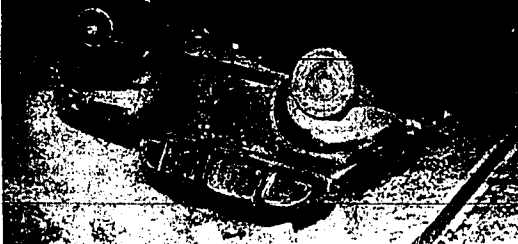

Holiday Feast Costs Decline, Survey Finds

Pop can sit down and enjoy his Thanksgiving day feast this year with the knowledge that it's costing him considerably less than in recent years. A United Press survey showed today that the cost of a Thanksgiving day dinner for four, including a 10-pound turkey, will be almost \$1.50 cheaper than last year. Prices in 20 large cities were checked against last year's prices in the survey.

Cost \$3.37 for 1934. Such a meal last year cost about \$4.87, the survey showed. The turkey, which is still the most expensive item for any having to shell out for this year's feast, will be almost 20 per cent cheaper than last year's. In the survey, prices were checked for this year against 1934 on ingredients for a menu consisting of a 10-pound turkey, two pounds of sweet potatoes, a can of cranberries, two bunches of celery, a can of snap peas, a loaf of white bread, a pound of assorted nuts, a pound of cake grapes and a can of pumpkin pie. 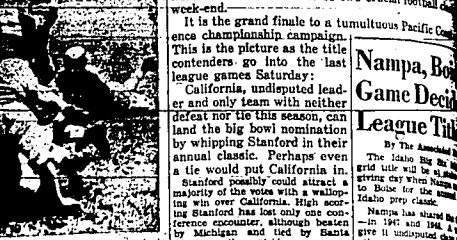

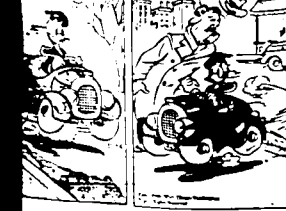
