Aug. 27—John McEwen, director of public works, announced today that the construction of a new bridge will be completed in a few weeks.

At the request of the Board of Directors, McEwen has secured a contract for the construction of a new bridge over the Snake river. The bridge will be 1,200 feet long and will carry a two-lane highway.

The bridge will be built on the site of the old bridge which was destroyed by a flood in 1934. The new bridge will be built on a higher grade and will be more resistant to floods.

The bridge will be built by the Snake River Bridge Co., which is a subsidiary of the Snake River Power Co. The bridge will be financed by the sale of bonds.

26 Persons Serving Murder Sentences at Idaho Prison

BOISE, Aug. 27—Behind the gray stone walls at the Idaho State penitentiary are 26 persons serving sentences for murder.

The penitentiary, located at the end of Boise's awkward Warm Springs avenue, houses 18 persons serving life sentences for first degree murder, 10 serving varied terms for second degree murder and one man serving a 15 years to life sentence for first degree murder.

Hedding the list of "ifers" is the penitentiary's oldest inmate, Fabian Harry Orchard. Now 83, Orchard has been one of the most trusted inmates for years.

The youngest prisoner at the penitentiary also is behind bars for murder. Elizabeth Lacy entered the prison gates last April after pleading guilty to a first degree murder charge in the strychnine poisoning of her former husband, Virgil Anderson.

Verna (Taran) Keller and her five friends, Roscoe Clark Bartley, are serving life sentences for second degree murder in the slaying of Bonnie Pfister, 16, in Sandpoint two years ago. Mrs. Ethelyn Irene Peterson of Canyon county is serving 20 years to life after conviction of second degree murder in the slaying of her three-year-old stepson in 1936.

College Pair Held by Reds As Hostages

NEW YORK, Aug. 22 (AP)—Russian authorities in the Soviet zone of Germany are insisting by American college boys as hostages for the return of three Russian army deserters who fled to the American zone.

Edward Oelner, 35-year-old president of the U. S. Navigation company, said the state department called him yesterday that his brother, Warren, 20, and Peter H. Sellers, 18, Philadelphia, were being held by the Soviets.

Message Cited
He said the state department cited a message from Russian authorities that the boys were "not in captivity but are being retained and will be retained" until the three deserters are returned.

"They didn't utter any words," Oelner said, "but it's good news to learn the boys are alive and well. It was the first definite word the family had received of the youths since the night of July 30 when they were reported at the American-Soviet zone border."

Situation Complicated
Oelner said he understood the situation was complicated by American policy of returning Russian deserters, but expressed confidence the state department and American military government officials were doing all in their power to obtain the boys' release.

"The state department has been working nicely on this thing from our point of view," he said. "Mr. Murphy (Robert D. Murphy of the state department) and Mr. McChesney (McClintock, U. S. administrator in Germany) have been helping in several parts in the search for the boys."
