# Last Living Child of Burley's Founder Has Watched City's Entire Development

BURLEY, Dec. 13.—She's royalty so far as Burley is concerned, this elderly lady who Mrs. Grace Miller Huggins, daughter of Joseph Miller—founder and father-of-Burley. Her 78 years of life have seen every phase of Burley's history develop from the time she was occupied by an Indian camp to the present.

When Mrs. Huggins was 15, she married her 23rd year, Mr. Huggins, who was then 23. Mrs. Huggins recalled her 23rd year, not by taking things easy but by buying herself a horse. Her 18 years of life have seen small home here and taking care of John Lee, 91, whose daughter, Mrs. Archie McLean, lives nearby. Her outlook for the future is youthful and her sense of humor contagious.

As the last living child of Colonel Miller, Mrs. Huggins feels that she has seen a great deal of history since during her lifetime. Born Nov. 25, 1871, at Lincoln City, Neb., a daughter of Joseph and Mary Miller, she was the youngest of five children. Her father, Orace Isabel Miller Huggins' life was, from the beginning, one of adventure. At the age of seven, her family moved to a ranch in Idaho. The boys who lived for two years until grandfather, descending in clouds that darkened the sky, destroyed the ranch.

The family then went by wagon to Missouri, where they spent a winter, and then to Kansas, where they spent a year. At this time, Mrs. Huggins' father, who served during the Civil war, was ordered to travel the Old Oregon trail to the mouth of the Snake river. Mrs. Huggins, 8 years old, and her brother, Matthew Miller, Colonel Miller's son, were with him.

Incidents change the entire course of people's lives. Mrs. Huggins believes, and because of an untimely happening, Colonel Miller remained in Idaho, near the present town of Burley. The wagon train camped overnight where the Old Oregon trail crossed Goose creek, about seven miles south of Burley. The next morning Colonel Miller found that his five horses had disappeared. Believing Indians had taken the horses, Colonel Miller told the wagon train to travel on while he tried to find his horses. After the horses were found, he left his small son in camp. Colonel Miller walked east to look for his horses. He found his horses a mile downstream from the Oregon trail crossing. Miller found a meadow lush with grass for his horses, and nearby were settlers, a Bill Robinson family. Deciding to make his fortune in Idaho territory instead of Washington, where his brother, Matthew, finally located, Colonel Miller sent word back to his family in Kansas to meet him at Ketchikan, Utah.

After a covered wagon trip from Ketchikan, Mrs. Miller and her three children, Orace, Lillian Dell and Arthur Cole, saw their Idaho home which Colonel Miller and Robert had waiting for them. It was a one-room cave or "dug-out" with dirt steps leading to the entry, with windows. That was in 1878, and the Miller family spent their first winter in Idaho in their primitive cave.

Hordes of Indians named the prairie land, and one day, Mrs. Huggins recalls, they called at the cave. Mrs. Miller and her brother were certain the Indians hanging from the belt of the chief were the Indians. Colonel Miller, facing trouble if he went to the house, stayed in the field, always watching. The Indians were seldom trouble.

some if the menfolk did not interfere. After some time, they left, but later they had trouble at Rock creek, where a man was killed.

Mrs. Huggins remembers playing with Indian boys and girls, and recalls many of the Indians as friends. Each year, the Indians came camped at the mouth of Goose creek in a meadow where the city of Burley is now located. The wagon and children remained in camp.

After one year of living in the mountains up Rock creek for their winter supply of meat. Several miles up Goose creek from the Miller home, was a bridge across the water, and there was a stage station manned by a man named Burch. Goose creek was a swift-running river in those days.

After one year of living in the cave, Colonel Miller went to the hills and brought down logs from where he built a one-room house, with two windows. The house was located almost where the third irrigation lift is located now. People had no claim to the land then and were called "squatters."

While living in the log house, Mrs. Huggins recalls the first school on the flat conducted in the granary at the George Chapin ranch across the road from the Millers. Three families attended. By this time, the family had moved to a place called "Coolman's Bend," just opposite Unity. Here he built a house of wooden slabs with a narrow roof, which failed to keep out the rain. Later he built a frame house. He raised barley which he sold to the freighters for three cents a pound, using the money to start a herd of cattle.

The second school house on the flat, near Burley, was built of railroad ties two by two, or 16 feet

by 16 feet, with a window on each side. The Stairs, Pugham, Adams and Miller children were among those attending, and Rachel McGilchrist and Hattie Johnson were teachers. The school house was built near the present Punk ranch east of Burley. Getting the railroad ties was an interesting venture. The railroad being built from Pocatello to Oregon was as far as American Falls, but while building the bridge across the river, three thousands of ties were thrown into the river when a boom broke in the river when a river ran heavy with railroad ties. Mrs. Huggins remembers, and every settler took to his boat to rescue them. Railroad ties fences were the rage.

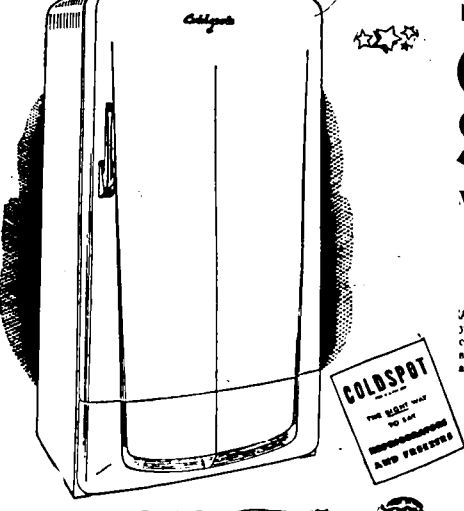

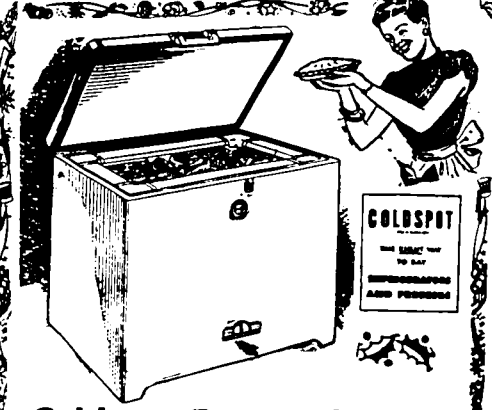

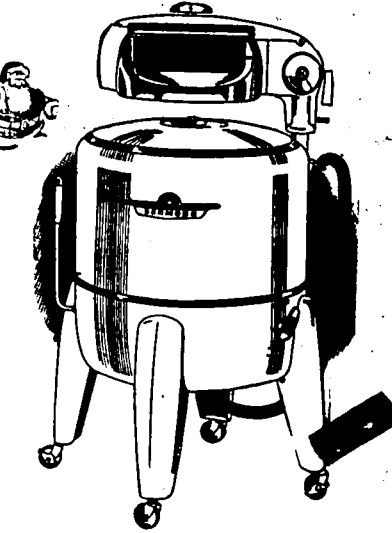

**Idaho's Stores Hold Plenty of "Yule Spirits"**

BOISE, Dec. 12.—There is an ample supply of "Christmas cheer" on the shelves of state liquor stores this season, Betty Harper, superintendent of the state liquor dispensary, said today as over-the-counter sales began to show a traditional holiday increase.

Harper added that prices generally are down in comparison with a year ago.

While the state has been buying ahead in order to assure the public a good supply of choice Scotch and bourbon as well as other varieties of hard liquor, Harper said his department has been given full credit on all wholesale price declines.

Valiums Orlas

The department's bottle volume shows an increase of 23 per cent to date this year over last, but money volume is down 18 per cent in comparison because of price reductions.

Harper said, however, the department will still be able to turn over to the state and counties the \$2,000,000 which was returned in 1941. Half of the total amount goes to the state and the remainder to the counties with school districts sharing 50 per cent of the state total and cities sharing 50 per cent of the amount turned over to counties.

Gross \$11,000,000

The state grossed \$11,000,000 on its liquor business in 1942, and Harper said the 1943 total will be about the same.

There are 115 retail liquor outlets in the state, at least one in each of the state's 44 counties. The department has a total of 188 employees.
