### OP Senators Uncertain on Judge Minton

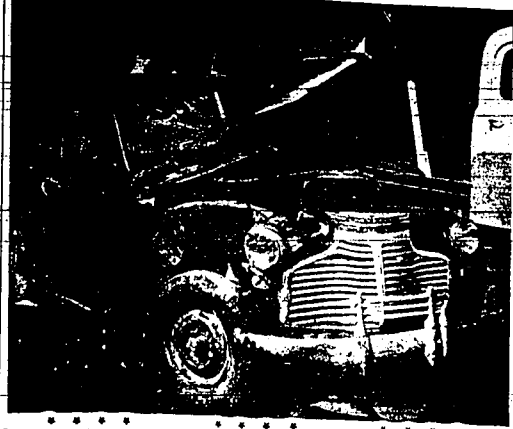
WASHINGTON, Sept. 19 (AP)—Opposition to the appointment of Judge Minton as chief justice of the Supreme Court is expected to be a major issue in the Senate's consideration of the nomination.

Senators are uncertain on the nomination of Minton, who was appointed by President Truman in 1948. The Senate Judiciary Committee has reported the nomination favorably, but several senators have expressed reservations.

### Witness Says Slavs Spread Rumors Here

WASHINGTON, Sept. 19 (AP)—Testimony that "official representatives" of Yugoslavia have directly aided communist propaganda activity here has been made public today by a Senate Judiciary subcommittee.

The witness was Dr. Stobodan M. Draskovich, a refugee from Tito's communist regime in Yugoslavia. Now living in New York City, he formerly was an economics professor at the University of Belgrade.

The committee, holding hearings on a bill to raise new barriers against the entry of subversive aliens, took the testimony this month behind closed doors.

**Acheson Opposed**

Secretary of State Acheson's opposition to the proposed legislation was disclosed recently. He said it would seriously interfere with the conduct of foreign affairs and might force a break in diplomatic relations with communist-dominated nations.

Dr. Draskovich told the committee that representatives from Yugoslavia "did not respect" the rule that they were supposed not to meddle in internal politics or make communist propaganda.

They have taken part in many communist-led activities, he said, and their speeches there were of "direct help" to communist propaganda in America.

**Pellitus Testimony**

A committee questioner observed to the witness that a Draskovich report given the committee contained information "concerning involvement" of the Yugoslav embassy staff and the Yugoslav delegation to the United Nations in communist activities.

He said Dr. John Villan, Yugoslav delegate to the United Nations, described as "a user of disguise" in testimony that the Yugoslav delegation to the U.S. is involved in communist activities.

Dr. Villan said that Dr. Draskovich was a "known partisan" of Gen. Draza Mihailovic, who was accused by the Tito regime of collaborating with the Germans. The general was accused for treason.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 19 (AP)—An experimental model of the X-5 jet bomber, the first of its kind, was tested today at Edwards Air Force Base, Calif.

The X-5 is a high-speed, high-altitude aircraft designed to explore the limits of supersonic flight. It is powered by a single turbojet engine and has a delta-wing configuration.

The test flight was successful, and the X-5 is expected to be used in further tests in the coming months. The aircraft is being developed by the Northrop Corporation.

### Chicago Printers End Long Strike

CHICAGO, Sept. 19 (AP)—Chicago's 100,000 printers ended a 10-day strike today by returning to work at the International Typographical Union's terms.

The strike, which began on Sept. 9, was the longest in the history of the I.T.U. The union had demanded a 15% wage increase and a new contract.

The settlement includes a 10% wage increase and a new contract that provides for a 10% increase in the next year. The strike ended with a vote of 95% in favor of the settlement.

### Ex-Major and Spouse Leave Leper Colony

CARVILLE, La., Sept. 18 (AP)—A former major in the U. S. Army who leaves today for a leper colony to be near his stricken wife, carried her to his quarters and then they were together under one roof.

Mrs. Hans Hornbostel was released from the national leprosy hospital here yesterday. The first time she had known freedom in more than six years.

She and her loyal husband boarded a station wagon and headed for Long Island, N. Y. The New York state health officer has granted her permission to take private treatment there without segregation.

The husband was separated for the first time when both became wartime prisoners of the Japanese. He was liberated three years later, but in June, 1946, she was confined again in the leprosy hospital.

Hornbostel requested permission to enter the colony with her, even if it meant becoming a leper. Hospital authorities denied his plea but allowed the couple to visit a small house on the grounds where she slept away from the institution in a rented room but risked exposure daily to the disease.

Enlisted With Freedom

Mrs. Hornbostel, a 56-year-old grandmother, was freed from the leprosy hospital who will work a job in New York.

"We're going to a state where there's no segregation laws," she said. "We can live in our home, and I know both of us will be much happier."

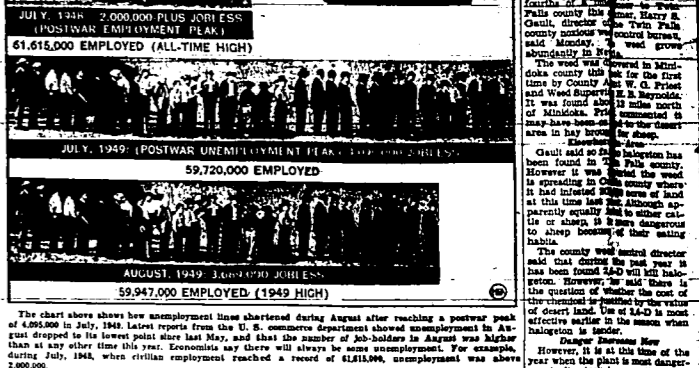

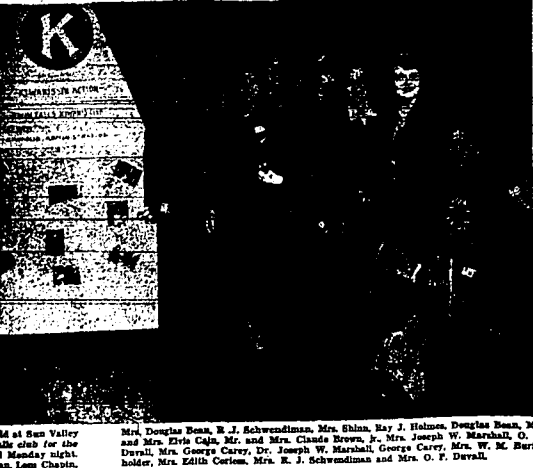
