Savant Sights Gains in U. S. Way of Living

WASHINGTON, July 28 (AP)—The savant of the Brookings Institution today the United States has the ability to support a doubling of population, 100 years from now, on a plane of living eight times as high as that of the present.

The study, by the widely known economist, is the author of a 300-page report issued by the non-profit private-endowed research organization.

It is said to be by no means certain that the United States will achieve such an expansion. But given wise policies it has the resources to do so.

Output Must Be Doubled

Explaining how policies be made, for example, the figure 100-year advance would require a continuing increase in productivity—or per-capita production—and a corresponding increase of mass purchasing power, "preferably through price reduction."

Dr. Moulton rejected contentions that our industrial and agricultural production is approaching a "static" condition, or that the government must set up a "controlled economy." He argued that after a century of economic promise, American life remains undiminished.

USDA Slates Help Boost to Pasture Land

WASHINGTON, July 28 (AP)—A shift of millions of acres of land from soil-depleting crops to soil-building pasture, legumes and pastures is the major goal of a \$250,000,000 agriculture department conservation program for 1950.

The department gave the outline of the program today, in a statement emphasizing need for rebuilding soil-washed soils.

More grass and pastures, it said, would support a larger livestock population, and hence consumer supplies of meats and dairy products would be larger. The program calls for smaller acreages of such crops as wheat, cotton, field grains, flaxseed, soy beans and peanuts. Surpluses are accumulating in the case of all these.

Type of Aid Listed: The government aid is in the form of material of waste and dairy products and seed; services such as use of power machinery for moving dirt, and cash reimbursements for conservation practices.

In no case will an individual farmer get more than \$2,500 in the form of materials, services and payments. This limit is set by law.

Idaho Sets New Code For Collegiate Sports

BOISE, July 29 (AP)—A set of uniform requirements for participation in athletic contests among the state colleges in Idaho and the University of Idaho has been announced by Alton B. Jones, state superintendent of public instruction.

Jones said the requirements were adopted by the board of education at its meeting in McCall earlier this week. He is a member of the board and its executive secretary.

Here are the requirements:

1. A student must meet college entrance requirements of the institutions in which he is enrolled.
2. A student must be regularly enrolled in a curriculum leading toward an academic degree.
3. A student must be enrolled for a minimum of 12 credits in residence and must have passed a minimum of 10 credits at the semester beginning of the particular participation. Freshmen in their first semester must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credits.
4. A transfer student to participate must be eligible under the institution as well as of the institution.
5. A student must be a resident of the state.
6. A student must be a member of one of the state athletic associations.
7. A student must have amateur status as defined by the National Collegiate Athletic Association.
8. A student may not participate in professional contests for more than four classes.
