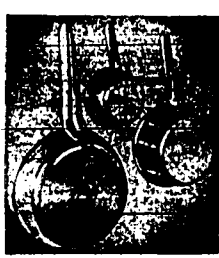

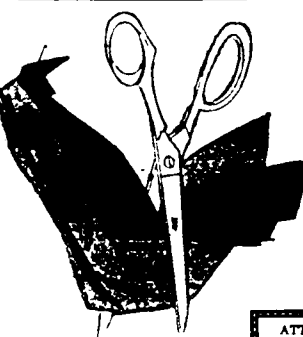

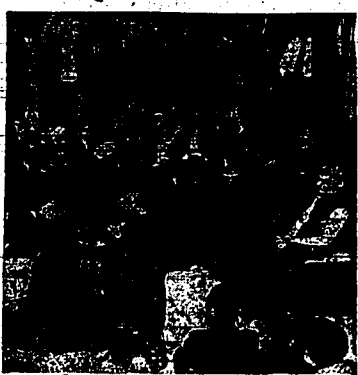

Civil Service Exams Slated For Openings

Examinations for positions of chief nurse, head nurse, inspector (strategic materials), telephone operator and laboratory supervisor will be announced Thursday by the U. S. civil service commission, according to H. F. Herriot, civil service secretary for Twin Falls.

The staff and head nurse positions pay \$2,714 and \$3,721 a year respectively and are located throughout the United States, Alaska and Panama Canal Zone. Applicants must pass a written test and have appropriate nursing education or a combination of education and experience. Applications will be accepted from non-registered nurses who are qualified, but eligible competitors must register as graduate professional nurses before being appointed.

Age limits for work in the positions are 35 years for canal zone duty, 45 years for Indian service duty and 65 years in other agencies.

The inspector (strategic materials) examination covers corrosive films, crystals and ceramic-metallic materials and precious metals, oils and drugs and crystals. Applicants must have either responsible technological experience of a general nature in industrial production, manufacturing, mining or milling of the materials, or more specialized experience in one or more of the commodities in such activities as inspecting, testing, research or refining.

Salaries range from \$2,974 to \$5,224 a year and the positions are with the bureau of federal supply, Washington, D. C. The higher paying positions require additional experience or supervisory experience. No written examination is required.

The telephone operator positions pay \$2,284 and \$2,488 and telephone supervisor positions \$2,714 a year. All these openings are located with federal agencies in Washington, D. C., and vicinity. Applicants must pass a written test and have had experience as operators. Some supervisory positions require experience in supervision of telephone operators.

Age limits for inspector (strategic materials) and telephone operator and supervisor positions are 35 and 45 years respectively. Age limits may be waived in persons entitled to veteran preference.

Persons who wish to apply may obtain full information and application forms from Herriot at the Twin Falls postoffice.

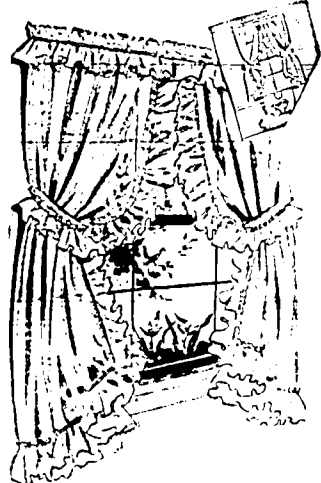

U.S. Mileage Fatality Rate At New Low

CHICAGO, Nov. 3 (AP)—American highway travel scored its lowest fatality rate in the history of the highway since 1929, but there's getting no rate for this month.

Unless a new incentive for safer driving and walking is found, the Federal Highway commission said, "the nation can reconcile itself to an annual traffic death toll of around 12,000."

Volume Increasing
The rub is that the volume of automobile travel is steadily increasing. This increase has held better safety performance to a standard in terms of the number of traffic deaths.

The council said traffic deaths in the first nine months of 1949 are about on a par with same 1948 period. The toll was 22,300 compared to 22,510 in 1948. September traffic deaths were 3,000, about the same as in September, 1948.

Lowest in History
The miles traveled this year is seven days for every 100,000,000 miles. Lowest "miles-month" ratio in history of road travel is 1949 at 7.35 ahead of 1948 and 20 per cent greater than 1941.

Among the leading cities in the first nine months of 1949, ranked according to the number of traffic deaths per 100,000 vehicles, Boise, Ida., with no deaths.

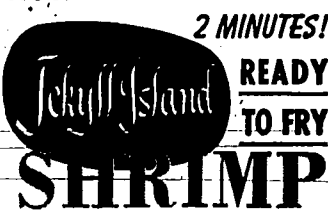
