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### Tito Accused On Hungary Invasion Plot

BEGRAD, Yugoslavia, Sept. 14 (AP)—Marshall Tito was accused today of planning to invade Romania and help overthrow the Communist-Romanian government.

The Romanian newspaper, *Scinteia*, which made the charges, said Tito was supported by the United States in an effort to overthrow the Soviet satellites at war with Hungary.

A top Yugoslav official commented with charges that recent Russian moves toward Yugoslavia's northern frontier were a "plot with arms" to frighten American aid away from Yugoslavia and prevent other satellite states from following Tito's course.

Another Yugoslav blast at Bucharest, Yugoslavia Deputy Foreign Minister Ala Beldar said Bucharest was demanding "unity at any cost" among the Soviet satellites because of the American "plot with arms."

The newspaper *Scinteia's* charges of an invasion plot against Marshall Tito said "American imperialists" had actively aided the plan by infiltrating spies into the working class movement in Romania.

Charges broadcast in Communist official workers (Communist) party newspaper in Bucharest. The paper's charges were broadcast by Agence Press, the Romanian press agency.

Scinteia said the Yugoslav plan called for assistance in establishing an anti-Communist Hungarian government headed by former Hungarian Foreign Minister László Rajk.

Rajk and seven other top Communist leaders in Hungary were arrested last June on charges of espionage, treason and attempts to overthrow the Hungarian government. Their trial starts Friday in Budapest.

### State's Grain Harvest Near End for 1949

BOISE, Sept. 14 (AP)—Idaho's grain harvest is nearing completion in all but the highest elevations and seedlings of fall grains is being delayed generally by dry soils, the weekly cooperative crop report said today.

Some late potatoes are being dug with good yields indicated in the south central districts. Most growers in the state are hoping for late maturing crops.

Considerable early drying was noted in both the east and south central districts.

The bean harvest is well under way in the south central area and nearly finished in the north.

Some irrigated pastures improved as water became available, but dryland pastures and hay crops continue dry.

Low prices slowed the prune harvest.

The onion harvest continued and lettuce is heading in the north.

Milk production continued to drop in some sections.

Range stock was in fair to good condition and moved from range to market, pastures and hay continuing dry.

Only in a few localities, mostly in the north, was there enough moisture the past week to be of agricultural significance, the report said.

The week's average temperature for the state was 63.1 degrees. That was 1.9 degrees cooler than for the previous week but still was as dry as any above the normal.

### Potato Loans Explained by Farm Official

Sept. 14.—A potato loan is for producers and dealers, the late-arriving Idaho potato loan administrator, Carl E. Johnson, announced today.

Johnson said that the loan is to be used to either a producer or a dealer in potatoes suitable for storage and properly stored in up to permanent storage vaults to the amount of \$100,000 per acre and seven-eighths inch (diameter) or better quality.

Payment Explained

Johnson said that the producer or dealer who receives the loan must agree to repay the loan in cash or in kind within 180 days of the date of the loan. The producer or dealer who receives the loan must also agree to sell the potatoes to the government at the price set by the government.

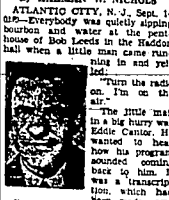
