NEWSPAPER FIGHT ENDS. It's not surprising that the two-year fight which the Pocatello Tribune and the Pocatello Post has come to an abrupt end.

After battling to draw the two newspapers into a merger, the two newspapers' new ownership arrangement associated with a chain newspaper publishing concern.

The Tribune has been published in Pocatello for the past 50 years. Its competitor in the death struggle entered the field 22 months ago.

During that brief period hundreds of thousands of dollars were lost in a battle which neither newspaper could win. Money was squandered, for instance, on automobile contests and circulation campaigns.

But statistics will bear out his point. Not so long ago the American Mercury magazine made a survey showing that "newspapers are the most widely read of all periodicals."

And when it added an even more surprising conclusion: "The same situation prevails in 71 out of 106 American cities with populations under 100,000."

One of the most interesting newspaper fights now under way is the one between the Salt Lake Tribune and the Deseret News, both published in Salt Lake City.

WATCH THOSE POTATOES! With another shipment about to get under way, it will be interesting to see if all the agitation against the illegal sale and transportation of Idaho potatoes is getting any where.

After notifying the Times-News of what they had found on their visits over the country, these interested observers joined with the newspaper in determining a means of bringing all this potato racketeering to an end.

Some arrests were made and for awhile it looked as if a showdown was inevitable. Then it developed that the Idaho potato growers' association had secured the services of the state attorney general and the commissioner of agriculture.

It will take no little effort to run unscrupulous growers and shippers out of business and the more pressure that is brought to bear the sooner such illegitimate traffic in Idaho potatoes will end.

MEANTIME THE TIMES-NEWS offers the suggestion that all the people of Magic Valley be on the lookout for off-grade potatoes during their travels.

### University Seeks Low-Cost Method To Process Rock

MOSCOW, Oct. 1 (AP)—The University of Idaho has started a special research project to find a new, low-cost method of processing phosphate rock, President J. E. Buchanan reports.

University phosphate research now is in its third phase—intensive study of the most economical way of processing the raw rock so the state can produce a concentrated product that can be shipped to all western states, Buchanan said.

"The purpose of our experimental studies is to increase faster in the west than in any other section of the country," naturally Idaho phosphate beds are being looked to as a source of supply."

Dr. C. O. Resner, head of the chemical engineering department, will direct the new project. The college of engineering and agriculture and the school of mines will take part.

The university has been studying phosphate deposits in Idaho since 1918. The last research determined that the state has some 8,000,000 tons of high grade rock in eastern and southeastern Idaho. The second phase of study was to test various phosphate fertilizers.

The school of mines has developed one method for concentrating phosphate at low cost. The new project will be to find other methods in the new.
