## Atomium Discovery Tales Tint Atomic Energy Race; Soviet Talk Security Curb

LONDON, Sept. 26 (AP)—Reports of new uranium discoveries on both sides of the iron curtain—in Czechoslovakia and the Soviet Union—have sent a chill of atomic energy race now that Russia has atomic weapons.

These were the week-end developments in Europe following President Truman's announcement that the Russians had touched off an atomic explosion recently.

1. Tass, the official Soviet news agency, asserted Russia had atomic weapons since 1947. Apparently said the Soviet union was ready for international control of atomic energy, but didn't say what kind of control—a point that has balked American-Soviet agreement because previously Russia has insisted on a veto power over international inspectors.

2. France's press, already possessing known uranium deposits, was reported to have found new veins of the ore from which atomic energy is made. This prompted speculation as to whether General de Gaulle would use this uranium store in bargaining for improved relations with the western nations.

3. Czech Mines Opened

3. A new uranium mine was reported opened in Czechoslovakia which has been producing uranium since 1947. At least two Czech mines are known to be sending uranium all over the world.

4. German scientists and uranium ore from east Germany helped the Soviet Union in its uranium program, it is announced. The Soviet Union had previously denied this.

5. A Soviet representative never was to the atomic conference in the Soviet Union and to blame us for failing to make prohibitions of atomic energy.

6. Many western European statesmen and diplomats privately told the press that they are skeptical of the Soviet Union's claims.

7. The United Nations Atomic Energy Commission will meet in Geneva, Switzerland, on Oct. 2, to discuss the Soviet Union's plan to halt the atomic energy race.

## Palisades Project Is Given Okay of Senate Committee

WASHINGTON, Sept. 26 (AP)—A bill authorizing the \$34,000,000 Palisades project in Idaho was approved today by the Senate Interior Committee.

The committee, however, added a restriction that the project will be delayed even if Congress approves it until the Wyoming-Idaho compact on the Snake river is approved by the state legislatures.

Last week Senator Bert Miller, D. Idaho, obtained statements from Idaho Gov. C. A. Rohn that said that the project would be among the first orders of business as soon as the state legislatures meet.

This statement and a similar one from Wyoming state officials produced in committee by Sen. Joseph O'Mahoney, D. Wyo., are reported to have been instrumental in winning final approval.

The project, involving improvements on the upper Snake river all the way from Milner dam between Twin Falls and Rupert to the Wyoming state line, has been approved by the state legislatures.

A similar bill also has been approved by the house public lands committee.

The project involves the government's first attempt to cap the deepened Snake river and build the eastern Idaho levee system through the project.

Two bills have been introduced in the Senate to authorize the project. One is by Sen. Joseph O'Mahoney, D. Wyo., and the other is by Sen. Charles McNary, D. Ore.

The O'Mahoney bill would authorize the project with a total investment of \$34,000,000. The McNary bill would authorize the project with a total investment of \$34,000,000.

## Showdown Talks Are Resumed in Disputes

Showdown negotiations resumed as the steel and automobile labor disputes today while rivaling bands of pickets in the West Virginia coal fields threatened further violence in the nationwide mine strike.

In a fourth big dispute, CIO Electrical Workers considered taking strike vote against Westinghouse of General Electric.

Striking coal miners led about 250 automobiles and headed for the coal fields of central West Virginia. State police, following the procession in radio-equipped cars, estimated that the miners numbered between 1,000 and 1,200.

Last week a small caravan of West Virginia miners closed non-union miners, bean non-striker and wrecked mine machinery.

In the steel dispute, U. S. Steel corporation Charles R. Coy, a top officer who visited to negotiate with CIO, said that the steel company was ready to negotiate with CIO.

## Expert Urges Farm's Water System Check

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Monday, Sept. 21—with frost nights giving warning of winter did not go too far. Mrs. C. Jensen, agricultural engineer with the University, suggests giving the farm water system a thorough check now to see that freezing temperatures will not find an opening when they come later.

"A good check-up right now will save trouble later on," Jensen says. "It's easy to do a few simple jobs right now while the weather is still warm. Everyone knows the trouble and inconvenience these conditions will even a simple breakdown of the water system during winter months."

When to start  
Back on the lines outside the house to looking for trouble in old water systems, Jensen says. Flush all lines that have not been used during the summer months and check drain valves at stock watering tanks by six days before they freeze. Flush all drain pipes after use and empty them out before they freeze. If they are to drain properly.

The engineer warns that water lines must be from three to four feet under ground in the warm sections of the state and deeper in the higher elevations if they are to be safe from freezing. Trunks are not enough insulation, even though under the surface are caught by unusual cold spells that penetrate deeper into the earth.

Pump House Trouble  
"Pump house trouble is a source of worry and trouble during winter cold," Jensen points out. "If there is not enough insulation, prevent freezing there, it is electric lighting to heat a lantern of electric light bulbs to the point of extra heat at all cold nights."

"Of course the best thing to do is to be sure that no amount of ice is going to keep you awake nights worrying about whether your water line will have water in the morning. There's other considerable expense to freeze besides the inconvenience of the two- or three-day waiting."

Copper Tubing  
Copper tubing does not solve the problem of freezing pipes, the engineer explains. Water will freeze just as readily in copper pipes as in the common iron pipes, but there is less danger of breaking when the copper carries the water.

On the other hand, it is almost impossible to blow copper tubes out by using electric currents to do the job as copper does not offer enough resistance to cause heat as the current passes through.

Prime Minister Clement Attlee and Health Minister Aneurin Bevan supported Cripps' original plea, that devaluation and all other agreements reached at Washington would not be allowed to interfere with the socialist program.
