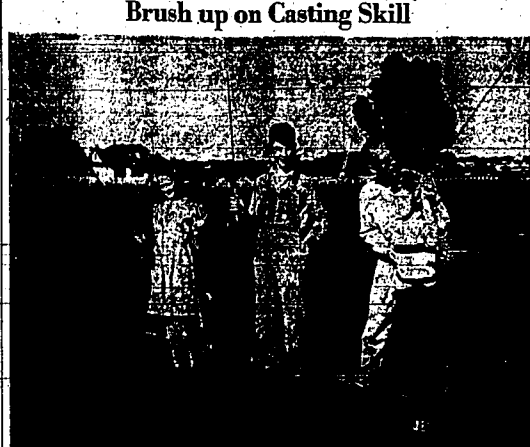

WASHINGTON—John L. Lewis has not the slightest fear that the current tariff investigation will be a serious setback to his campaign for his coal miners to be three-day work week in the coal fields. 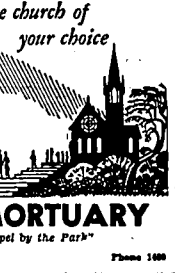

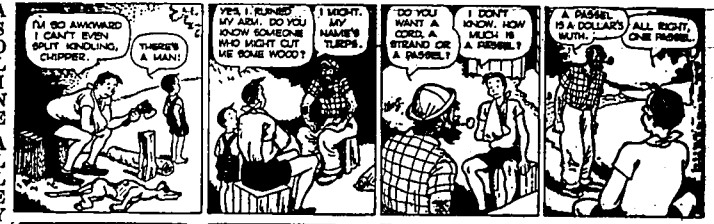

### President May Campaign for Demos in '50

WASHINGTON, Aug. 12 (AP)—President Truman says he may stump for Democratic candidates next year.

All the same time he acknowledged with a smile that he had tentatively implied earlier in the day that he would not seek reelection in 1948.

The President was asked at a news conference about a short speech in which he said he could not promise any appointments five years from now.

"After ten years," he said, "I will be a group of ten-year-olds who call me 'Daddy'."

Truman said the reason was "because that is a year or two beyond the time when my term will expire."

At the news conference a reporter inquired that implied Mr. Truman would not be a candidate in '48.

Smiling, Mr. Truman said that was the implication intended. However, he refused to say flatly that he would not seek reelection.

He described military payroll cuts as part of an economy under government reorganization.

He said he is hopeful that something can be accomplished with the forthcoming financial talks with the British.

The speaker was Brig.-Gen. Frank L. Howley, director of the office of military government for the American sector of Berlin.

After interviewing him, Harold Williams, Sun staff correspondent in Berlin, called back these other quotes:

No Truth in Them On his feelings about the Russians: "There is no truth in them—and the sooner we realize that fact and accept it, the better we will be. They believe in truth changes from day to day. For them there is no such thing as an eternal truth."

On communism: "The communists just haven't got good products. That's all. If they were making soap in the United States they wouldn't sell enough to clean one bathtub."

Always Hot Air On Russian methods: "They handle their attacks cleverly. When they cut off the Autobahn, they claimed that a bridge was out. You don't feel like going to war over three planks pulled out. Summing it up: "The prevailing wind in Berlin is from the east, and it is always hot air."

General Howley is leaving Berlin Sept. 6 to revert to civilian status.

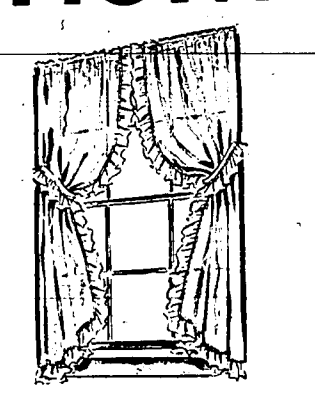
