Greater Effort Is Urged for 1950 March of Dimes in T F. Although Twin Falls county ranked sixth in the state for per capita contributions to the march of dimes in 1948, it will have to do even better this year to help support the high cost of infantile paralysis, Frank McIntyre, county campaign chairman, declared Wednesday. He pointed out that the State Foundation for Infantile Paralysis has spent more than \$50,000 this year in the worst year for polio in the state's history. This figure is a sharp increase from the \$30,000 collected in only \$100,000 and the national fund has requested that it contribute more than \$25,000 to make up the deficit, McIntyre said. Idaho has had the highest incidence of the disease of all states. Although 400 cases were reported for every 100,000 persons in the state. Many other states, like Idaho, had to borrow from the national foundation to pay for the cost of the disease. The national reserve was badly depleted during 1948. As a result, the national fund has requested that Idaho return from the march of dimes campaign more than \$25,000.

Controls Due For Many of Farms in '50. WASHINGTON, Dec. 28 (AP)—About half of the nation's farms will be under government crop production controls next year. A survey showed today that controls, ranging from mild to rigid, will be used in an effort to curb surplus planting of seven, possibly nine, major field crops. This aim will be to stop the multi-billion dollar price support drain on the federal treasury. The government's support "investment" in farm surpluses is expected to hit the \$1,000,000,000 mark by next June. The seven crops on which controls are certain are corn, wheat, cotton, tobacco, peanuts, rice and potatoes. These crops accounted for 53 per cent of the total \$38,400,000 acres planted in the principal crops this year. Total crop plantings were the largest since the depression year of 1932. The controls seek to reduce plantings of the seven crops by about 10 per cent, or \$1,000,000,000. The controls will be used on only cotton, wheat, and tobacco. Acreage allotments will be used on the other crops.

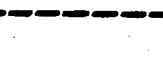
Most of Pay Tax Not Seen By Employees

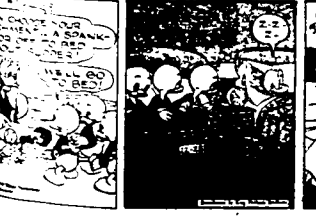

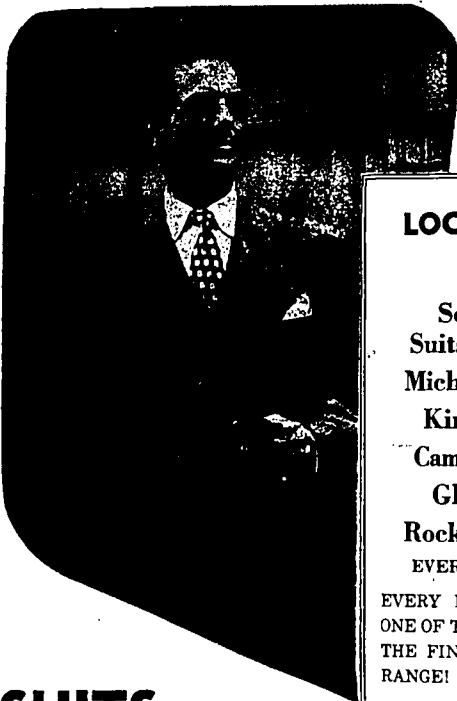
