All electric service to Twin Falls, Buhl, Piler, Caldwell and Cliver was cut off at 10:45 a. m. Thursday when a curious cat jumped among the feeder buses of the Idaho Power substation on Piler avenue.

The cat's body formed a connection between the bus which feeds the Twin Falls industrial center and the bus which feeds the northern rural Twin Falls area. The resulting 12,000-watt arc fatally damaged the cat, badly damaged the northwest rural feeder bus, and did minor damage to the other buses.

"There's only one space of less than two feet in the whole substation where a short could cut out service to such a large area," Elmer Blasco, sub-station foreman, said.

"The cat found it," Blasco said. "The cat was returned to most of the area in less than ten minutes by the quick action of Jim Huggins and Jack Gilpatrick, line-men."

All day Thursday the Piler area continued to supply power to the rural district. The damaged rural line will get their power through the main bus at Piler with the help of Jim Huggins and Jack Gilpatrick, line-men.
