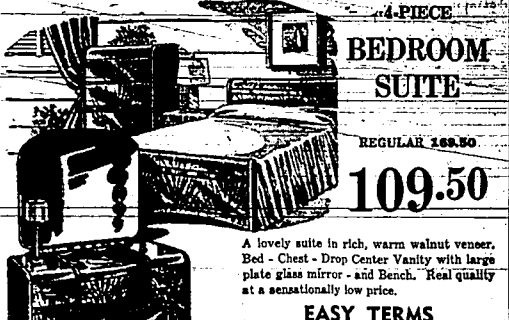
Toastmasters To Form New Club in Week

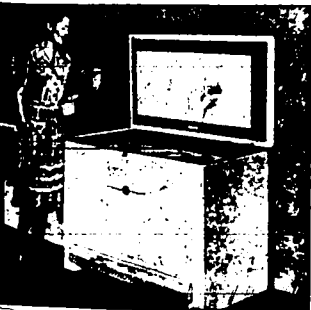

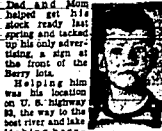
