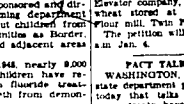

The former secretary of agriculture told delegates to the American Farm Bureau Federation's convention that for some time past he has been warning "who it is that is trying to speak for farmers, and who it is who should speak for farmers."

Ignorance Brackets

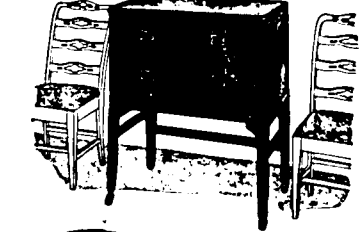

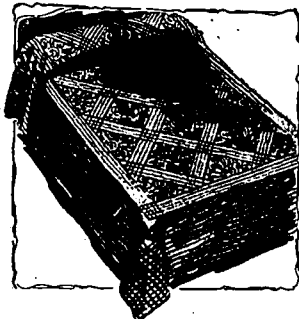

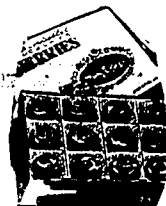

### Gotham Water Supply Raises Ancient Tales

Editor's note: The story of an article which appeared in the Times-News last week about the water supply of New York City is a report on some of the ancient tales of the city.

**BAHGEDAD, Iraq, Dec. 15 (AP)—**The ghosts of cities killed by thirst in the parched desert of southern Iraq must be watching New York. There in the undulating dunes is a pathetic group of trenches and mounds and time-beaten towers that are the sole remains of Kish, sacred city of the little break in the blistering desert that marks mighty Ur of the Chaldeans.

There is the abandoned platform of sun-baked brick covering eight acres on which the city of Nippur raised a vast temple to the god who forsake it in its hour of need.

Almost all left of the city is the name of its king, Arich, in the Bible, and clay tablets record that Nebuchadnezzar either built or restored a segment, or sacred artificial mountain.

On the nearby river Euphrates traveled the barges bearing food and spices, gold and wine.

To be a citizen of Eridu or Nippur or Larsa was in its time as distinctive as saying "I am from New York."

Then one day to Eridu came the terrifying news that life-giving waters of the Euphrates were draining away. The river was changing its course.

Achsoolodit may this must have happened just before 2200 B. C. The residents dug frantically for wells, tried to run canals to the river, steadily but in vain.

But finally Eridu surrendered, and its people gave up their city and followed the river valley area.

Nippur and Larsa were inhabited for longer periods, but eventually their residents too had to leave the dwellings and temples and palaces and make new homes in the river valley area.

### Experts Find No Basis for Polio 'Fears'

**PALO ALTO, Calif., Dec. 15 (AP)—**There is apparently no way of telling when, where or why infantile paralysis will strike, but many of the common fears in connection with the disease are groundless.

These were the major conclusions arrived at by scientists after a study of the severe outbreak of polio in San Diego, which cost over 40 lives. The finds of the group were presented today in the Stanford Medical Bulletin.

**"Stop Worrying"**  
Stop worrying, the bulletin said in effect, over hot weather, swimming, trips, over-exertion, or infection from others. None of these things seems to play an important role in the San Diego epidemic.

Don't worry about newspapers either, the authorities said. While communities with the largest population increase had the highest proportion of cases, longtime residents were attacked far more frequently than the new residents.

**Findings Related**  
The experts found that the group from 3 to 15 suffered loss severely than others. The disease is more likely to be fatal to males, but women contract it more frequently than men.

The report was made after a study of the epidemic by Drs. Frank J. Buzon, William G. Chagnell and Alex M. Losen. Doctors Buzon and Losen are members of the San Diego health department.

The census officials still are puzzling over this one. "There is also a mistake about me being born according to my statement of December 26. I was born and that is all I know about it, as my mother was away and I can't give you any more information."

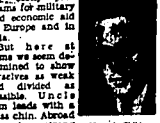
### Army Has Holiday Present for Men

### Powerful Uncle Sam Presents Paradox of "Virile Weakness"

By MARQUEZ CHILDS  
WASHINGTON—Leader from strength is the only sound tactic, whether in cards or in the cold war that is dividing the world.



But here at home we seem determined to show ourselves as weak and divided as possible. U. S. C. I. C. S. leads with a glass chin. Abroad it creates a strong impression to see the collapse of North America over the past few years.

The newest example is the furor over whether Harry Hopkins and Henry Wallace did or did not try to expedite the shipment of atomic materials to the Soviet union during the war. The so-called testimony presented this far is thin to the point of being absurd.

As the small cries of angry Republican members of the house and American committee immediately presented this far is thin to the point of being absurd. The matter is to enter the past and the men around Franklin Roosevelt.

During the war the Soviet union was the ally of the United States and Great Britain. A lot of people seem to have forgotten that Russian soldiers killed and wounded millions of the enemy and, in turn, perhaps as many as 10,000,000 Russians were casualties.

Naturally, everything was done to send all possible material—short of a few ultimate secrets mostly related to the atomic bomb—to our ally. Terrible sacrifices were made to get that material to Russia. Often this government was far behind on promised shipments and the besieged Russians cried out in rage and desperation.

With the end of the war a new phase began. In spite of warning signs, our government made every effort to work with Russia, the war-torn ally, to build a peaceful world. This was leading from strength and confidence—the confidence of a victory won out of the power of American arms and American productivity.

Such espionage is one of the grim facts of the present-day world. The third phase of Russian-U. S. relations began with the realization that the Soviet union was bent on world domination. The Communist parties in individual countries were instruments for sabotage and control, wholly subservient to Moscow policy.

With hindsight we may see that some foolish and totally unnecessary things were done in this postwar phase. Take an instance that has never been said before any other.

In early 1946 Moscow asked permission to send a group of Soviet engineers to the United States. They were to study the water systems of leading American cities so, presumably, they could go back to Russia and direct the construction of similar systems.

J. Edgar Hoover, head of the FBI, was opposed to granting permission for the visit. He was overruled by the department of state. The Soviet engineers came to America. They got measured drawings of blueprints of major water systems, including those of New York and Los Angeles, where huge populations are dependent for life on a stream of water piped over a long distance.

How much this information would help Russia in the event of war is not clear. The same knowledge might have come, although less easily, through Russian espionage.
