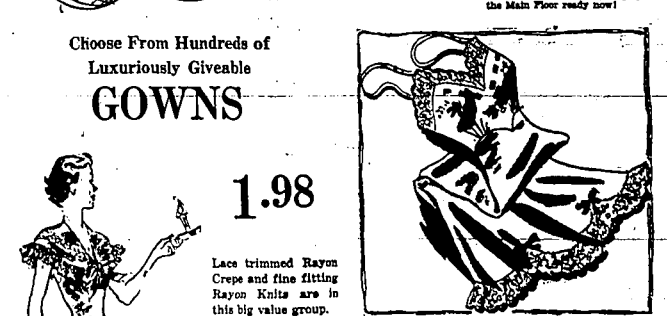

Idaho Youths To Be Subject Of State Study

BOISE, Nov. 21 (AP)—The welfare of Idaho youth will be the subject of a study by the state health department. The purpose of the study is to prepare reports for the mid-winter White House conference on children and youth to be held Dec. 2, 1939, at Washington.

Dr. Madeline Donnelly, director of the state health department, today issued a statement in which she said a committee will be chosen later who will turn state committee. The state and county committees will have jurisdiction of the local studies.

She said the theme of the 1939 conference is "youth in the community." The conference has been held every two years since 1917, when instituted by President Theodore Roosevelt.

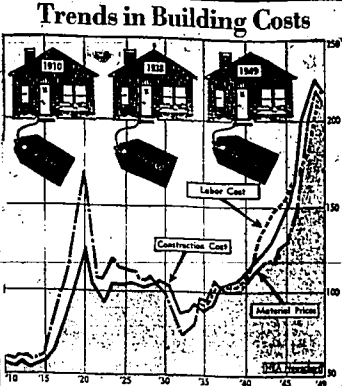

Washington State Bonus Law to Be Effective Monday

OLYMPIA, Wash., Nov. 22 (AP) — Washington State's \$80,000,000 soldier's bonus law will go into effect Monday.

The law, which allows prices of popular brand cigarettes to rise a pack from an average of 20 cents to 22 cents.

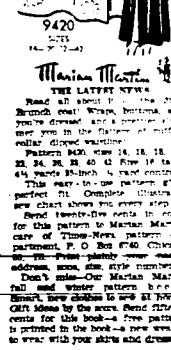

Uncle Sam Is Preparing for Census Count

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28.—(AP)—Uncle Sam is getting ready to ring the doorbell.

Armed with questions, pencils and pads, the census takers will start on April 1 to make the every-10-years count of population, housing and other vital statistics.

The enumerators will count about 150,000,000 people and gather 3,000,000,000 facts. The most counting will take three weeks in the cities, twice as long in rural sections and still two years to tabulate all the results.

Women Outnumber Men

The census-takers will find the nation has nearly 20,000,000 more people than 10 years ago. For the first time in history women outnumber men.

But the census takers will learn that Americans steadily are getting better educated. But many people think the federal government is checking up on their "records" under the "war act."

The census will show the nation has just completed its "military census" under the "war act," which has changed records since 1940.

Beria, Man Who May Succeed Stalin, Leads New Purge of Russian Officials

By LEON DIORON — A new wave of top party officials is reported to be moving from the Kremlin under the personal supervision of Joseph Stalin. The purge is being directed by the powerful MVD and the latest leading candidate for Stalin's job.

The purges are being mainly directed by Beria, chief of the Andrei Zhdanov. Only vague reports have reached the West, but it is believed that the purges are aimed at the removal of officials from the Communist Party in Europe.

It is attributed to a new strategy which has been recently developed inside the Politburo.

Members of Stalin's immediate entourage have long been engaged in maneuvering for a place in anticipation of his death. The late Andrei Zhdanov has been regarded as a possible successor. But now Zhdanov is dead and Molotov is apparently in eclipse. The new leading actors in this unfolding drama are Beria and Georgi M. Malenkov, one of the younger and more able members of the Politburo.

Senator Says Atomic Attack Chance Small

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28 (AP)—What are the chances of a surprise atomic bomb attack upon the United States?

Sen. John H. Tamm, Republican of Missouri, said today it is "improbable." "I think the odds are about 1,000 to 1 against any such surprise attack," he said.

Sen. Tamm's statement was made at the time he was asked to read the text of a resolution which passed today in the Senate.

By a combination of scientific planning which he had learned as a member of the Committee on the most ruthless disregard for human life, he kept the overt war industries working overtime by firing squads working the Communists and the army of the communist dictatorship.

Of all the members of the Politburo, Beria alone was recently singled out by Stalin for special honors. He was awarded the coveted Lenin order for outstanding services to the party and Soviet people.

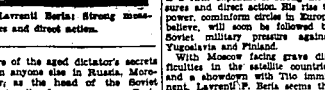
Like Malenkov, who ostensibly represents a "moderate" wing of the Politburo, Beria is believed to be in the "capitalist democratic" Beria camp.

It is his boss and hero, Stalin, Beria never forgets or forgives. Early in his career he was arrested by the anti-Bolshevik Mensheviks, who was then in control of his native Georgia. Since then Beria has been a bitter foe of all Mensheviks and even former Mensheviks, including the present foreign minister, Andrei Vainovski.

He runs a vast espionage ring in the countries outside the iron curtain. He commands all of Russia's numerous secret labor camps, which supply most of the manpower for Soviet industry. He is in charge of security in the satellite states.

Many charts and some of the top ministers—Jose Gacek to Hungary, Anna Pauker and Bodnarz to Rumania, Rudolf Slansky in Czechoslovakia and Walter Ulbricht, vice premier of the recently-created satellite German republic—are actually Soviet citizens and long-time agents of the MVD and MOB (Soviet military of state security), responsible directly to Beria.

Beria has mild manners and even mild appearance. He usually wears a pince-nez which makes him look like a per-revolutionary dandy student. However, he is a firm believer in terror. After his fall to power in June 1947, correspondents at once noted an increase in Soviet arrests, kidnaping of diplomats and other typical methods of "ideological persuasion."

Yugoslavia Reveals Full View of Stark Power, Childs Finds

By MARQUIN CHILDS

Belgrade, Yugoslavia.—This country, isolated as it is between east and west, affords what may well be the most revealing study of power and and its uses in the present day world. Above all, it is the clash of ideologies that is so strikingly apparent here.

By Marshall Tito has not set out immediately and with ruthless determination after the war to consolidate his hold on Yugoslavia, he could never have defied the might of the Soviet Union. That is a fact that is scarcely comprehended in the west. It is at the first impression to understand what is happening in the Balkans.

The events leading up to the break between Tito and Stalin clearly show the politics of communism in the Balkan region. It is a something of the quality of the politics of the Balkans that is so strikingly apparent here.

The ultimate aim of the strategy employed by Russia must have been obvious to Tito fairly early in the game. Tito's aim was to so weaken the position in the country that he would be a rascal of the USSR. If he balked, then he could be removed and destroyed.

Pressure from Moscow before the break, for example, was to play down the role of Yugoslavia's participation in liberating the country and to put greater emphasis on the contribution of the red army. Likewise, Tito was a subordinate to Stalin.

But Tito was already enmeshed. First, by the British and then by his leadership in the war and, second, by ceaseless propaganda following the war. Tito knew the precise value of that hero worship just as well as did the members of the politburo in the Kremlin.

There also was pressure from

secure at home, he believes, or frequently says he believes, that his enemy in Moscow will not crush him in open warfare.

With this latter view most Balkan experts—and they grow on every bush—are in agreement. It should be added, however, that there is a small but significant dissent.

Since force is the sole determinant, why is Soviet Russia withdrawing the satellite states where the Russian grip is already sure? Are these merely maneuvers—the popular explanation—or does there lie something more in the background?

The dissenters believe that the Russian move—installing Marshal Tito in command of Yugoslavia's army and sea and air forces—appears far more than mere preventive measure. They point to what is happening in Bulgaria where

virtually every key official has been replaced by a Russian since the fall of Moscow.

In the minority view all this is being done in preparation for the use of armed might to bring Tito down. In the face of rebuff and defeat, the failure of force by intervention, the masters of the Kremlin must inevitably cross the definite heretofore direct means. Force feeds on force and there can be no compromise.

Winter is setting in and the familiar wind blows down the Danube, bringing a bone-deep cold straight from the steppes of Russia. Already there is snow in the mountain passes. But the spring may bring something other than the usual not-peace-not-war that now prevails.

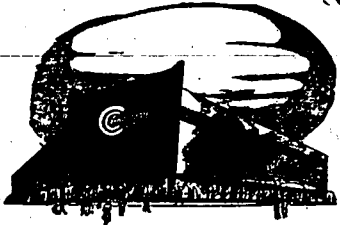
