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Air "Ambush" For North Is Study Subject

BY HOWARD E. BLANKENHORN

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The chance for a radio ambush in the air is under investigation at the North pole by the United States.

It is noted that the Aurora is not visible with radio blackouts and magnetic storms, but much of the data needed for defense in the vast air routes is still unknown.

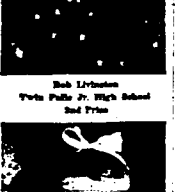

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11.—The Whirligig might easily become a flag presidential year if the Republican National convention in Chicago, Sept. 17-20, elects a southern Democrat for an anti-Union alliance, assuming that the Whirligig is a party's nomination three years hence.

Irrigation to Open Way for \$7,000 Acres

WASH., Sept. 13 (AP)—One thousand new farms will be opened up in the Columbia basin in the next few years, according to a report issued today.

William Warren, assistant secretary of the federal reclamation department, said that he reviewed the irrigation schedule after a two-day meeting with bureau officials.

6700 New Farms

The government is spending \$300,000 a day this year on the basin project, officials said. Warren said the bureau is making progress as fast as can be expected.

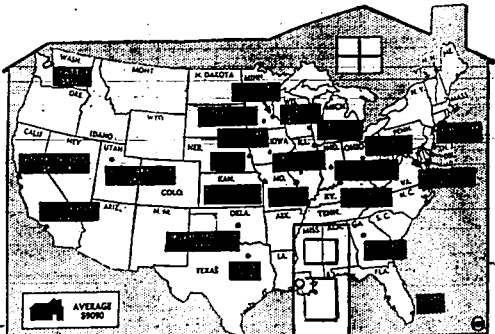
The schedule calls for irrigating another 7,000 acres in 1938, 17,000 acres in 1939 and 21,000 acres in 1940. By 1942 there will be 67,000 acres of land now dry and barren that would be opened up for 6,700 farms.

Additional Wealth

"Additional land means extra wealth to the basin," Warren said. "The more land that is irrigated, the more wealth it will bring to the basin."

Rep. Michael Reilly of Ohio, chairman of a house appropriations sub-committee, said the big western reclamation project will furnish markets for the industrial east.

Adenauer Takes Grip on Reins of West Reich Rule

BONN, Germany, Sept. 13 (AP)—Konrad Adenauer appeared firmly in the middle today as the strong man of western Germany's new federal republic.

Yesterday's election of Prof. Theodor Heuss as president named Adenauer of the chancellery and demonstrated the power of the three-party coalition which he heads.

As president, Heuss will name the chancellery (prime minister). The 73-year-old Adenauer heads the Christian democratic party in the ruling-wing coalition.

As the Christian democratic vote won the presidency for Heuss who leads the coalition's second-largest party, the Free Democrats.

The result was victory for the combined Adenauer-Heuss forces over the socialist opposition. The socialist supporting chairman, Dr. Kurt Schumacher, set out to make the election a test of strength but they lasted only one round.

Heuss was elected on the second ballot with 416 votes out of 800.

Faye Emerson to End Tie to Elliott

NEW YORK, Sept. 13 (AP)—Actress Faye Emerson plans to bring divorce proceedings against Elliott Roosevelt as soon as his finances work on a motion picture now in production.

The 31-year-old blond actress confirmed yesterday that she and the late President's second son have separated, and Elliott and I parted on friendly terms.

Roosevelt, who was reached by a newsmen at the White House, said the breakup of the marriage is a personal matter—I have no comment.

Roosevelt married late last year and Miss Emerson, married once before, was wed in December, 1934.

Roosevelt, 32, and the actress separated in August.

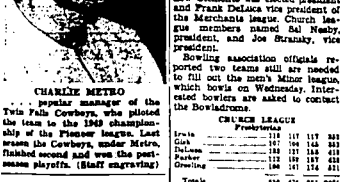

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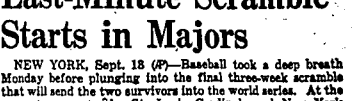

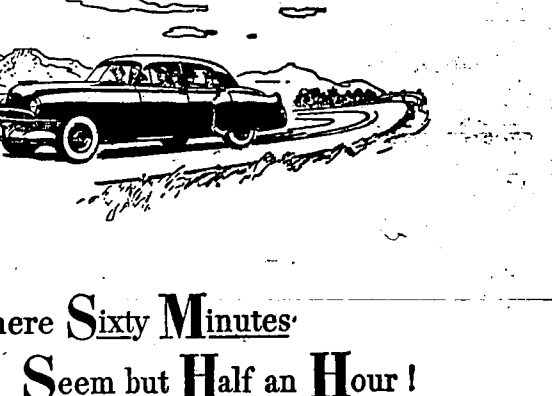

Crop Support Requirements Are Reported

To be eligible for price support a farmer must be an operator, owner, landlord, tenant or partner as defined in the provisions of the act passed in 1942, according to Ben Hansen, chairman of the county agricultural conservation association.

Other qualifications include compliance with the 1942 potato acreage goal on all farms, regardless of whether the other farms are located in other counties. In the case of eligibility must be obtained and all the terms and conditions outlined in the producers application for 1945 certificate of eligibility. The requested eligibility fee must be paid.

Henry's Buffaloes as He Fails To Be 'Checked Out' on Room

MADRID—We have a hotel room which neither one of us has yet learned to use.

Yes, I said "My."

Walking into our room is much like walking into the pit of a volcano. The room is a little more complicated than the control plant of either one of these big air liners.

To begin with, there are four telephones, three being for emergency use in case we have to "ditch" our room. I suppose each of the phones is equipped with five buttons—red, yellow, green, purple and white. Each color summons a different member of the staff of the hotel and I am just getting to get a big enough knowledge of what they do to have the courage to push them all at once, and see what kind of stampede I get.

By each of the buttons, as is common in European hotels, is a small drawing of the person you are going to get—whom—the button is for. As long as they have gone this far I don't see why they don't go a little further with their buttons and pictures and have illustrations and buttons for port and beam, and a shave and a haircut.

The buttons on the phone aren't the only ones in the room. Just inside the door is a panel of 12 buttons which control a series of lights just outside the door. Make a careless entrance and you beam into this panel, with the result that your section of the hallway bursts

into multi-colored light. I did this the other night and the illumination, a really dazzling display, made me a little nervous for three square feet.

If you forget to turn off these lights the people summoned by these dials know on your door, do your bidding, go away, but upon their happening into your hallway again think you still want them and knock one more. I had the book black at my door a dozen times the other night before it dawned on me to turn off his green light. He must have thought that a centipede was occupying the room.

I am convinced that proper wiring of electricity is still somewhat of a mystery to Europeans. Half the time we get the water with the water when we want the house-keeper. Either the wire are badly crossed, or the domestic staff simply flips a coin to see which one answers.

We are convinced that somewhere

in our room is a button that will start a proper wiring, and another button that will lower flags for a take-off. We are looking for them, and when we find them we plan to save transportation money by traveling in Italy by room.

Who knows?—but that our room here in Madrid may be the answer to the threat of Hitler, see transportation-supply. If so, don't think I am not going to hold out for a room, and the know-how of flying it.

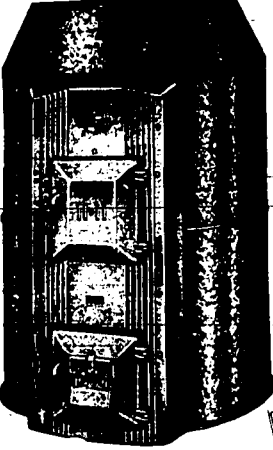

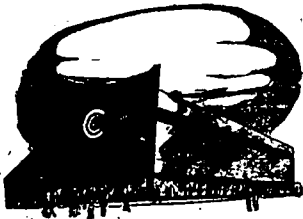
