

Air Force to Send Recruit Officer Here

Young men and women from the Twin Falls area interested in an officer career in the United States Air Force will have an opportunity for interview Oct. 2 by an Air Force officer, Sgt. W. C. Brown. A regular recruiting station has, said Wednesday.

First Training: The first type of training is for aviation cadets. It includes 12 months of academic and flying instruction. Graduates are awarded the silver wings of a pilot and commissions as second lieutenants in the Air Force. Outstanding graduates receive regular commissions. All others, with reserve commissions, have opportunity to compete for regular commissions while on three years of active duty in flying assignments.

To be eligible for pilot training, one must be between the ages of 17 and 34, a citizen, married or single, have at least two years of college or the ability to pass an equivalent examination and high physical and moral qualifications. Classes begin every six weeks.

Train Navigators: The second type of training is aviation cadet navigator. Young officers trained in the latest techniques of radar navigation are in great demand by the Air Force. The Air Force is operating an aviation cadet navigator school at Hamilton Air Force Base, Houston, Tex. Effective Nov. 1, classes will begin every month.

Graduates of the 12-month training program receive commissions as second lieutenants, with semiannual ratings as navigator. After a 30-day leave with pay, they are assigned to aviation duties with the strategic air command or the worldwide military air transport service.

Regular commissions: Regular commissions are the same as for aviation cadets. Making pilot training. The slightly longer course is also the same, except for the physical examination which is less stringent.

Third type of training is the Air Force officer candidate school. Men and women receive 18-month training in the Air Force receive all benefits of thorough instruction. Outstanding recruits receive commissions as second lieutenants and are assigned to three years of active duty in junior executive positions.

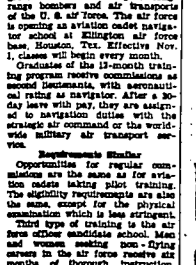

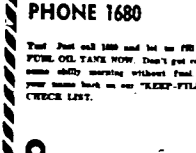

Bean Support Prices Listed By Chairman

BUFFET, Sept. 21—Carl E. Metz, chairman of the Minidoka county conservation association announced support prices for 1944 crop dry edible beans.

The supports are based upon 90 per cent of the parity price as of Sept. 1, the beginning of the marketing year, with differentials for the various classes and areas, as announced July 11. The parity price as of Sept. 1 for dry edible beans is \$2.18 per 100 pounds.

Support prices in Idaho to be implemented through loans and purchase agreements are for U. S. No. 1 cleaned and bagged beans, 100 pounds net weight. Support prices for U. S. No. 1 beans are 10 cents per 100 pounds more than for U. S. No. 1 beans of the same class.

U. S. No. 2 beans will be distributed 15 cents per 100 pounds below the price supports for U. S. No. 1 of the same class.

Support prices

Classes and support prices are:

Pea and medium white, \$0.85; great northern, \$0.80; pink, \$1.20; light dark and western red small white and first small white, \$1.20; kidney, \$0.80; cranberry, \$1.20; pink, \$1.20; small red, \$0.85; baby lima, \$1.20; and standard lima, \$0.85.

Beans may be stored on the farm in an approved warehouse. However, farm stored beans must be delivered to the commodity credit corporation through an approved warehouse or track located under the support program.

Other Procedures

If the beans are stored in an approved warehouse, a negotiable warehouse receipt must be obtained in order to obtain the support. If the warehouse receipt is marked "identically preserved," the producer will be accountable for any variation in grade or weight upon delivery to the commodity credit corporation.

If the warehouse receipt is not marked "identically preserved," the beans will be considered as commingled, in which case the warehouse guarantees the weight and grade and the producer will be accountable for any variation in grade or weight.

Millions Send In Forms for Vet Dividends

WASHINGTON, Sept. 21—More than 10,000,000 World War II veterans have applied for the special life insurance dividend to be paid next year, the veterans administration said today.

The applications, available at all post offices and veterans' centers, still are coming in at the rate of about 20,000 a day, the agency said.

10 Per Cent Not Correct

Large numbers are being mailed in agency signatures, it said. The agency added that indications are that about 10 per cent of the applications are improperly filled out. Many of these can be corrected by checking with the files, however.

About 10,000,000 veterans will receive the \$1,000,000,000 payment which is scheduled to start in January.

Rate Is Explained

For policy holders who were age 40 or less at the time of issuance, the dividend is 10 cents for each \$1,000 of insurance. For each month the policy was in force before its 1944 anniversary date.

The rate is lower for older policy holders, ranging downward to a minimum of 20 cents a month per \$1,000 for veterans 80 and over when the policy was issued.
