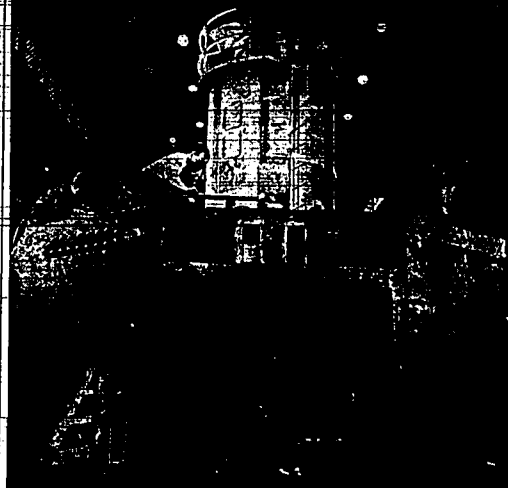

Monster Generator Coming Here



Although this power plant looks like a blunt-nosed submarine and will depend on millions of gallons of water for its operation, it's strictly a "land-lubber." It is the first of three giant waterwheel generators being built by Westinghouse in Pennsylvania for the Idaho Power company. When installed at the new dam site near Shoshone the 250,000-kilowatt-amperes machine will produce electricity for residential and irrigation purposes. The "boasting tower" atop the main structure will house the upper end of the rotor shaft, guide bearings and other equipment. The large water wheel, which fits inside the frame shown here, will turn at a speed of 125 revolutions per minute. And all this so you can burn a tiny light bulb. (Staff capturing)
