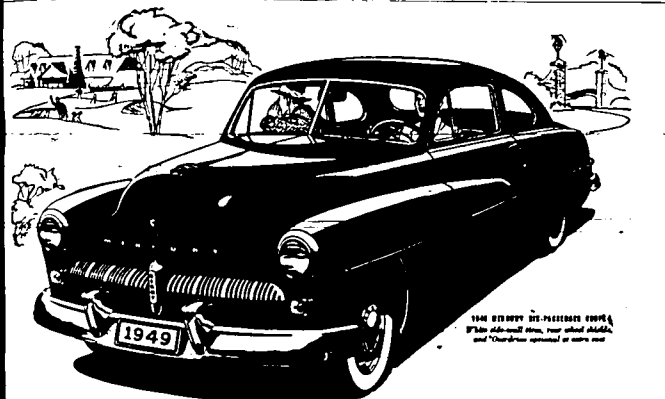

**HOUSING PLAN IN TROUBLE**

Flinders of Vermont told a report that "if you go to Twin Falls, let us report talking about mass-produced houses."

He was referring to the Lustron Corporation of Columbus, Ohio, which is planning a mass venture into production of factory-built homes. The reconstruction finance corporation already has poured \$34,000,000 into the company. This has not been enough, however, to launch the effort successfully.

Lustron currently is losing \$500,000 a month. It is starting to cut back output from its present 27 houses a day when it needs to step it up to 35 or 40 to break even.

In the next two or three months the RFC must decide whether to advance further funds to Lustron in the hope that keeping it going a little while longer may put it over the hump.

This is a matter of great importance to the country. For years many critics of the housing industry have argued that the only way out of the low-cost house problem is mass production on the automobile pattern.

Lustron's plan is to build an entire town on top houses on a factory basis. Considerable engineering and architectural skill never has been applied in the design.

The plan is to build a town of 10,000 houses. Lustron claims, for example, that it could produce 100 houses a day if it had three shifts of men working.

Yet the company has been mired in trouble from the start. It encountered the same high costs that plagued many another enterprise, so that it is now selling its house for \$10,000 to \$11,000 instead of the \$7,000 originally planned.

It couldn't find sufficient labor fast enough, and when it did get it, it had to train them for entirely new jobs in a new industry. Worse, its dealers couldn't get adequate credit. They had to pay \$8,000 to obtain a Lustron house from the factory. That runs into big money quickly.

Loans to finance dealers until sales are made have been slow in coming. Also, they have their own labor problems with erection crews who are handling an unfamiliar product. They face often serious handicaps in local building codes of varying regional conditions.

The credit and labor problems possibly can be licked in time. But meanwhile Lustron is going deeper into the red every day.

Should it be extended further government credit? That is the question which has now arisen in connection with the newest development in our "government-planned economy."

There seems to be an attitude in government that this is one of the supreme tests. If it is, it might be checked before it is set up to fork up more money to finance this "voluntary experiment" than to give the government an excuse in case the program proves a flop.

**FREZZERS ARE PRETTY HOT**

It's amusing to note all the emphasis being placed on the explanation that Mrs. Harry B. Truman should not be blamed in any way for having one of the seven highly-controversial "refrigerators" in her old home—the "Little White House" at Independence, Mo.

We don't question for a moment, as the explanation goes, that the type of refrigerator which is incapable of doing anything improper. But you can bet it's embarrassing nevertheless for Mrs. Truman that others are finding such explanations necessary.

Much as Washington politicians are trying to minimize the scandal involving activities of the "five percenter" who try to help land government contracts in return for a percentage fee, there is an odor about it all which cannot easily be disguised. It is unfortunate to say the least, that Mrs. Truman's name had to be dragged into the mess even though she is no doubt entirely innocent of any wrong doing.

All of this distasteful affair seems to bring out one of the shoddy things which characterize American politics. Can it be that we are "indefensible" in "preparation" for "defense" that one of the things which makes people so attractive to a lot of small, cheap, greedy individuals?

The American people aren't so dumb that they believe anyone is giving a state refrigerator automobiles or kind of what that for the fun of it. The kind of greed which that play a part in modern politics has a purpose extending beyond the ordinary commercial purpose of greed.

Let the "five-percenters" and those who whom for whom and through whom they operate pay for the whole affair. So long as they keep their hands clean, they apparently regard themselves as being properly open. But when it all comes out that the open it's embarrassing to say the least, and in this particular instance even for the First Lady of the land.
