### ICC Hearing On 'Gateway' Appeal Is Set

**SALT LAKE CITY, Dec. 10 (AP)—**Two western railroads take before an interstate commerce commission examiner next week an argument over freight rates that may have nationwide effects.

It involves the so-called Ogden gateway, connecting points on the Union Pacific Railroad and the Denver and Rio Grande Western railroad.

Observers say the outcome of the case will be watched with interest by railroads affected by similar "gateway" routes throughout the country.

The Denver and Rio Grande Western railroad brought the action. It asked the interstate commerce commission to order the Union Pacific railroad to remove premium charges on freight shipments exchanged between the two railroads in Ogden, 35 miles north of Salt Lake City.

ICC Examiner Frank E. Miller will preside at the hearing, beginning Monday. The D&RGW said about 10 days would be required to present its case. The Union Pacific then will be permitted to present its own testimony intended to refute the D&RGW statements.

The Union Pacific asserts that the use of "road" gateways is an "established pattern" in railroad rate-making. It contends the Denver and Rio Grande is attempting to "invade" territory which has been built up by the Union Pacific.

The Denver and Rio Grande argues that the "road gateway" discriminates against shippers and receivers of freight within the exclusive Union Pacific territory, depriving them of the customary privilege of routing for themselves which routing would best serve their needs.

The Union Pacific contends that the Rio Grande proposal would result in "unnecessary and wasteful use of transportation facilities and the only beneficiary of the proposal would be the Rio Grande itself."

Both railroads have been active in lining up support. The D&RGW said it would present witnesses representing shippers in Utah, Idaho, Montana, Oregon and Washington. Many farm, shipping and civic groups have taken stands on the issue, expressing their attitudes in resolutions.

Representing the D&RGW will be attorneys Robert E. Quinn of Washoe, D. C. and Otis J. Gibson of Denver.

The Union Pacific's legal staff will be headed by Elmer B. Collins of Omaha, assistant general western counsel for the railroad.

### Santa Arrives Two Weeks Early to See 'Good Boy' Dying of Cancer in Chest

TARENTUM, Pa., Dec. 10 (AP)—Little Jimmy Pochon raised his blood head in a black grin as the photographer prepared to take his picture.

"I've been a good boy, so Santa is going to see me before the other boys and girls," he piped.

Santa is going to visit Jimmy early—tomorrow, in fact. And Jimmy has been a good boy. But there's something else the puzzled 8-year-old doesn't know.

Doctors say he'll be dead by the time Santa visits other boys and girls.

Jimmy was a normal child up to three months ago. Then he became strangely ill. Finally, the doctors made their diagnosis—cancer.

The infection is in his chest and medical experts in nearby Pittsburgh say it is of the most violent type. Three weeks ago Jimmy was taken to the hospital. Last night his parents brought him home to die.

"There must be something, or someone someone who can save our boy," said George Pochon, the lad's father. "The Lord look out for some children from us. I just know he won't take Jimmy, too."

The two other children died in childbirth. Jimmy was born while Pochon

was overseas with an engineer battalion during the war. The father is employed as a steel erector at the American Window Glass plant in nearby Arnold.

Meanwhile, residents of some towns that cluster about Tarentum were busy with plans of their own.

The local Veterans of Foreign Wars post has helped in preparations for the Christmas party. And the Valley Daily News has offered to underwrite the expense of a trip to Chicago for treatment at the University of Illinois.

Members of the union to which Pochon belongs have also come to the assistance of little Jimmy.

Ted Bettendorfer, an official of the CIO Lead Flat Glass and Ceramic Workers local, has agreed to underwrite the expense of treatment at the university.

Jimmy's physician says the trip and the concentration of powerful rays from the university's beamatron might be too much for the wab lad.

### Out-of-Work Men In State Granted \$177,199 in Month

BOISE, Dec. 10.—A total of \$177,199 was paid Idahoans in unemployment benefits during November as compared to \$30,859 during that month in 1944.
