Kidnaper's Auto Is Being Followed on Little-Used Routes

(From Staff Correspondent, AP and UP Reports) BURLEY, Nov. 17.—Her head deeply gashed by a sharp instrument, the mutilated body of a Burley girl, blond, 7-year-old Glenda Joyce Brisbois, was pulled from a canal southeast of here some 15 hours after she was reported kidnaped.

Police Chief W. W. Williams announced the body was found at 11:05 a.m. and Sheriff Earl H. Clark indicated the child had been murdered. The body was taken to the McCulloch funeral home for examination by Coroner Vern McCulloch.

Meanwhile, Dr. J. Woodson Creed, Twin Falls pathologist and coroner, joined local authorities in making a preliminary investigation at the site of discovery, and sheriff's officers announced two planes were alternating in following a car which may carry the girl's abductor.

Although he refused immediate comment on the condition of the body, Sheriff's spokesman said the girl's condition was "serious." One set reportedly crossed the body of the girl's body was slung down the middle of her head, she was found fully clothed.

It appeared that the body had been thrown into the canal by someone who was not a member of the family. Officers said there were indications that it had been thrown from the north bank side along to the south bank, some 15 feet. A few people were seen on the north bank of the canal.

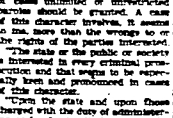

### Farm Housing Program-Data Is Announced

JEROME, Nov. 11.—The farm housing program, authorized by a recent act of congress, has been launched at Jerome and Twin Falls counties. Applications for loans to build or repair farm houses and other farm buildings are being received at the farmers home administration county office at Jerome and on Thursdays at the ACA office in Twin Falls, according to Linus W. Sanberg, FHA county supervisor.

Loans may run for a maximum of 25 years, at four per cent interest, and can be made to farm owners who cannot obtain farm housing loans from their banks or other sources, Sanberg said. Owners who qualify also can get loans for improving housing for their tenants. All loans are subject to approval by the local three-member FHA county committee.

The housing act provided for a four-year period of loan making. The appropriation for the current year is \$7,000,000 for the entire country, which will mean about five loans per agricultural county at an estimated average of \$2,500 per loan. The authorized congressional appropriation for the four years is \$27,000,000. Veterans will receive preference.

Sanberg predicted that most loans will go to farmers with farm acreage and other income enough to repay the loan plus interest without further help from the government. He expects most loans will be for repairs and remodeling rather than for new construction. Loans may also be made to eliminate hazards to a family's health and safety. With borrowers needing this type of assistance, it will be possible to include up to \$500 of the \$1,000 total in the form of a grant.

H. Barnes represents Stevens and Leonard H. Jacob and Graydon W. Smith are counsel for Peters.

A jury trial for Richard Hamman, 28, posts a charge with driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of intoxicants, is scheduled for 10 a. m. Nov. 11, in police court.

Hamman, who is represented by H. Barnes and Rayburn, has posted \$800 bond. He was arrested 11:10 a. m. Nov. 8, in the 500 block of Second avenue west and pleaded not guilty to the charge when arraigned the next morning.

# USDA Moves To "Sidestep" Brannan Plan

WASHINGTON, Nov. 17—The Brannan administration has taken steps to sidestep officials of the agriculture department from becoming involved in a political controversy over the treatment of production and marketing administration officials from the various states will hold an annual meeting in Memphis Dec. 4-9 to discuss the future of the production, prices and marketing. Instructions have been issued that the meeting is not to discuss political or agricultural policies.

The ban on resolutions has been ordered, department officials said. Several complaints which have been filed over a stand taken by the FMA state officials at a St. Louis meeting advocating a continuance of wartime price supports.

Several farm leaders and organizations are criticizing the powerful American Farm Bureau federation and the FMA officials of overstepping their proper field and engaging in a political controversy over price supports.

The charges were denied by department officials. They explained the FMA officials merely sought to pass on to their superiors in Washington their views on what they thought price supports should be.

The Brannan plan—with its promise of high returns to farmers and cheap food to consumers—looks as a major issue in next year's congressional campaign. Therefore the administration does not intend to discuss officials of overstepping government agencies to promote the Brannan plan or any other controversial issue.

Department officials said, however, the Memphis meeting will permit the state FMA officials to express themselves in open discussion of farm policies over the Brannan plan. But the meeting in itself will not go on record one way or another regarding it or other farm plans.
