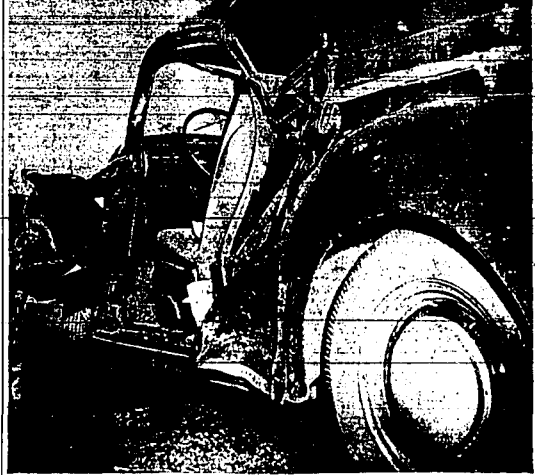

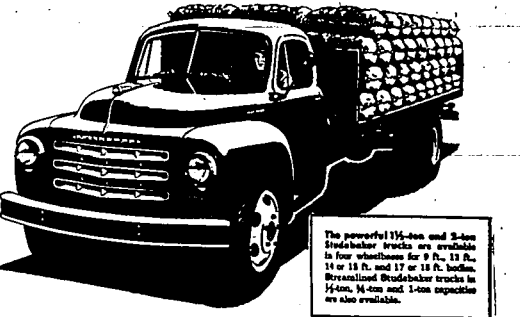

People Relax Reins of Rule, Parley Hears

SPOKANE, Wash., Nov. 15 (AP)—The governor of New Hampshire believes the people of the nation must accept the job of governing themselves.

Gov. Sherman Adams said last night at the Pacific Northwest Trade association conference here that he is little concerned with the feeling of responsibility.

Introduced to the trade conference by Gov. Arthur B. Langley of Washington, Adams said he emphasized his points with dull anecdotes of the nation's "wastefulness."

The drift in this country seems to be in the direction of government's trying to assume too many responsibilities of the individual.

Sherman Adams said that he knows what they want and will do it. He is thinking about what they ought to do.

He cautioned public servants in Idaho for who he termed "the popular noise." Often it will be noise of the people's ignorance, he said, and again the noise of "righteous rage."

Illness is Worrying

"Only when people are glad or mad and make no sound about it and they react to worry," the governor declared.

The speaker was critical of what he called the "free way philosophy." He said there is a growing trend toward the people's confidence in the government as a benefactor.

"What the people ought to want is not a government that has earned leisure," the governor added.

Gov. Sherman Adams referred to the "austerity budget" program under which his own state has cut its budget so that government costs can be reduced in the face of rising prices. It meant restriction in some services, but resulted in lowered taxes, too.

The New Hampshire executive declared you cannot have freedom in the United States until you have a free government, anyone that you can have a free government unless you have a free economy.

Crews Rescue 15 Trapped in Mine 8 Hours

MAKANOVA CITY, Pa., Nov. 15 (AP)—Rescuers brought out 15 weary miners early today who had spent eight hours trapped behind a rock fall 800 feet underground.

The trapped men, continuing to clear their capillaries to help rescue crews from the debris, were taken to the surface, cooled and dried which blocked their path to safety.

"I wasn't afraid they wouldn't reach us," one of the miners said as he rode to the surface. "I'm glad I'm out. We sure did a lot of digging for the night's work."

The 15 rescuers who examined each of the men as they came to the surface said that they suffered no ill effects. They were sent home to rest.

The men were trapped in the No. 3 slope of the Philadelphia and Reading coal and iron company's Maple Hill colliery when a runaway mine car jumped the tracks and derailed, toppling the heavy timbers supporting the sides and roof of the tunnel.

When the men started work, the crashing timbers and a warning rattle alerted the men, but the sides and roof of the tunnel collapsed with a roar before they could flee.

Fortunately, however, the debris was not packed tightly enough to block off ventilation and the trapped men had sufficient air. They tapped mine car rails to call attention to their plight and then set in on permanent telephone line to communicate with rescue crews.

The rock fall occurred only two hours after the men started work, and they were rescued by the rescue party early today.

New Drug Is Called Aid in Easing Ulcers

By HOWARD W. BLANKSLEY, AP Science Editor

CINCINNATI, Nov. 15 (AP)—A new, synthetic, nerve-soothing drug, banthine, is helping ease peptic ulcers. The results were exhibited for the first time at the Southern Medical Association.

This way of controlling stomach action is something new in the long search for ulcer remedies. The drug substitutes for the action of a surgeon's knife on the stomach's control nerve.

In 20 cases it apparently healed, however, ulcers were perforating—that is eating holes, but X-rays show that these too healed.

Pain Is Relieved

Eighteen patients were suffering severe ulcer pain. In all cases pain stopped a few minutes after the drug was given. It is taken by mouth every few hours.

The exhibit is from Duke university and the work was supported by a grant from the U. S. public health service.

Banthine is one of a score of new drugs in use at Duke for effects in blocking the nerves that control high blood pressure and stomach action. But it is not a blood pressure remedy.

Case Not Known

The cause of ulcers is not known. Doctors agree that contributing conditions are excess stomach acids, rapid stomach movements and probably overactive nerves.

But it is not a blood pressure remedy. In most Duke cases acid also dropped. But in a few, the acid rose after banthine. Yet these ulcers got well too.

Increase Noted in County Sale Of Auto Plates

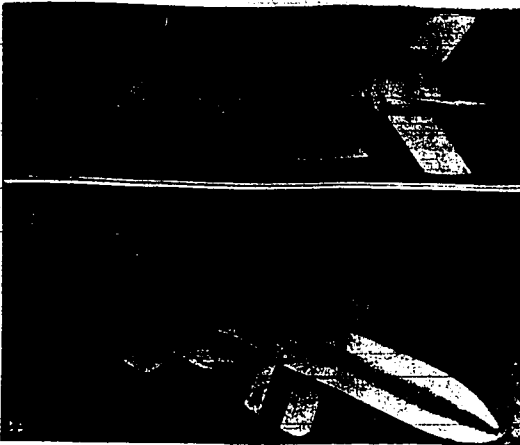

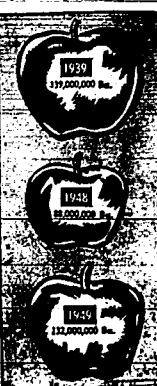
