5-Day Deadlock on Crop

Support Plan Is Ended;

Service Fund Approved

WASHINGTON, Oct. 18 (AP)—A House and senate farm conference today agreed on a compromise long-range farm bill after five days of deadlock.

The compromise calls for continuing present supports for basic crops at 90 per cent for one year, then from 80 to 90 per cent for two years, and then putting them under the senate-approved flexible program ranging from 75 to 90 per cent.

The agreement was announced by Sen. Elmer Thomas, D., Okla., and Rep. Harold D. Cooley, D., Ohio.

The compromise also provides that for four years—through 1953—farmers will be paid support prices according to the party formula which brings them the most.

Work at Dam Gets Okay of Senate Group

WASHINGTON, Oct. 18 (AP)—Senator Dworkak said last night the state interior committee has agreed to an amendment which will permit preconstruction work to continue on the Palisades dam in eastern Idaho.

Legislation to authorize the multi-million dollar project on the upper Snake river is pending on the senate calendar. Action on it was postponed today when objection was raised to its passage without a record vote.

Earlier, however, Dworkak met with the interior committee, of which he was a member in the last congress.

He said the committee agreed to modify a clause in the bill so that pre-construction work at the dam site may continue. The reclamation bureau is now building power lines and relocating a road.

At originally reported, the bill would have stopped all project work until both Idaho and Wyoming legislatures had ratified a compact on the Snake river. The compact has been signed by the state commission. The Idaho legislature will hold a special session next January to ratify it, but the Wyoming legislature will not meet until the following year.

With permit work Dworkak said the amendment will permit work to go ahead up to actual construction of the dam and reservoir.

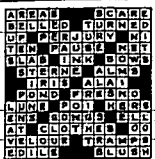

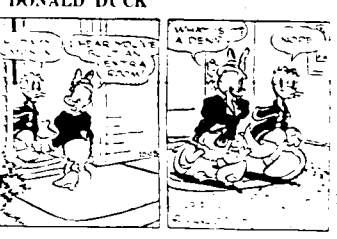

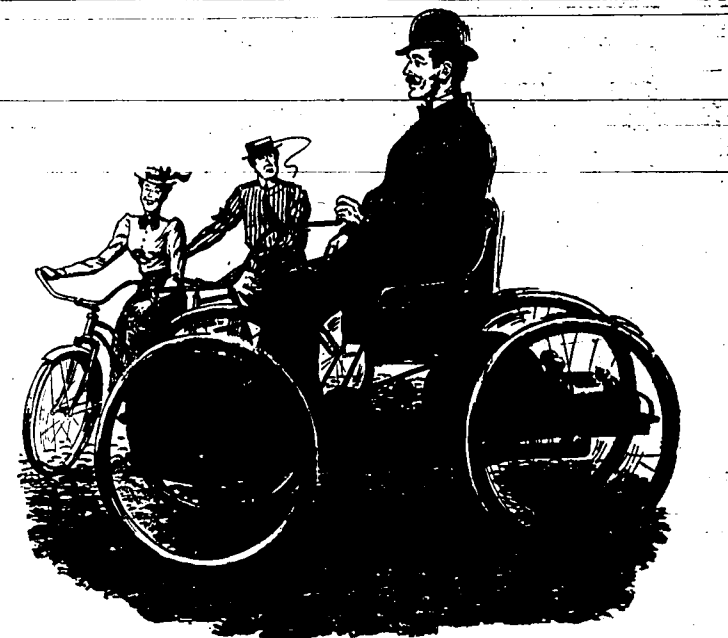

Heavy Run of Hogs to Mart Cutting Price

A heavy run of hogs to market this summer sent the price of pork chops tumbling 10 cents at butcher shops in the last month, a United Press survey showed today.

Pork roasts has declined almost 10 cents a pound, reports from 20 cities showed. Bacon however, retained the downward trend and beef has remained steady.

3-Year Index Low
The big shipments from the hump of spring and crop sent the cost of Bradstreet's wholesale food price index to a new three-year low. Agriculture department experts said they expect all types of meat except lamb to be plentiful through 1939, with prices relatively lower. Hog prices closed 20 to 30 cents lower at the major commodity markets yesterday with choice butcher hogs going at 16.25-17.25 per 100 pounds in Chicago. The market received an estimated 88,000 hogs and 128,300 cattle, compared to 75,000 hogs and 125,000 cattle a week ago.

Consumption Has Been
The American Meat Institute predicts per capita consumption of pork would increase 45 per cent during the last three months of the year to an annual rate of 44 pounds per person.

The Institute predicted farmers
will produce 12,000,000,000 pounds of pork, a 12 per cent jump over this year's expected production of 10,700,000,000 pounds.

Beef Output Is Growing
Beef production next year is expected to hit 8,600,000,000 pounds, compared with this year's output of 8,000,000,000 pounds and a 1937-38 average of 7,433,000,000 pounds. Veal production is expected to hold steady at 1,800,000,000 pounds for 1938 and 1939. Lamb, also expected to hold the present annual production of 600,000,000 pounds, is far under the 1937-41 average of 800,000,000,000 pounds, however.

Fabulous Nevada Gold Figure Dies At Coastal Home

TUJUNGA, Calif., Oct. 18 (AP)—Alta D. Myers, 77, called "the father of Goldfield, Nev.," died Monday in his modest bungalow.

Myers, who became a multi-millionaire in 52 months shortly after the turn of the century, laid out a plot of agricultural land in 1903 for a mining camp, naming it Goldfield. Four years later Goldfield, between Tunjuna and Las Vegas, had a population of 30,000 and was Nevada's largest city.

Myers staked claims for the Comstock, Idaho, yielding \$200-a-ton gold ore, and later discovered the fabulous Mohave mine, one of the world's richest and yielding ore averaging 420 a pound.

Myers at one time owned seven Nevada banks and built what was the largest home at Lone Beach, Calif. The mansion's cost—\$2,000,000—was paid for by Myers.

Myers lost almost the entire fortune in the Nevada bank panic of 1927 and had been a semi-invalid since being injured in an automobile accident in 1927.


