Mental Examinations OK'd for Butterfield

BURLEIGH, Dec. 27.—Neale Butterfield, 16, confessed slayer of Glenda Joyce Brilow, 7, is scheduled to be taken to the Bingham county jail for a 10-day to one month examination by specialists at the state hospital south at Blackfoot.

Permission for his transfer from the Cassia county jail was granted in an order signed yesterday by District Judge Hugh A. Baker upon request of the youth's attorney, Sherman B. Wood, and over the objections of Prosecuting Attorney A. H. Nielson and Sheriff Saul Clark.

Butterfield is charged with first degree murder of the Brilow child Nov. 16. He orally confessed the slaying two days later before a number of law enforcement officers at Jerome where he was taken for questioning after his arrest near Hammett.

The girl's mother, Donald Wood, 37, in a ditch near his late confession, Butterfield, a star athlete, admitted he had admitted striking her but denied slaying her.

Hazelton Man Perfects Log Structure



In a setting of Colorado hills across planned years ago, is a pre-fabricated five-room log house on the Frank Riemann farm near Hazelton. Airlight joints are possible without skin staples through use of a machine perfected by G. W. Tibbitts, Hazelton, in Albert Hartley's machine shop in that town. (Staff photograph)

Improved Log Construction Is Perfected by Man at Hazelton

HAZELTON, Dec. 26 - Airlight joints between logs, without chinking or use of nails or spikes, is a feature of construction in this area as a result of G. W. Tibbitts perfecting a machine to produce the first log. Lodgepole pine from the Yellowstone park area is being used.

Each log is fastened by assembly construction. Joints are around between the logs and around the doors and windows. The bottom logs are placed horizontally and those between the windows are upright.

Tibbitts worked two years to perfect his machine to produce the logs to fit. The machine cuts grooves in the logs. Into the grooves is fitted a square piece of timber twice the height of the groove. The next log is fitted on to this.

Work on the machine was done in the Hazelton machine shop of Albert Hartley. While perfecting the machine, Tibbitts also built a small scale model of a five-room house. Patents on the machine were applied for.

OBVIOUSLY YOUR CHILDREN

Many months ago a British author, commenting on America after a visit here, declared: "I think parents in the United States obey their children very well."

When he said that, the British touched a sensitive spot. There is little doubt that this said remark comes pretty close to describing the fact in many an American household.

In countless homes Junior is king not because the family wants him to be but because American living today in the big cities is discipline. Always a mobile people, Americans during and since the war reached a new peak in their restless migrations, their shifts from job to job. There's a transient air about much American living today. In the big cities opportunity often seems almost without root.

This "here today and gone tomorrow" existence doesn't make it easy to rear children. Last year's patterns may not hold for this year. Rules and standards are hard to maintain against a shifting scene. The kids break away easily, tending to fix their own rules.

On the other hand, a lot of parents want their children largely free of controls. This is, of course, the philosophy of progressive thought and it's a part of child development books, home and in school.

The idea here is to let the kid be natural. Let him do the thing he's interested in, say what he wants to say, and so on. He'll be much happier following his own bent, the theory goes, than bucking under some discipline which isn't his own. And he won't grow up as a tight little bundle of frustrations and inhibitions.

Sounds fine, and probably is—up to a point. But this notion, even though it's been kicking around for quite a time, is still being carried to pretty foolish extremes in many families.

Mrs. Evelyn Barkins, a doctor's wife and the mother of three, feels strongly about this and says that she likely echoes the sentiments of a lot of people.

Talking about children raised under the free-wheeling system, she says:

"They're given everything they ask for. They're given everything they feel like. They're given a constant conversation. They're vicious and destructive.

"But the parents are so accustomed to it they just sit and say 'Don't do that, dear' in a weak voice. The children pay no attention."

Kids brought up in the "don't inhibit the child" brought up in many child psychology books are running social life and making their parents miserable hermits, says Mrs. Barkins, who happens to be an author herself.

No one really would want to condemn wholesale the progressive approach to child growth and education, for it has contributed richly toward modernizing our thinking about the subject. But anyone exposed to a few hours of contact with the "progressive" child may be inclined to second Mrs. Barkins' remarks.

To be sure, children are not brought into the world for the enjoyment and convenience of adults. They have a right to their own life. But that life is to be balanced and well-rounded, their behavior as they grow up not having, not doing and not saying anything so important as getting their way. The world is a place of competing interests and desires. The children who are not taught soon that their desires cannot always prevail are not equipped for living.

They will enter adulthood immature and ill-adjusted. The conflict, disappointment, frustration and defeat they will come to know will be many instances be far more damaging than the checks they suffer for demanding material things as children.
