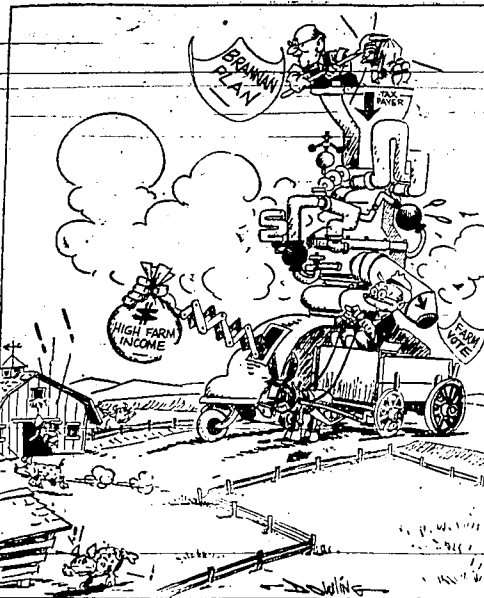

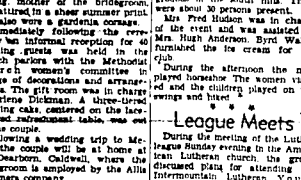

Park Service Asks Cash to Aid Facilities

WASHINGTON, July 27—A house committee has been told a sum of \$25,000,000 is needed at once to modernize and increase facilities for entertaining visitors to national parks.

The Public Lands committee launched a four-day investigation of the needs in national parks.

Newton B. Drury, director of the national park service, testified that in a list of 30 selected parks \$20,000,000 is needed for accommodation of tourists and \$4,225,000 for utilities such as power, water, sewers and communication lines.

Drury said many concessionaires in national parks are losing money. He cited:

The Mount Palmer national park in Washington, where he said the concessionaire sustained an operating loss of \$17,000 in 10 years.

The Glacier national park, where the concessionaire has lost \$1,000,000 in 10 years.

The Utah Parks company, operator of concessions in Bryce canyon, Zion, and the north rim of Grand canyon national parks, which he said has had an operating loss of \$1,013,300 in 10 years.

Drury said the government should build the needed facilities in the national parks and have them operated by private concerns.

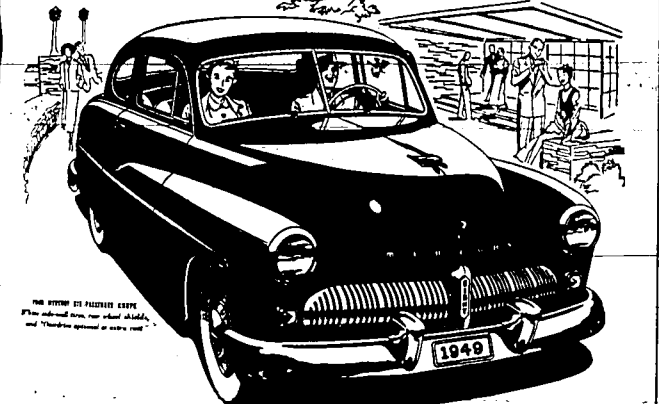

British Slash Of Purchases Hits Farmers

WASHINGTON, July 27 (AP)—The agriculture department and today Britain's recent moves to conserve dollar reserves will mean a cut in the purchase of many American farm products.

Fruit, vegetables, tobacco and cotton are among the commodities which will be affected most, the department said. Specific measures which will be taken by Canada in regard to American farm products are not yet known, it added.

In a formal statement on the situation, the department pointed out that the United Kingdom traditionally had been the most important export market for U. S. farm products.

The department said the net result of the new British trade policies by the United Kingdom alone will be a 25 per cent reduction in the 1948 levels in imports from the United States in future months.

In 1948, the United Kingdom imports from the dollar area amounted to \$3,400,000,000.

The department did not estimate how much the cut would be for American farm products.

Mr. Keeler had taken my suitcases and all my wardrobe and gently dropped them down the elevator shaft. I had no worry about clothes. As far as I know, my wardrobe of 1938 is still at the bottom of the elevator shaft in the Bon Air Vanderbilt hotel in Augusta, Ga.

"Clothes do not make the man," Mr. Keeler told me. "Furthermore, there'll be more room on the bus now that you have no luggage. Your fellow travelers will be more comfortable. You will be more comfortable yourself."

Special Work Emphasized in SICE's Course

SOUTHERN IDAHO COLLEGE OF EDUCATION, Albion, July 27—Under direction of Frances Farrell, instructor at Southern Idaho College of Education and supervisor in the college training school, prospective teachers and veteran teachers who are attending the summer term of the college, are becoming acquainted with the most modern and concise teaching aids and textbooks in the elementary field.

Miss Farrell conducted two elementary school workshop classes for the remedial pupils at the training school of the college for special assistance in their quest for mastery of the fundamental learning skills.

Classes observed—Students enrolled in the college, either as prospective teachers, or returning veteran teachers, observe these remedial classes and also classes in textbook selection for remedial pupils both of which come under the supervision of Miss Farrell.

These college students observe the work done with the remedial pupils and assist in the techniques of standardized tests, observation tests, intelligence tests and other testing devices, and are taught the proper application and procedure of each and its particular value in various phases of the work.

Classes observed—Each college student then makes a complete study of all the data obtained, the procedure, and supplementary materials available in each field of training in the elementary schools are engaged in and compile their opinions and ideas into a digest which he presents to other members of the college group for critical analysis.

It will be from many of these findings that diagnostic and corrective procedures proposed will be submitted to the state board of education for possible use in the elementary schools of the state.

NEW YORK, July 27 (AP)—Net income of United States Steel corporation declined to \$4,122,046 in the second quarter this year, the corporation has reported. This compares with \$4,222,070 for the first three months of 1949.

Directors of "the steel" meeting after the New York stock exchange closed, ordered a dividend of 60 cents a share on the corporation's new common stock. It was made payable Sept. 10 to shareholders of record Aug. 5.

On the old common shares, a dividend of \$1.80 was declared three months ago. Since that time each holder has received two additional shares for each share held, to effect a three-for-one split of the stock.

U. S. Steel's second-quarter net income is equal to \$1.48 a share on the more than 26,000,000 common shares now outstanding. On the same basis, the net for the preceding three months was equal to \$1.67 a share.

In the second quarter of 1948, income of \$25,845,977 or 73 cents a share of the increased number of common shares was reported.

About 70 per cent of all steel is consumed east of the Mississippi river.
