# Officials Fail to Get Support of Rules Committee

NEW YORK, Nov. 22 (AP)—Football officials are getting proper support from the national rules committee. W. G. Crowley, a top-ranking official for many years from New York football writers Monday, Crowley, said that most of the troubles encountered by the officials stem from the fact that the rules committee is headed by a man "who never played a game of football in his life and who knows absolutely nothing about football."

### Wider Use of Fertilizer on Farms Urged

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 20 (UP)—A farm research scientist told a cooperative merchandising organization today that fertilizers should be made cheap enough to assure their ample use.

Dr. George D. Scarsh, Lafayette, Ind., director of research for the American Fertilizer Association, said today that a serious soil decline faced the midwest and far western farm-lands. Fertilizing, he said, is called "nitrogen practice" has resulted in nitrogen, phosphorus and potash being drawn from midwest soils in feeds and forages faster than these minerals were being replaced. He said this would be done in an area in the heaviest fertilizer users in the nation. Stimulus declines are ahead for the far west agricultural area, he said. Dr. Scarsh said crop surpluses are "backbiting" the true status of a serious soil decline in factors that can't be revised quickly. He said these factors were loss of organic material and poorer root systems. Fertilizer losses are even greater, he added, and forecast trouble earlier than the nation's farmers realize. He said a hungry area of the world, with the new weapons of the scientific age now available, as potential "gangster nations" coveting our material plants. The scientist addressed delegates to the Pacific Supply Cooperative convention representing local co-op units in the Pacific Northwest.

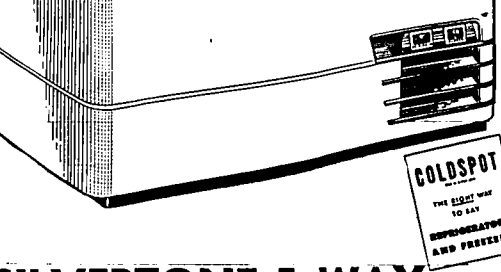
