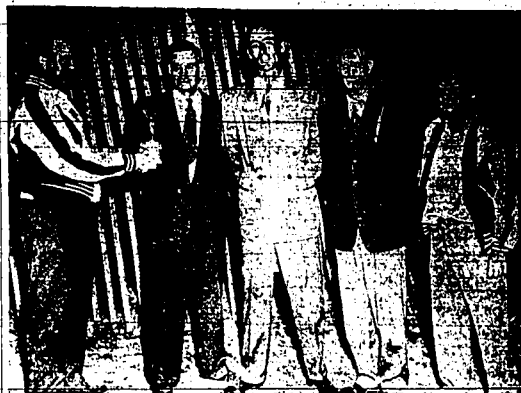

WILMINGTON, N. C., Sept. 10 (AP)—Harry E. Polk of Wilmington, president of the National Reclamation Association, today challenged Rep. Jackson's views on the public utility program in a statement yesterday.

Polk said today he had replied to a letter from Jackson, who had written the one in which I made reply to him.

BOISE, Sept. 10 (AP)—The U. S. department of agriculture and the Idaho state dairymen bureau today announced jointly that dairy milk facturing plants in Idaho produced 230,000 pounds of butter and 7,077,000 pounds of cheese during the July.

This report disclosed that butter production was three per cent below June and six per cent below July, 1948. It was also 22 per cent under the 1943-47 average.

State Officials Will Look Into Rate Schedule

RENO, Nev., Sept. 10 (AP)—A standing committee to study telephone rates and services in the 11 western states was approved yesterday by the western regional conference of attorneys general after Idaho's attorney general spoke on the subject.

Robert E. Bayliff told the group it is time for reexamination of what constitutes a fair rate of return for utility properties.

Pointing out that the Bell telephone system, through its subsidiaries in Nevada, Idaho, Utah, Arizona and California, Bayliff said "It is time that all of our states make sure that the rate base for these companies is realistic, and it is not that they undertake valuation proceedings looking to making it realistic."

He declared that "what was required by the courts as a proper rate of return 20 years ago is now regarded as exorbitant."

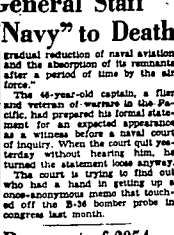

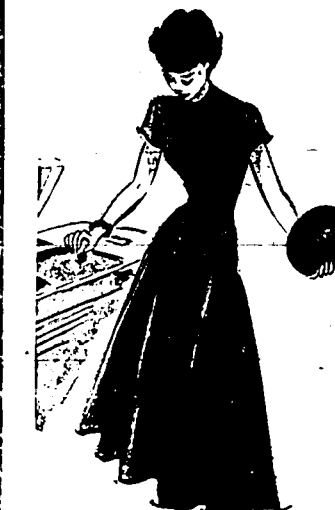

Special Idaho Road Report Will Be Made

The findings and recommendations of the survey staff, which must be reviewed by the headquarters office in Chicago, will not be disclosed until the final report is issued. The state's contract with the PAF requires that 1,000 copies of the report be submitted.

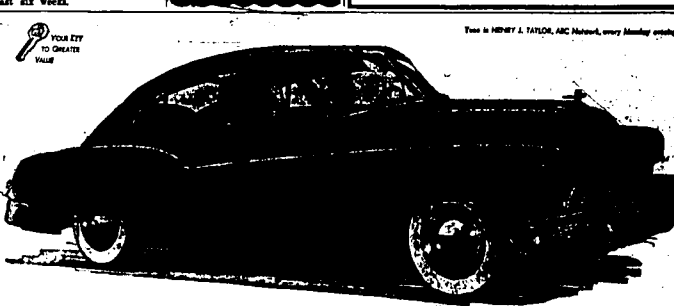

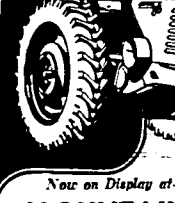

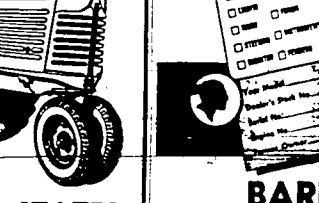
