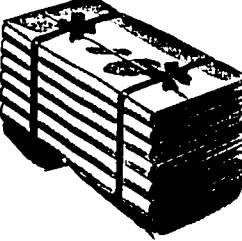

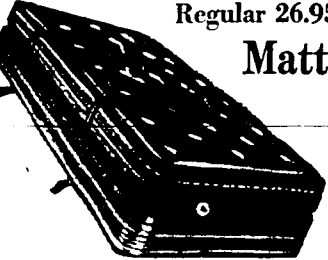

FOREIGN COMPETITION

Styrocketing wages and shorter hours have complicated the economic picture in this country, but a far more serious problem is the lack of production. Now contented with the gains of the war, the manufacturer in too many instances, have encouraged slow-ups, feather-bedding and other devices intended to discourage peak production. They argue that these tactics "make work."

"If we were to do away with the industrialist and president of the Lincoln Electric company at Cleveland, just returned from a two-week tour of industrial concerns in England, Holland, Belgium and France, I think we would be losing 10,000 American production experts to England and the European continent for one year," he observed, "those countries could shut down every industrial plant in the United States."

His judgment is based on the fact that the recent devaluation of the British pound has reduced the dollar-wise factory wage rates in those nations to an average of only 60 percent of the wage level in the United States. He sees a strong threat to American industry if these European countries can throw goods produced at their low wage level into this country.

These factors have thus far prevented the flooding of the American market with foreign goods, Lincoln pointed out. One is that the European manufacturers are not yet ready to sell their goods at a price that European production methods have not yet reached a stage of development which will allow them to compete with American-made products.

The menace to United States industry will come, he says, when the home markets of these countries are satiated and when American production methods are more widely applied abroad. Polio Vaccine Hunt Netting Some 'Results'

WASHINGTON, Oct. 26 (AP)—Scientists in the past few weeks have developed promising results in their search for a polio vaccine, an official of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis says. Dr. H. M. Weaver, research director, said a new way has been found for producing two of the three strains of polio in the laboratory. 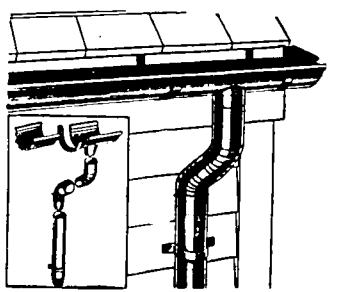

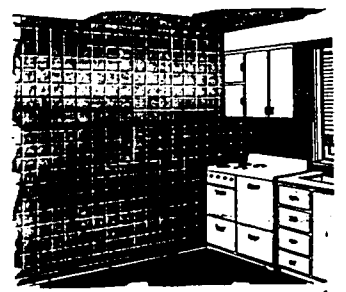

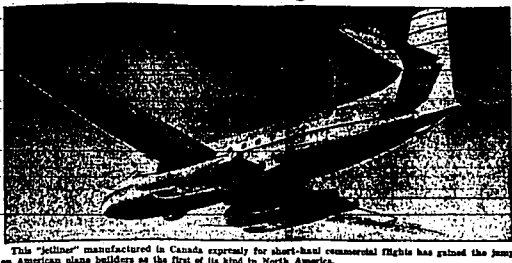

Canada's Pace-Setting Jet Airliner



This "Jetliner" manufactured in Canada expressly for short-haul commercial flights has gained the jump on American plane builders as the first of its kind in North America.

Canada Challenges U. S. With First Short-Haul Jet Airliner

TORONTO, Oct. 20—(NPA)—United States aircraft manufacturers, whose planes now carry the bulk of the world's commercial air passengers, have plenty of plans for commercial jet transports—on paper. So far, however, they have no such planes under construction. But they have two strong challenges for the world market. When the first inter-city jet airliner begins operation on scheduled routes in North America, they most likely will be Canadian designers.

Canada's bid was made at the first official flight of the Avro Jetliner, a 42 1/2-mile-per-hour transport built to carry up to 50 passengers on short-haul express service. It began its first New York and Toronto, for instance, less than an hour apart. It is not designed for trans-ocean service.

Debut of the Jetliner, built by the Toronto branch of British plane-maker A. V. Roe, had an audience of many U. S. airline officials. Eddie Rickenbacker, whose Eastern airline always most others by consistently making money, reportedly is interested. His airline is one of the few which stuck to the DC-3 when the new and faster Conquest began taking over short-haul work. Rickenbacker, it was indicated, was waiting for jets. And A. V. Roe expects to have its Jetliner in commercial use by early 1951.

A flight in the Jetliner differs from conventional planes mainly in the absence of noise, both inside and outside. On take-off there is a high-pitched whine, and heat waves surge back of the plane. It is airborne at 100 miles per hour, in about the same distance as a conventional four-engine commercial transport. Flying overhead, the plane, like a most silent, with a whine following after it has passed over. 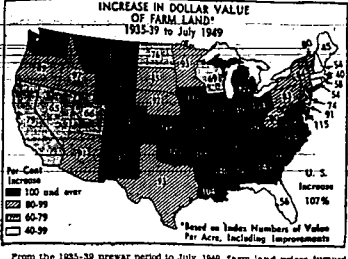

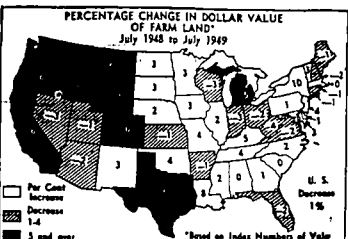

Farm Prices Rise and Fall

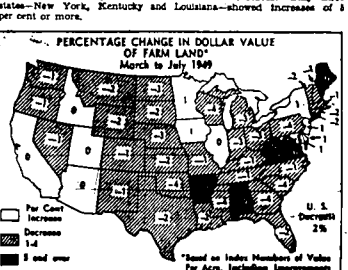
Here, in graphic form, is the story of the rise and fall of farm land prices, according to the latest data from the department of agriculture's bureau of agricultural economics.



From the 1933-39 prewar period to July, 1949, farm land prices jumped 107 per cent. Prices more than doubled in half the states. Biggest increases were in Kentucky, Tennessee, Arkansas, Colorado and North Carolina. Only relatively small gains were made in most of the New England and northern great plains states, along with Nevada, Utah and California.



Farm land values reached their peak in November, 1948, and in the year ended July 1, 1949, prices dropped to half the states. Biggest decreases occurred in the mountain and Pacific coast states, but values were also moderately lower in scattered eastern states. Only three states—New York, Kentucky and Louisiana—showed increases of a per cent or more.



Farm land prices slumped again between March to July this year, when the 12.8 index, based on 1913-16 values as 100, dropped 3 per cent below March and 1 per cent below a year ago. This is the first time since 1938 that the national index has dropped below the same level as the previous year. But although farm land prices in the country as a whole now average about 3 per cent below the 1948 peak they are still more than double the 1939-41 average.

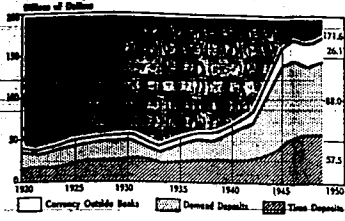

Adage Shows Necessity for Harvest Care

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Moscow, Oct. 20.—The old expression "the bigger they are the harder they fall" fits the Idaho potato harvest like a glove.

A bulky 15-ounce spud dropped one foot will be sure to get at least one black eye and a hard bruise. A six-ounce "night art" with a little-peeled skin, they all get knocked around and receive some damage.

With that fact in mind, the University of Idaho extension service repeated "bite 'em, spit 'em" advice to handle the crop carefully. Proper treatment pays off in dollars and cents.

Digger chains covered with rubber have proved a big help in getting bakers a soft rise. Rubber speed on the digger is one way of avoiding injury, according to Robert Polkey, potato specialist.

Work at the Aberdeen experiment station by Walter Sparks and Einar Humphrey has shown, he said, that when the digger takes a moderate pace fewer potatoes are bruised.

Padding on the truck bed also cushions the jolt in the next step of the harvest. Suitable beds can be made of straw, dirt, old carpet or similar material. Proper adjustment and operation of the piler were described as an essential part of the harvesting operation.

Why go to all the bother? Here's one answer: the specialist presented: A survey in 1948 showed that 1,100,000 bushels of potatoes were reduced from number one because of mechanical injury.

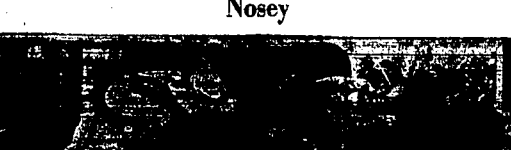

BERLIN, Oct. 20 (AP)—Chancellor Otto Grotewohl pledged his communist government of eastern Germany today to keep the peace with all the nations of the world.

There must never again be an aggressive German, Grotewohl told Polish journalists in an interview distributed by the Soviet news agency. "Never again shall Germany attack Poland, the Soviet union or any other people in the world," he asserted.

This was the first time the eastern nations were included in the peace pledge emanating from the communist regime since it was set up with Russian blessing two weeks ago.

Grotewohl also promised the Polish government would cease the "ding, dach, osten" theory from German thinking. "Never again shall Germany," he said, "be the classic concept of Prussian militarism at the best field for German expansion."
