### Leaders of Red Cross Discuss National Home Service Policy

The national home service policy of the American Red Cross as applied to individual chapters was reviewed at a roundtable discussion for chapter chairmen, executive committee members and representatives of the department of public assistance health unit Thursday.

The conference, held at the local Red Cross office, was conducted by Mrs. Myrtle Lyle, San Francisco, Calif., American Red Cross home service field representative for the Pacific area.

Points discussed were the armed forces and their dependence in conjunction with home service responsibilities, counseling, reporting and communication service, assistance in applying for government benefits, referral and financial assistance and emergency needs of wives and children of service men consisting of medical care, transportation and burial.

Mrs. Lyle explained home service policies concerning service and non-service disabilities and discussed special interest in Red Cross chapters in this area was a discussion on the responsibility of the chapters to migrants.

"Counseling and referral services are not restrictive to migrants," Mrs. Lyle said, "they are part of the Red Cross service and can be offered to any individual, a veteran or not."

Mrs. Lyle added that funds must be used first for mandatory responsibilities and funds left over may be used for other needs. "A migrant may fit into the mandatory policy," she said.

"Although the Red Cross is not necessarily a civilian agency, we can give services to non-veterans in some cases," Mrs. Lyle said.

She pointed out that cash and means of transportation should not be provided merely to get migrants out of the community. "They should be helped so they may help themselves," she said.

During the afternoon session a discussion was held on loans and grants. "We are not a loan agency," Mrs. Lyle said. "We are a welfare agency, and repayment should be requested only when it works no hardship on the individual or family."

She added that each chapter has the responsibility of defining permissive policy which does not come under mandatory cases.

In dependency discharges from the armed services, Mrs. Lyle said, no personal opinion may be expressed when it works no hardship on the individual or family.

"Some problems which the Red Cross is unable to handle should be met on a community basis," she pointed out. Home service should not be the only service developed in the chapter.

"Thursday's roundtable discussion was the first of its kind to be held in this area. In the future, the group will meet at six-month intervals. Attending the conference were

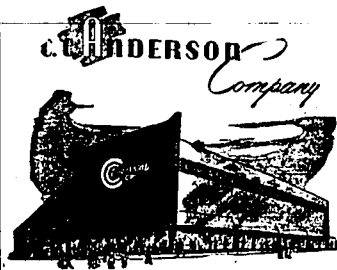

COALDA, Aug. 18 (AP)—Ground crews and smokejumpers battled more than 30 small forest fires today, scattered over sections of the Payette and Boise national forests by a night lightning storm. John T. # Farm Receipts in 1948 Were High, Expert Declares

**MOSCOW, Aug. 18.**—Idaho farmers received almost \$372,000,000 for their crops and livestock in 1948, according to a summary issued this week by Virgil Kennedy, extension farm management specialist, University of Idaho. The amount is a gain of one per cent over 1947 and probably "substantially above" the total likely to be received in 1948, Kennedy said. Receipts for 1948 through July this year are largely 13 per cent over the same period a year ago.

Crops in Idaho accounted for 84 per cent of the 1948 cash receipts, Kennedy said. Livestock products brought in 16 per cent.

Seven commodities provided 90 per cent of the income: In their order of dollar-and-cent importance they were wheat, cattle, and sheep, potatoes, dairy products, sheep, lamb and wool, grainbeans and nursery products; dry beans; least eight business men will take part in the race.

### Judge Denies Firm's Bid in Accident Suit

**BOISE, Aug. 18 (AP)—**A motion for a new trial in a damage suit stemming from a highway fatality has been denied by Federal Judge Chase A. Clark.
