### Demo Senator Bolsters Calls On Cost Trim

WASHINGTON, Nov. 13.—Sen. Charles McNary, R., Ore., today called for a \$4,400,000,000 reduction in the federal budget for 1937 without a tax increase.

With such a savings, he said, it would be possible to pay off the \$100,000,000,000 of national debt during the 1937 fiscal year and to reduce the deficit to a minimum.

McNary's proposal is the first of a series of proposals he has introduced in the Senate to reduce the federal budget.

The administration has indicated a \$2,000,000,000 deficit for the current fiscal year. McNary said he hopes to bring his proposal to a vote in the Senate.

The Illinois freshman is chairman of a house-entire economic committee which has reported a bill which would reduce the federal budget by \$4,400,000,000.

Officials of the Federal Reserve bank in Chicago said that the reduction in the federal budget would be a boon to the economy.

McNary said that he would like to see the budget reduced to \$10,000,000,000.

He said that the country needs a budget which is balanced and that the budget should be reduced to a level which will allow the government to pay off its debt.

### Reich, France Accord Spurs Europe's Rise

One of the greatest booms for peace and rehabilitation of Europe would be a solution of the bitter enmity between Germany and France—and from important quarters comes guarded word that there is hope that breach may be healed. British Foreign Secretary Bevin told an audience in London the other night that the big three foreign ministers (America, Britain and France) dealt with "probably one of the bitterest problems of all—the integration of Germany into western civilization." And then: "Delicate Matter" "I am sorry I cannot say anything about these discussions here. It is a very delicate matter to handle."

"We can only hope that the results of these discussions will be the beginning of the ending of the age-long feud between the French and Germans."

The unexpected statement by one of the world's leading statesmen was preceded by other equally surprising pronouncements from the hostess camps themselves. Going back to the very beginning of this month we find French Foreign Minister Schuman trying to convince his people that they would avoid trouble with the Germans if for the two countries to become good neighbors instead of suspicious rivals. "Idea Correspondent" And a few days later Ludwig Erhart, economic minister for the new West German republic, predicted in Paris that the future of European cooperation will depend on Franco-German cooperation. He said it should be easier now to bring the two countries together because

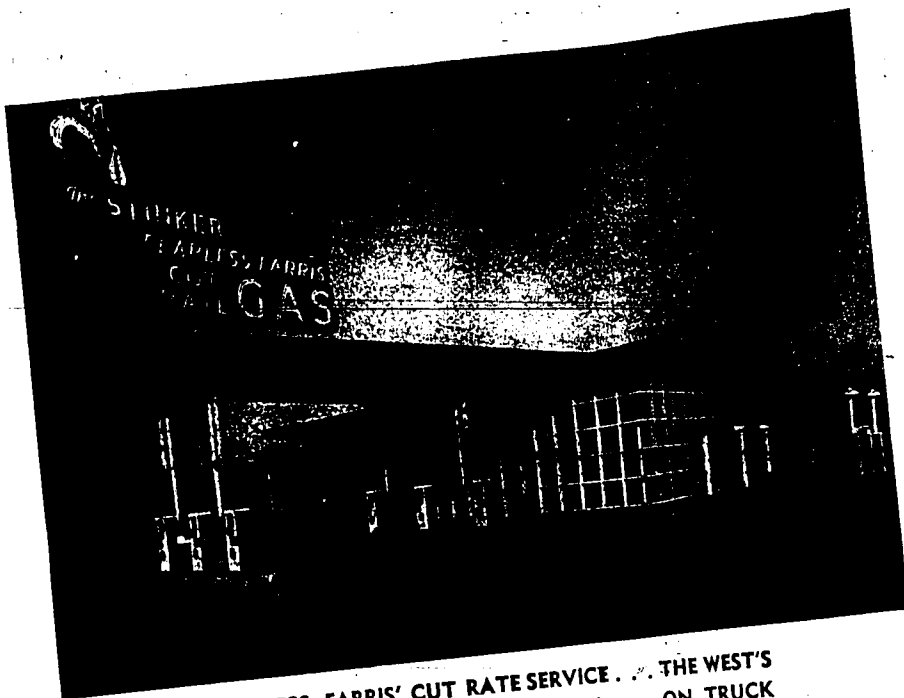
