Dr. Meyer A. Perlestein, podiatrist and authority on the treatment of cerebral palsy, will conduct a clinic for physicians here on Sept. 29, according to Thos. H. Wegener, Boise, president of the Idaho chapter of the National Society for Crippled Children and Adults.

The Idaho chapter is sponsoring the clinic in cooperation with local medical societies and the crippled children service of the state department of public health.

All members of the medical profession have been invited to attend the all-day clinic, Wegener said.

The patients will be limited primarily to younger children representing various types of cerebral palsy (spastic) affliction and will provide an opportunity for Idaho physicians to observe the latest developments in diagnosis and treatment.

"Much progress has been made in this field recently, and Dr. Perlestein is one of the very best qualified to discuss and demonstrate these advances," Wegener said.

Dr. Perlestein is a member of the podiatric staff of the Cook county, Michael Reese and Belmont hospitals in Chicago, a member of the staff of Northwestern university medical center in the University of Chicago, and also a member of the staff of the National Society for Crippled Children and Adults and consultant on cerebral palsy for a number of private and public health organizations and hospitals.

"We had hoped to arrange additional clinics in Idaho for Dr. Perlestein but the time in the west was so limited that the three scheduled clinics were all that his itinerary would permit at this time," Wegener said.

The other clinics will be held at Boise and Pocatello.

Polio Decline Reported for Fourth Week

WASHINGTON, Sept. 22 (AP)—The number of new polio cases dropped last week for the fourth consecutive week.

The total for the week was 2,208, compared to 2,703 the previous week. Last week's total brought the number of cases reported to 107,600 for the year to date. This is close to the record polio year of 1918 when approximately 35,000 cases were reported.

The public health service said that last week's statistics included all states except Tennessee.

Despite the overall decline, increases were reported by 23 states. The greatest increase occurred in New Jersey where the number rose from 128 to 127; Minnesota, 128 to 150; Massachusetts, 143 to 165; and New York, 338 to 354.

The decreases were reported in Oklahoma where the number dropped from 80 to 50; Ohio, 178 to 147; Iowa, 75 to 53; Colorado, 77 to 54; and South Dakota, 44 to 23.

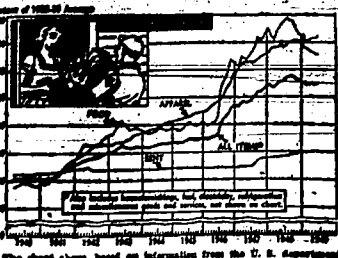

Payment to Vets Set in November

Veterans enrolling in Idaho educational institutions this fall can expect to receive their first stipend check from the government on or about Nov. 2, according to William Sproat, manager of the veterans administration office here.

This means that stipends for the last few days in September and all of October will be consolidated and paid in one check, Sproat said.

Sproat explained that this procedure seems desirable because all of the Idaho colleges reopen late in September and considerable difficulty would be found in trying to make separate payments for the last few days in September.

Farmers Advised By County Agent To Spray Cattle

Now is an approximate time to spray cattle for lice because many cattle are being brought off the range at this time of year, County Agent C. W. Daigh said Thursday.

The best insecticide for lice control in 1949, he said, is recommended that four pounds of 60 per cent solution be used for each 100 gallons of water used for spray.

Second best insecticide to be used for lice is chloroform, which may be used at similar strength as DDT, Daigh added.

Treatment now will make winter spraying unnecessary if no new animals are added to the herd. Most of the spraying should be made over the front of each animal, particularly over the head, back and shoulders and around the rear quarters, he explained.

Daigh said a spray demonstration may be scheduled. He asked that anyone having cattle which might be used in the demonstration contact the county agent's office.
