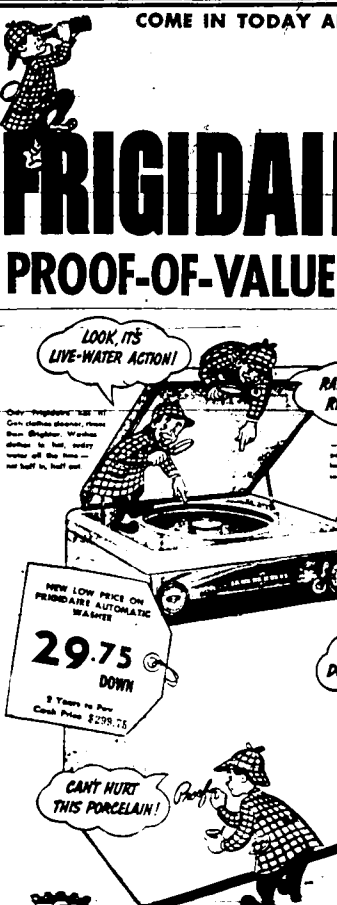

A panel lecturer and cartoonist, Deaver is a member of the National Farm Bureau's committee of the National Farm Bureau.

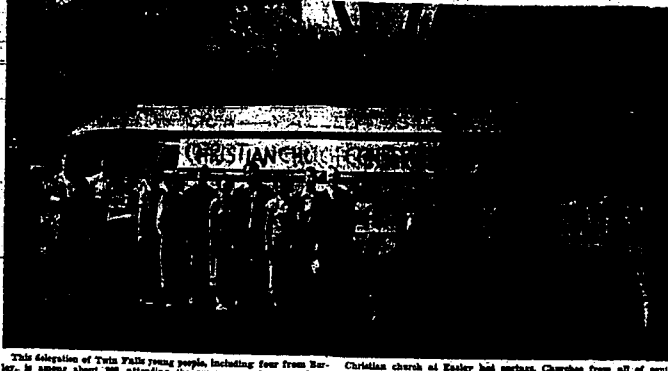
Deaver's cartoons and explanations of the farm situation, he said, are the main reason why the group of farmers and working on farm lands.

Each Rainbow Gives Viewers 'Private' Show

 The summer shower has been the most beautiful in the west since the war. On the dark, stormy night of July 28, a gorgeous rainbow was painted by the setting sun low in the west, over the horizon as it was over the mountains. At the lower end of the rainbow the sun was clearly outlined and the bow was clearly outlined between us and the hills, scarcely between us and the sky. The quarter-quarter telephoning business suggested telephoning business to be also delightful in the northwest-colored rainbows. The primary bow has the colors of the rainbow and through the blue, green, yellow and orange to red on the inside and violet on the outside. Inside the primary bow there is a secondary bow of color, primarily red and green, known as a secondary bow. These are tertiary rainbows.

When sunlight is passed through a glass prism, it breaks up into the various rainbow colors due to refraction and dispersion. The falling raindrops opposite in direction from the sun act in the same way. Any high angle points back to us.

Center Opposite Sun
 The center of the rainbow, the point to which one of an imaginary line drawn up the arc as with colored crayon, is directly opposite the sun in the direction of the observer's back must be turned on the sun. The outside of the primary bow is a curve everywhere 42 degrees from the sun-opposite center; the outside of the secondary is 51 degrees. If the sun is on the western horizon, the bow-center and the bow appears as only a half-circle.

Clare Opines Fly Campaign Not Justified

BOISE, July 30 (AP)—While fly control is important at any time, emergency fly control "work as a means of controlling polio is not justified," H. C. Clare, state public health officer, said today.

In a prepared statement, Clare said "efforts to abate poliomyelitis epidemics by intensive fly control have given little promise of success for of giving or disproving the supposition that flies are an important means of transmitting poliomyelitis."

"This does not mean the health department discourages fly control, rather it encourages such activities when done on a rational and continuing basis."

Clare said that "the spectacular work done by airplane and ground machines as it often has been carried on during emergencies gives an unjustified feeling of security and directs attention from other possible sources of poliomyelitis spread."

"If conditions in any city or locality are such that flies are numerous and control is needed, the logical approach to the problem is removal and elimination of breeding conditions."

"It is more important to properly dispose of garbage and other debris in which flies and other insects can breed, than it is to apply a layer of DDT to the surface of those materials and attempt to bring about control in that manner," Clare said.

"Fly and insect control by wide application of insecticides should not be identified as a poliomyelitis control measure. Other phases are more fundamentally important," he added.
