'Bitter' Political Campaign Is Youth Month Event's Feature

The loudest if not the most bitter political campaign in recent Twin Falls history is under way as junior and senior high school students vie to see who will be mayor and councilmen for a day.

The campaign opened Monday with collection of petitions. A primary election will be held Thursday with the general election set for Oct. 27. Results will be announced Oct. 28 and the new government will go into effect for approximately eight hours Oct. 31.

Six students whose names were drawn from a hat Monday will engage in a forum discussion of the commissioner and city manager forms of government, etc., at 7:30 p. m. Tuesday. Three junior and three senior high school students were chosen for the program. Members of the forum will be Jean Pettigrew and Maxton Elwood, junior high school candidates for mayor; Danny Davis, junior high school councilman candidate; Bud Detweiler, senior high school mayor candidate; and Robert Chisholm and George Avant, council hopefuls from senior high school.

Petitions for mayor must be signed by 75 names while those for councilmen need 25 names. Following the primary election Thursday, remaining candidates will include two for mayor and six for council members from senior high school with three mayor and 12

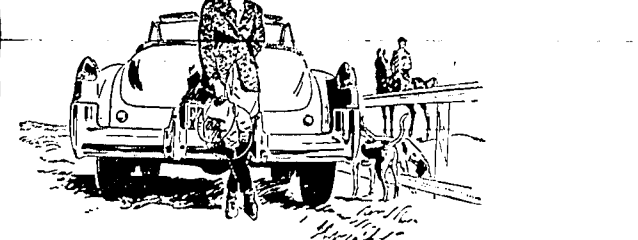

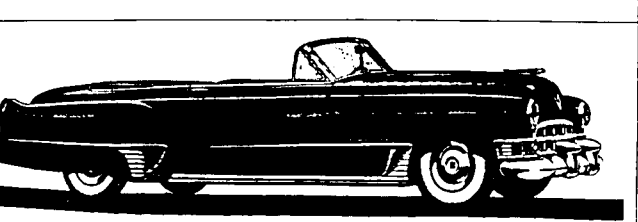

The attorney general's request is based on the fact that the state constitution provides for the election of judges for 10-year terms, and that the present judges are over 70 years of age.

The attorney general said that the present judges are "too old to do the work of the office" and that it is "in the best interests of the state" to limit the age of judges to 70 years.

The attorney general's request is being considered by the state supreme court, which is expected to meet next week.

Truman's OK Given Law to Up Vets' Pay

WASHINGTON, Oct. 11 (AP)—A bill raising veterans' compensation and disability payments by more than \$122,000,000 a year had been signed by President Truman today.

The veterans administration estimated that 2,200,000 veterans of World Wars I and II and of the Spanish-American war would be affected under the action liberalizing disability and death payments. Backers of the bill contended the increases are necessary to meet the increased cost of living.

Full Compensation

World War I veterans with disabilities legally presumed to be service-connected would get full compensation instead of the present 75 per cent.

Portion of the bill applicable to veterans of the three wars increase the length of time for which payments may be made for arrested cases of tuberculosis; and create a new disability schedule based on 10 per cent of total disability and \$15 for 10 per cent disability. The old rate was \$15 and \$12.50.

Up Dependents Pay

In addition, the bill provides increased monthly payments to widows with a child or children and to widows with 50 per cent or more disability to receive additional payments for dependents.

A previous story on the signing of the bill conveyed the impression that all the benefits were primarily applicable to only veterans of World War I.

5 Airmen Are Killed by B-17 Crash in Utah

SALT LAKE, UTAH, Oct. 10.—All five airmen aboard an air force B-17 bomber that crashed in the desert today died yesterday when the plane crashed and exploded in a flash of fire.

Rescue parties recovered two bodies late yesterday. A third was located in shallow water. A boat could not reach it. A fourth was recovered in the Utah desert and the plane wreckage.

The wreckage was found on a mountain side some 10 miles from the base. The five crew members died. One was reportedly buried in sand or mud on the lake bottom, under 20 feet of water.

It is not confirmed.

Air force authorities have not confirmed the exact place of the crash, or a missing flight from Albuquerque, N. M., to Salt Lake City.

But rescue workers said the wreckage damaged and identified it as a ship of force by Brig. Gen. William M. Morrison, commander of the 11th Air Force. No other planes have been reported missing in this area.

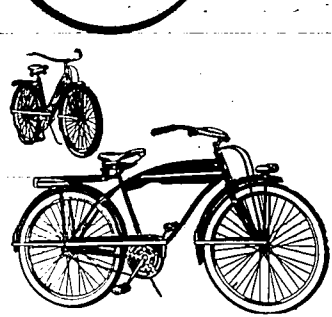

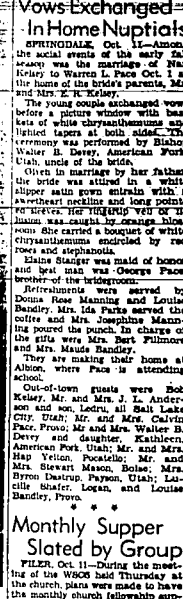

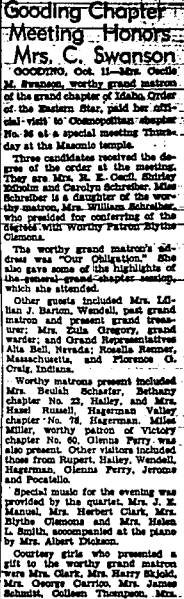
