Incoming Mail Sets Record at Local Postoffice on Saturday

Walls of the Twin Falls postoffice bulged Saturday as incoming mail piled up around the walls and in all available space in the middle of the room. Saturday's receipts of incoming mail were the largest ever recorded by the postoffice, according to Postmaster W. W. Frank.

Frank said there was no adequate way of telling how much incoming mail there was but swept his arm at the cluttered workroom and said, "Look for yourself."

A pile of unopened sacks about 20 feet long and five feet high was bordered by a mountain of packages six feet wide, 20 feet long and eight feet high. More packages stood as tall as the piles.

The annual Christmas rush, heavy as it has been, started around Dec. 12, Frank said, with the post expected Monday. Workers told him that they had to handle the tons of letters, cards and packages.

A total of 200 men are being employed now, Frank said, with four others being added Monday. The average staff is 10 men.

About two tons of mail loaded on trucks at the rear of the postoffice were admitted. "We'll get it in as soon as we can find space to put it," Frank said.

Unsurveyed Land Could Be Making Profits for State

SALT LAKE CITY, Dec. 11 (AP)—More than 1,000,000 acres of land in Utah could be producing profits for the state's public schools if it were surveyed, Milton B. Taylor, state finance commissioner, said today.

He noted that Utah's enabling act provided that the federal government would give to the state of Utah title to four sections out of each 36-section township. However, formal transfer could not be made until the land is surveyed.

"There are 10,483,975 acres of unsurveyed land in Utah today of which more than a million acres will come to the land board for Utah's common schools when the survey is completed and the approval of transfer is endorsed by the U. S. Interior department," Taylor said.

Frequently any evidence of contact or dealing with the Russians is greeted as an indication of disloyalty to the United States. Certainly we must take a grave view of any relations that amount to espionage or genuine subversion. But the line between such activities and other kinds of contact is not always well defined.

That's where the error in thinking comes in. Many forget that Russia was our wartime ally, that in those hard days of 1943 to 1945 it was considered not only proper but downright fashionable to talk with the Soviets. We look back upon countless events placed against this backdrop and condemn sweepingly all who made contact with the Russians as hardly sensible.

This habit of reflecting current attitudes back into the past is not limited to matters affecting the Russians. Ordinary citizens and historians do it all the time.

One of the most common practices is to misjudge the moral posture of a particular United States like to talk with the "perfidious," a phrase intended to denote the wickedness of many leading businessmen of the time.

But as the more discerning historians point out, this is not true. We can't find a single word in this article that would condemn any individual behavior in 1885 by the standards of 1930.

GOODING, Dec. 11—There's an awkward stage in most everyone's young life. For instance the little lady who discovers that she's too big for her high chair, but not big enough to sit on a chair like grown-ups.

Of course there have been many makeshift solutions to this big problem in a young lady's life such as folded pillows, which suddenly slide and cause a tumble—and then the child is left with a sore bottom, quite right, and even that old standby, the phone book seems a little better than some of our small western cities.

When the crisis was reached in the Valden Sullivan home, daddy came up with the exact solution—he invented the "Kiddle-Up." This special little problem solver is so found in any child's life.

When Sullivan first hit upon the idea for the handy little stool he secured a design patent. Now after some four years, during wartime production was curtailed he has made and distributed more than 1,000 Kiddle-Ups. All work has been done by Sullivan and a helper in a basement room.

Two men working together can put out about 40 Kiddle-Ups a day. Crosby De Moss, noted glass artist and former Jerome resident, has drawn the advertising sketches. Sullivan modestly admitted the company was known as the Sullivan Products company.

An idea which began as a solution to the Sullivan's own problem soon became a hobby, as he made more and more at the insistence of friends who wanted a stool in their own homes. The demand grew and grew as such things sometimes do.

Elites sometimes do. Sullivan has placed Kiddle-Ups in 773 cities in 46 states, Hawaii and Alaska. The Better Homes and Gardens magazine chose the Kiddle-Up for their buyers' editorial page and T-

meant twice as popular as any other color.

Restaurants—and beauty shops have found the Kiddle-Up particularly adaptable to their needs. One beauty shop in the east had written Sullivan stating that for years they had tried to find such a "filler" for their juvenile patron and that the Kiddle-Up exactly filled such a need.

A variety of uses have been found for the stool—in the car, theater, bathroom and at the table. And not only for the little boy or girl but older people also like them for footstools. Sullivan noted that grandparents find special delight in having something "just right" for that special little visitor.

BOISE, Dec. 11 (AP)—Idaho's "Citizens' Committee" today has completed its work of preparing proposals for streamlining the state government. Its members are awaiting the expected "storm" of pro and con views.

However, the public won't get a look at the report until Jan. 3, when the 14-member joint interim legislative committee on state government reorganization will release the information.

Program Approved
The recommendations were approved by a unanimous vote of the committee late yesterday. Although the full committee had not been listed to meet until after Christmas, the executive group which met yesterday decided everything was in shape for final action and the members were called by telephone to meet here yesterday afternoon. All but two—Rep. Glenn Sandeford and Rep. Ben Fink—showed up. They gave their approval by telephone.

Speaks Opposed
Sen. C. E. Cannon, D. Elmore, chairman of the committee, said he expected opposition to develop when the group's findings are made public early in January.

"I think that most of this opposition will come from folks with pre-conceived ideas," Cannon said. "When we show them that we've found a way of increasing efficiency in the state government, they will have taxpayers \$1,000,000 in a year."

Gov. C. A. Robins already has approved the report for submission of the special session of the legislature which meets next February, Cannon said. The governor also approved its contents.

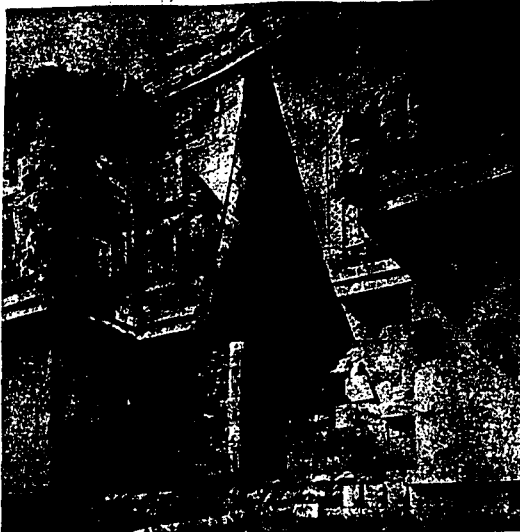

Ancient Maya Shown in Photo Display on Exhibit at SICE

SOUTHERN IDAHO COLLEGE OF EDUCATION, Albion, Dec. 11—Ancient Maya, a photographic exhibition prepared by the editors of Life magazine, will be on display at the Southern Idaho College of Education library in Boocook hall from 8 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. daily until Thursday.

Truce Buckley, head of the art department at SICE, arranged for the exhibit and was assisted in placing the photographs by William A. Sandstrom, librarian.

The Maya have long fascinated archaeologists. Their civilization, the most brilliant of pre-Columbian America, flourished in the Yucatan peninsula during the 4th to 16th centuries of the Christian era. This exhibit reveals the extraordinary refinement of Maya culture, particularly in architecture and sculpture.

The exhibit is assembled from several hundred photographs made by Dimitri Kameel on his life assignment in Central America. They include thorough documentation of four major Maya centers of population, Copan and Palenque in the Old Empire, Uxmal and Chichen Itza in the New Empire. The 30 large photographic panels which make up the exhibit reveal a detailed pictorial review of the rich archaeological remains of Maya civilization.

The magnificent sites of the Maya and their whole complex economy are shown in detail, and their culture into decline and, finally, into collapse.

Over the years the burned-off jungle became grassy plains, and the Maya, in spite of their scientific genius, had developed no agricultural tools except the pointed stick. This simple tool, excellent for planting corn in loose forest soil, was useless for digging up grass. So the Maya began to plant corn in the rich forest soil.
