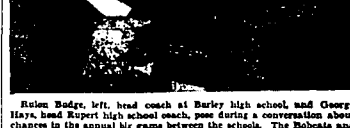

AS YOUR MINISTER SEES IT
 Honesty Is a Principle

By H. H. HUGHES
 (Pastor, First Church of the Nazarenes)

The motto, "honesty is the best policy" has, I think, been traced to Benjamin Franklin, and there is no question that it contains a truth. But it is a secondary truth, for in the full sense honesty is a policy. That is to say, if one is honest just for policy's sake, he is not in the final analysis honest at all. But this is no vice—rather, the fact that it is good policy to be possessed of right principles.

It is not possible for anyone to do much working by himself. But if he has others to work with him, those others must believe in him. It happens, therefore, that when a business executive teaches his associates to steal for him, they do not go far until they begin stealing from him. Hence the principle of honesty, besides being a principle, is in practice the best policy.

One great man asks, "What is stealing?" And then, not quite satisfied, he goes on with his questions and reasonings on the subject. "It is stealing to sell bonds to another that you would not buy yourself; it is stealing to persuade people to buy real estate on which most of them are practically certain to lose money; it is stealing to do less than a fair day's work for a fair day's pay?"

Then he goes on to say, "I remember watching some stone mason at work on a building when they received \$10 a day. They were proceeding with miserable dignity. We all understood they had agreed among themselves to lay only half the amount of stones that a good workman could lay in the time. But I knew and the mason knew that all the stone for the building came from a limited number of quarries in a certain district, and that the owners had agreed among themselves to keep the price up and divide the profits. Of course the gentlemen were financiers and the workmen were slaves, but the question recurs, 'What is meant by stealing?'"

And there is no question that every attempt to exchange the inferior for the superior in trade between human beings is stealing. The fact is, we are not really troubled about definitions. We all know pretty well how to be honest, if we really want to be so."

New Group Hearing Device Aids Teaching at State School

type and degree of deafness they do not all come to learn the word at the same time, and so each pupil becomes an individual problem. Another great pleasure is in hearing their own voice. For a hearing person this is taken for granted, but a deaf child has no idea of the sound of his own voice and when he actually hears it his excitement knows no bounds. Because a deaf child receives instruction through a mechanical aid it does not necessarily follow that he can ever use a set of his own. His residual hearing may be so little and of such poor quality that hearing aids serve only for inter-

mediate instruction with trained teachers. However, he does enlarge his vocabulary and may acquire the meaning of inflection, emphasis and tone in the spoken word. Mrs. Loretta Melton, articular instructor in the advanced classes says, "We develop habits of speech by hearing the same sounds spoken by others again and again, in imitating these sounds, and by hearing our own voices. "A group hearing aid which can be adjusted to each child's need and which can be used consistently can clear up distorted and fading sounds, thus helping prevent further loss of speech and memory of sounds. It is only natural to forget sounds which are not heard. In a school like this one there are many kinds and degrees of deafness. Some children have never heard at all, some hear sounds but not speech, some are only hard of hearing, and their residual hearing is of a true quality, while others may hear as much but all sounds are distorted. Each child presents a different problem in reconstructing his ears so that he may recognize sounds in a way that they mean something to him. "Reading commonly called lip reading, must remain a most es-

ential part of the education of a deaf or hard of hearing child. After a child learns to read speech from the lips it is much easier for him to recognize these same words when written or spoken. He first learns how his own name sounds over the hearing aid while he reads it from the lips of the teacher. Later he comes to recognize his name with the teacher's lips covered, as the speech through the hearing aid is amplified. This simple step may take many weeks. From this beginning—the eye-to-eye sentences, expressions in every day use and combinations of words which the child is most likely to hear around home. Mrs. Melton says, "We try through the hearing aid to improve the tone and range of each child's voice. He has learned early which resonance chamber furnishes the various qualities of speech and so through the mechanical aid he may give his voice depth, tone and pitch so essential for perfect speech. Another great benefit these children receive from the hearing aid is a sense of the rhythm and smoothness of speech, so often lacking in deaf children. This is done through music and singing records. Even children with practically no hearing gain an idea of tempo and the melody of speech. Many of these pupils never will be able to make use of a hearing aid in every day life, but every child is given every opportunity to hear and understand. It is a mistake to think that hearing aids may be placed on anyone and immediately the child stands speechless in school—especially in class. First of all the child must be taught to hear. Hearing aids should be fitted as carefully as are eye glasses. They vary the type and degree of hearing loss must be understood because much damage can be done by a misfit. The word "deaf" comes from a Latin word meaning "mugger".

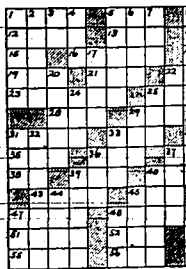

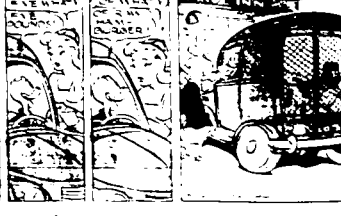

The year of 1949 will be remembered for several of Jackrabbits driven as well as the year of the "red" hunters and automobiles too, the Jackrabbits population continues to grow—and about every so often drives are made to reduce the number of posts.

Back in 1900, so oldtimers say, the Jackrabbits were so thick in the city of TWIN FALLS that a drive was conducted right through town.

Ever stop to think what the Jackrabbits might have seen in Idaho Valley on say 80 years ago? That was when the first stage line was run from Kelton through Hole to Walla Walla. Before then there was a stage line from Salt Lake City to The Dalles.

The Kelton stage passed through the City of Rocks, where a station was established. Other important stations were Oakley Meadows, Dry Creek, Rock Creek, Glenn Ferry, one near Beantonia Home and Beas. The Rock Creek station still stands.

Some of the substations where fresh horses were hitched up, were

Goose Creek, Desert, Eastport, Richmond, Home Springs, Pinedale, Clear Creek, Cold Springs, Creek, Main Street and Cedar Creek.

The stage drivers drove from 6 a.m. until 8 p.m., and the trip from Kelton to Boise—about 280 miles— took three days and three nights. The night drivers took over at 8 p.m. and ended their shift 13 hours later. At night, lanterns burning large tallow candles, furnished feeble light.

When roads were good and the load was light, four horses could pull the stagecoach, but in muddy weather and with heavy loads the drivers had to handle six and sometimes eight horses.

It's no wonder these drivers were considered the heroes of the day. The town of CAREY was named for a stage driver who later became a superintendent of the stage line. That pioneer of the Tri-City area, was back in 1879.

At a CAREY meeting this week, it was learned that almost everyone there has lived at or near BURELY at some time. Among them were CHIEF Orchard, Mrs. Edna Haskard, Mrs. Floyd Redolph, C. R. Hickley, Mrs. C. O. Thomsen, Harold T. Lewis and others.


