Gas Taxes Drop; Cars Show Gain

In State Report

BOISE, Aug. 31 (AP)—A slight decrease in revenue from Idaho motor fuel taxes during the first six months of 1949 as compared to the same period last year has been reported.

N. P. Nielson, state auditor, said that total tax revenue for the first six months of this year was \$4,480,000 as compared with \$4,620,000 for the same months last year. June was the largest month this year for tax revenue when receipts totaled \$774,000.

The registration of Idaho motor vehicles showed an increase over the six-month period in 1949. There were 238,397 vehicles registered in the first six months of 1949, as compared with 221,221 in 1948. The largest number of registrations this year were reported in March when there were 40,422.

Nielson said apportionment of motor fuel tax revenue was \$668,855 to the refund fund; \$631,297 to the highway fund; and \$2,179,848 to the state highway fund.

Cancer Drive of State Brought in Total of \$80,747

The 1945 campaign of the Idaho drive of the American Cancer Society raised a total of \$80,747 in the state, according to Leo J. Falk, state campaign chairman. Contributions of Magic Valley counties include Blaine, \$600; Camma, \$480; Cassia, \$1,235; Gemma, \$1,200; Gooding, \$1,135; Jerome, \$884; Lincoln, \$777; Minidoka, \$1,041; and Twin Falls, \$5,421. Last year \$68,000 was contributed by residents of Idaho to the organization. Sixty per cent of the money will remain in Idaho to be used for the statewide education and service programs. Forty per cent is sent to the American Cancer Society to be used for national education, service and scientific research projects.

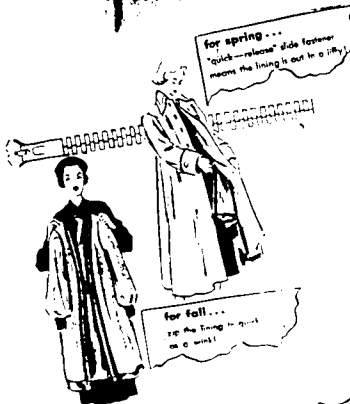
