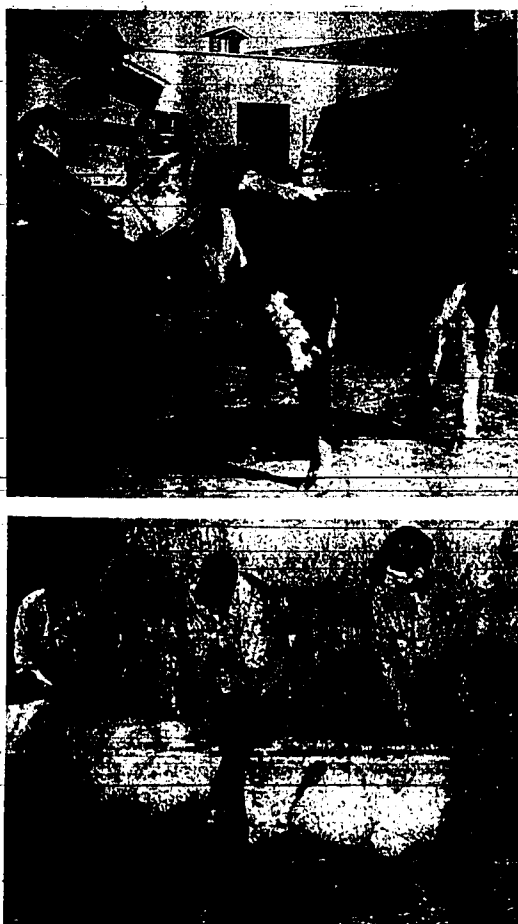

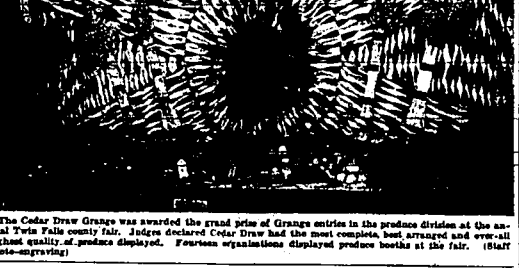

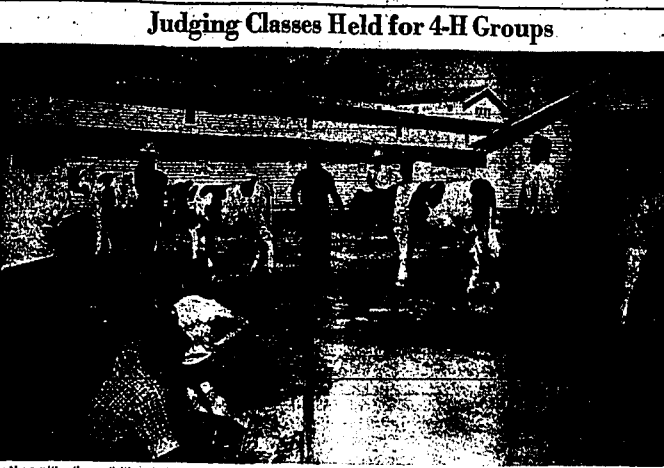

Gambel Quail Discovered in Idaho for First Time

Idaho fish and game department officials are scratching their heads because of the appearance in large numbers of a new bird species—the gambel quail—in the Gem state.

Charles Blake, Jerome, bird biologist for the department, discovered nine covers of 200 gambels on the Lemhi river near Salmon, Idaho, assisted by Hawley Hill, newly appointed district conservation supervisor. Blake took a specimen for positive identification.

Blaine is wondering how the birds got so far out of their track. Previously the furthest known northern penetration of the gambel quail has been in southern Nevada and Utah.

They are supposed to be non-migratory birds and have been found in this state and the bird is not native to Idaho.

The plants to desert quail provide some of the best shooting in the southwest and the game department hopes that the quail will encourage to build up into shooting numbers.

Blake said he first noticed the bird near Salmon about a month ago and returned with Hill for positive identification. He said the quail are about the same size as the California quail, found in large numbers in the Teton mountains and have similar forward-pointing and long tail feathers.

The gambel quail however has no such markings on its head and has a large black patch on its neck.

Blake said a good deal of the quail are now in the area.

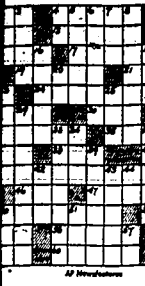

Anniversary Of War Start Sees Trouble

Two years after the outbreak of World War II the people of the world are split again. Before the war the split was between democratic and fascist nations. Now it is between democratic and communist nations.

The western democracies hoped the United Nations would work for the benefit of all.

But before a U. N. police force could come into being—there are so many force-communist overtures the governments of Poland, Czechoslovakia, Romania, Hungary and Bulgaria.

Some think the Russian vote "almost without a break on all actions which the rest of the U. N. member nations appear to take."

Slowly it became clear the Russians were determined to make the U. N. decisions on the majority. They refused, too, to join U. N. agencies aimed at raising higher living standards to the world—the world bank and fund, the food and agriculture organization, the refugee organization and the like.

Non-Red Paris Born

The aftermath has been the birth of several non-communist agreements, all aimed at trying to improve economic health and military safety for the world's democratic people.

The Marshall plan in 1947 meant American gifts of around \$5,000,000,000 over a period of four years to 15 European nations while the Europeans repair war damage and help markets for goods they make.

But Europe's military fears were not met by the Marshall plan. Under the Russian leaders, aid intelligence reports, lay a Russian army almost up to its haunches in Brussels.

Out of these fears grew the Brussels pact of 1948. It bound together Britain, France, the Netherlands, Belgium and Luxembourg for 50 years. It provided for 50 years to either if any one were attacked. Their military leaders were given the task of fitting their defense plans together.

Through the North Atlantic pact in April 1949 it bound together 12 nations. The five were: the United States, Canada, Great Britain, France, Italy, Norway, Portugal and the United States.

These 12 nations promised to come to each other's aid—no matter how small the attack—though it may not be an attack.

New Organization

The organization of European economic cooperation (OEEC) is a continuing committee of the 15 nations getting Marshall aid. The Europeans tell each other the state of their needs, their production plans, their foreign exchange and so forth. Out of this comes the final request for Marshall aid.

OEEC experts lay toward demand the Europeans take such economic plans together as much as possible in line with Marshall plan aid.

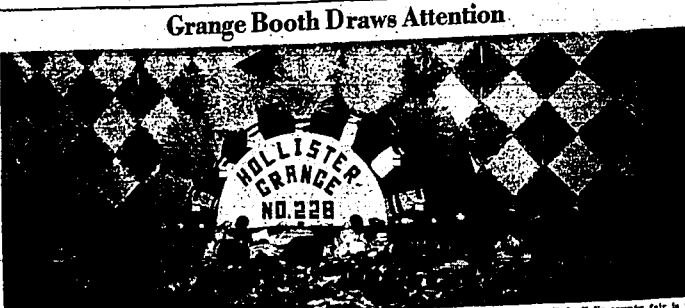
