Tough Notre Dame Gridmen Again Rated Nation's Best

NEW YORK, Oct. 19 (AP)—Top-placed Notre Dame ails it out this week-end but other members of college football's "first ten" face muscular foes who should give the rankings another vigorous shuffle. Three new teams moved into the select list after last week's wave of upsets but the Fighting Irish strengthened their hold on the No. 1 position by mauling highly-touted Tulane 46-7.

Sports writers and broadcasters participating in the Associated Press weekly poll were so impressed by this show of might that they gave the Irish a wallowing vote.

Notre Dame received 146 of 179 first place votes and a 200-point lead over Army, which hung on to second place with Minnesota hurting behind Oklahoma to take third.

Finishing out the top 10, in order, are Oklahoma, California, North Carolina, Kentucky, Cornell, Rice and Texas.

The newcomers are Cornell, Rice and Texas. They showed out Michigan, the mythical all-star champion, Tulane and Southern Methodist, the most distinguished upset victors.

Michigan, beaten by Northwestern for its second defeat in a row, dropped to 12th. Tulane fell from fourth to 20th. SMU, subdued by Rice, plummeted from 10th to 17th.

Notre Dame is idle Saturday, enjoying an open date before its Oct. 29 engagement with Navy at Baltimore. The South Branch main challenge for a national honor will be Army—Minnesota, Kentucky, Texas and Rice perhaps better than the rest.

Rice, No. 9, and Texas, No. 10, clash at Austin in the only game involving two members of the top 10. Minnesota, No. 8, plays Michigan, and Kentucky, No. 7, meets SMU on the rebound.

Notre Dame pulled 1748 votes compared with 1233 for Army. Both Minnesota and Oklahoma polled more than 1000 but none approached the Irish first place total.

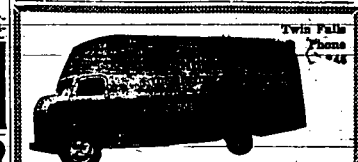

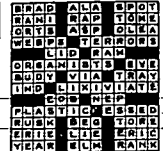

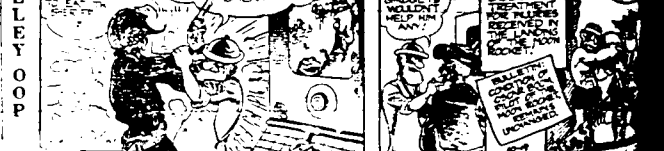
