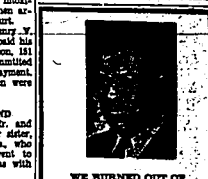

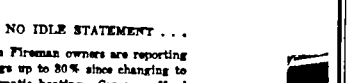

Ol' MacDonald Had a Farm; Its Cow Shed Would Not Meet Today's Tests

By MRS. TOM TERRY... 'FAIRVIEW,' Dec. 25.—There's nothing about a glass of grade A milk to suggest that it's anything special. Time was when a farmer kept a cow or two on the place to provide milk for his children and maybe sell some to the neighbors. But today's dairy farmer is as much an enterprising businessman as his cousin in the city who uses the latest methods in his business establishment. And the farmer's home is just as modern and up-to-date.

A typical example of a modern farm business is the farm which sells grade A milk to dairy processors. The milk sold to such plants is graded not only for cream content but also for bacteria count. Milk exceeding a count of 100,000 is rejected—poor business for the farmer. The Fairview district has several grade A dairy farms, including those of Roland Harding, T. W. Richmond, Ernest Peterson and Rudolph Peterson, whose barn was built five years ago and has been converted to grade A specifications. Meeting such standards is expensive in equipment, remodeling and milk processing. The extra premium paid for grade A milk often is an inducement to many farmers to grade to a maximum profit from their cows. The cows whose the cows are kept when not in the barn must be well stabled and clean as the cows' udders will be as clean as possible. Many farmers have a leading shed, a covered three-wall structure, in the corral where the cows can spend their time while not milking or when the weather is inclement. While city residents worried about frozen water pipes last winter, dairymen worried about loss of cattle from frozen stalls. Milk standards for grade A milk, the milking portion of the barn must have washable floors and walls. The Peterson barn is built of cinder blocks and the interior is finished with a waterproof cement.

'Replacement' Auto Demand Tops Record

By DAVID J. WILKIE, AF Automobile Editor... DETROIT, Dec. 26.—(AP)—Replacement demand for cars and trucks is far greater today than at any other time in the auto industry's history. This is one reason the nation's car makers expect production to remain higher than prewar levels for many years to come. In making this comment the Automobile Manufacturers' association says "many industry officials are optimistic that 1950 production will equal or top that of 1949." (The 1949 output is estimated by the association at 6,200,000 vehicles. The auto record, made just 20 years ago, was 5,500,000 cars and trucks.) What the industry might have done this year has been a normal export market is interesting to speculate upon. Exports last year took only 200,000 units—less than five per cent of total United States output. In normal times 10 per cent of the industry's total production goes to foreign markets. Certainly the in-

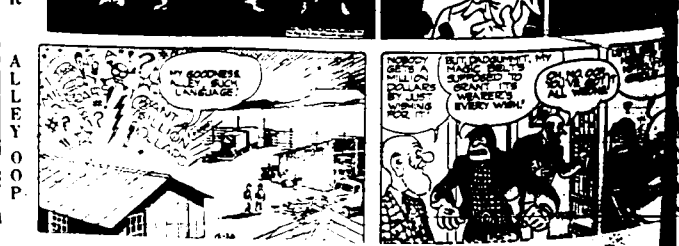
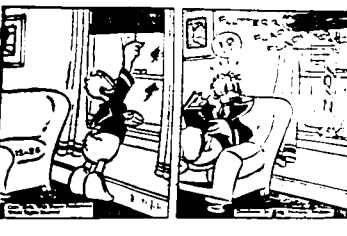

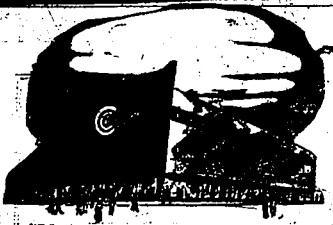
