Taft Declares Truman Plan Is too Costly

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18 (AP)—Senator Taft, R., O., thinks adoption of President Truman's program to increase the federal deficit to \$100,000,000 to lead America to "a new security."

Taft attacked the entire Truman program in a statement from the chair of the Senate Republican policy committee, which in his home district has been his campaign for reelection in 1940.

"World Aid, Not Cost" "We face a deficit of \$250,000,000. To increase it to \$100,000,000 more would add \$60,000,000,000 to our national debt for the loss of all kinds."

His references were to the system of compulsory health insurance frequently advocated by the President, to the "production payment" plan to increase up farm income sponsored by secretary of Agriculture Bryan, and to a long-pending plan for universal military training—"UIT."

"That is the program in the 'how can we increase our federal tax 50 per cent without choking the life out of the country' plan," he said, and crating was unemployment.

President Truman, Taft continued, argues that anybody who objects to the expense of any of his plans is a reactionary.

Disputing this, Taft said he speaks of a conviction that only a continuation of the present program of liberty and particularly liberty from the control of the federal government is the goal of the United States which he describes.

Group Named To Seek Mine Tax Revision

SALT LAKE CITY, Nov. 18 (AP)—Bills to reduce the federal tax on the industry of the west were taken at a meeting of western small mine operators here.

A committee to seek immediate legislation to reduce the tax on the industry was called for by the mine operators from Utah, Idaho and Montana who attended.

Committee members include James K. Hoyle, managing partner at J. A. Hoyle company, Salt Lake City; Fred W. Smith, Salt Lake City; and R. W. New, Idaho representative. W. R. Smith, Nevada representative.

Operators were urged to nominate permanent members for the committee to study the bills and draw up a proposed modification of the mining industry.

Hoyle in an address to the group, said that the industry is being opposed under the "low deal" because of the loss of the western mining industry.

Little Progress Made in Talks on Farragut Station

BOISE, Nov. 18 (AP)—Little progress was made in a discussion of the disposition of Farragut naval reservation here today.

Alvin H. Bauding said that the committee of the board of directors, headed by John B. Bauding, head of the service administration, defended the service policy of "no change" which is set on Lake Park Orville to provide land owners.

Anti-Monopoly Rule on Labor Asked of U. S.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 16 (AP)—Labor monopolies as well as business monopolies should be subject to anti-trust laws, the National Association of Manufacturers contend.

Following N.A.M. managing director, told House Judiciary investigating committee in a prepared statement that industry-wide bargaining—extended through international unions—represents a monopolistic practice in restraint of trade.

Bigman Not Monopoly

At the same time, he argued before a House Judiciary subcommittee that bigness alone—in either business or labor—is not synonymous with monopoly.

The size of business, he said, is the controlling factor in competition. Customer buying habits and demands, he declared, determine the size of business enterprises.

Destroys Competition

Arbitrary attempts by government to impose the anti-trust laws would deny American purchasers their free buying choice. Bigging, he said, would destroy both competition and the free enterprise system of trade.

"Labor monopoly is no more catch-all," he said also. "It is an all-or-none thing. The National Industrial Conference Board, an organization which is designed to deal with monopoly cannot possibly overlook its vital and major a factor in the nation's economy."

U. S. Plans for Fish Hatchery Program Told

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10.—The fish and wild life service announces plans today for a hatchery expansion program to increase considerably the nation's production of fresh water fish.

The agency said it has \$2,000,000 in its budget for the current fiscal year, plus \$700,000 to be spent within the next two years for the program.

To Build Hatcheries
This money, it said, will provide for continued operation of almost 120 hatcheries plus construction of four new ones, completion or near completion of 13 now under construction, and the modernization and expansion of 70 others.

Hatchery Expert A. V. Thunson told a reporter, the agency is unable to estimate the increase in fish production that may result from the construction program.

Funds Detailed
The appropriations for continuing hatchery construction programs in the year ending June 30 include: Leadville, Colo., \$80,000 and Hagerman, Ida., \$48,000.

The following amounts will be spent for repairs and modernization of hatcheries and to improve additional rearing facilities: Spokane, Wash., \$101,500; Ennis, Mont., \$29,500 and Bozeman, Mont., \$21,400.

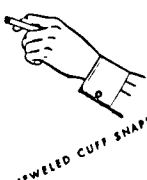
