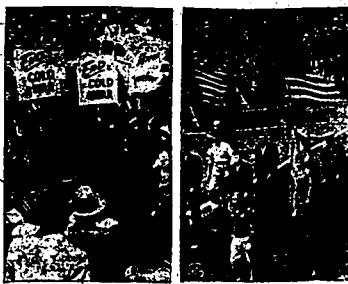

Editor's note: This is the sixth of 11 columns... The American Legion was one of the first to strike back at the bolshevik.

It is not possible, in the compass of this article, to detail all that has been done by civic and patriotic organizations in the war with communism.

The American Legion was one of the first to strike back at the bolshevik. That was in 1919, when the convention petitioned President Hoover to give the department of justice jurisdiction over the communists.

Since 1917, the Legion has held national convocations, attended by selected members from throughout the country. The convocations are largely devoted to lectures and discussions of communist philosophies and tactics.

The Legion's latest move is to call for a national convocation on "War" war on communism. National Commander George C. Craig has invited 20 national organizations to send representatives to a January convocation at New York.

The United States Chamber of Commerce is a Johnny-come-lately, compared to the Legion. But it now has one of the most powerful anti-communist bureaus in the country.

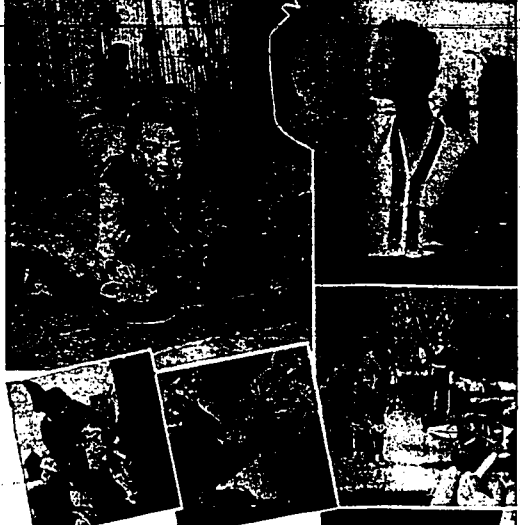
