AP Feature Editor and author of the book "The Atomic Bomb" and the story "The Atom Bomb" (which is now being made into a movie), finds complete agreement among the western powers in providing an acceptable method of control can be devised.

However, there's nothing new in that. It's a statement which could have been made at any time since June of 1944 when the subject first came before the United Nations in the w. The trouble has been that the Soviet and the west have been as far apart as the poles on which the controls should be.

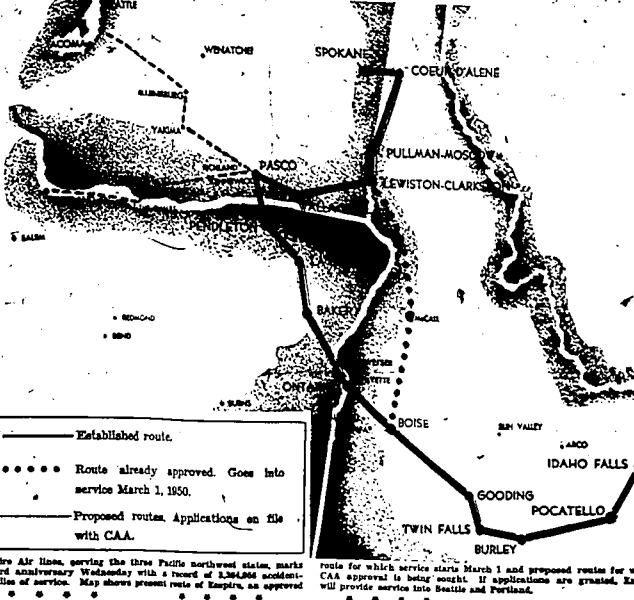

### Empire Marks Third Anniversary With Record of 22,623 Fares in 8 Months

Empire Air Lines—Idaho's portion of a nationwide network of feeder lines providing airtel service to smaller communities of the United States—will celebrate its third anniversary Wednesday.

Proof that Empire is on the march was advanced by Owen Hicks, Boise, vice president and general manager of the United States. He provided figures to show that during the past eight months Empire has carried a total of 22,623 passengers, or more than had been carried by the airline from its founding on Sept. 28, 1946, until Jan. 1, 1949.

In the three years of operation, Hicks pointed out, Empire has flown a total of 8,394,854 accident-free miles without a single mishap along its 800-mile route which operates in three states and stretches from Spokane on the north to Idaho Falls and Pocatello on the south.

Thus the airtel structure tradition, Empire at present has three terminal stops in Magic Valley, Twin Falls, Gooding and Burley, affording quick inter-city transportation within the area. Robert L.
