Gov. Otter takes on feds over wilderness filming

IPTV wants to film in Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness

BOISE - Gov. C.L. "Butch" Otter on Wednesday chastised the U.S. Forest Service for forbidding the state's educational broadcasting network from sending a cameraman into a central Idaho wilderness area.

Schouten, Ursenbach have raised most money in T.F. races

Two candidates seeking a Twin Falls County Commission seat have raised more than \$2,000 each this spring, largely thanks to loans each took out.

District 2 commission candidate Jim Schouten, a Republican, led the fundraising for all contested races in the county, according to campaign finance reports due Tuesday to the county clerk's office. He raised about \$2,861, including \$1,800 in loans and a \$500 donation from Bill Price. Schouten spent all but \$300 on campaign signs and other advertisements.

The pre-primary reports, required of all county and state candidates, cover the period between Jan. 1 and May 9. Candidates filed for county office

Jerome's school board **OKs contract** with teachers

Combination of cuts will drop teachers' salaries by 6.2 percent

JEROME - Jerome School District's board unanimously approved on Wednesday its contract with teachers that will cut the budget for salaries by about 6.2 percent.

The reductions are happening in response to decreased state funding and reflect similar steps that districts across the state have taken to deal with budget shortfalls for the upcoming school year.


In response to declining revenues, the Legislature cut \$128.5 million - 7.5 percent - from the public schools budget statewide for the upcoming fiscal year, which begins in July.

For the school district, the cut is happening through a combination of changes.

The salary schedule, which is used to determine pay based on experience and education of employees, is being reduced by 1 percent. In addition, the number of

Obama clamors for federal fix to immigration woes

WASHINGTON - Confronting soaring frustration over illegal immigration, Obama President Wednesday condemned Arizona's crackdown and pushed instead for a federal fix the nation could embrace. He said that will never happen without Republican support, pleading: "I need some help?

In asking anew for an immigration overhaul, Obama showed solidarity with his guest of honor, Mexican President Felipe who Calderon, called Arizona's law discriminatory and warned Mexico would reject any effort to "criminalize migration." The United States and Mexico share a significant economic and political relationship that stands to be damaged the more the nations are at odds over immigration, which affects millions of people on both sides of the border.

Obama sought to show that he, too, is fed up with his own government's failure to fix a system widely seen as broken. He said that would require solving border security, employment and citizenship issues all at once the kind of effort that collapsed in Congress just three years ago.

Increase in health tests raises costs in frugal Utah

Ginsburg, president of the Center for Studying Health System Change, a Washingtonbased research group. "They appear to be succumbing to the same forces that have led to high costs elsewhere."

Medicare spending Residents of Provo, many of trends often parallel those in the country's overall health system, experts say. 

When next the council meets it should quietly reverse its unanimous decision of earlier this week. And we should celebrate Independence Day, as a community, on July 4.

The event is sponsored by Southern Idaho Fireworks, and organizers had requested the change from a Sunday, a day of religious significance for many in Twin Falls.

Trouble is, the Fourth of July is a day of even greater secular significance for most residents.

Here's what 41-year-old John T. Bonnett of Twin Falls wrote on the *Times*-*News* website:

"As a 10-year veteran of the armed services who served with honor, this

really offends me. Is this about church? What about separation of church and state? Everybody has their right to religion but it cannot effect a national holiday. Don't do this."

Bonnett's right: The council overreached in rescheduling a national holiday.

It should have listened to former Mayor Lance Clow, who said he was concerned that some might not be pleased with this move, as the Fourth of July is considered a "sacred" day - though not in a religious sense.

This dispute echoes the long-running tension between members of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, who hold a conservative view about what secular activities should be undertaken on Sundays, and Twin Falls' non-Mormon majority.

That's a shame. Independence Day is about our collective heritage. It shouldn't have degenerated into a church-vs.-state or a Mormon-vs.-gentile spat.

We respect the right of those with a traditional opinion of Sunday activities to adhere to their beliefs. But this issue is about what the wider community thinks.

And we, most of us, believe in celebrating the rockets' red glare on the nation's birthday.

The Court needs more moms

es, we know the Supreme Court is stacked with Catholics, Ivy Leaguers, New Yorkers, judicial monks and opera fans. And no, the cohort of nine justices doesn't much resemble the whole of America. So President Barack Obama set out to at least add one more woman to the mix.

His nomination last week of Elena Kagan to the court, Obama declared, would make the body "more inclusive, more representative, more reflective of us as a people than ever before."

The grumblings came quickly: He should have chosen a black woman, some said, or an Asian-American, or someone with a law degree from a public university. But in selecting Kagan, Obama ensured that one key demographic would lose representation on the court, compared with its membership just a few years ago: mothers, a category in which 80 percent of American women eventually land.

It's not like we've never had moms in black robes. The flinty rancher and the feminist firebrand who blazed the trail for female justices both are mothers, with five children between them. Sandra Day O'Connor and Ruth Bader Ginsburg, who joined the bench in 1981 and 1993, respectively, benefited from highachieving husbands who held the Bible for them as they were sworn in, supported their aspirations and sacrificed for their careers.

Now 80 and 77, respectively, O'Connor and Ginsburg never had to talk much about balance in their own lives; they just made it

The women of a younger generation who stand on their shoulders, Sonia

Sotomavor and, if confirmed, Kagan, are single and have no children. That's not a judgment, just a fact, a line or two not found on their extraordinary bios. If Ginsburg is the next justice to step down, the court could be transformed into a body with no mothers otherwise known as people who may have to come home from work and spend a night picking lice out of a kid's hair.

"Personal experiences are important, and they shape people's backgrounds, but there are a range of ways you can inform understand ing without living it," says Deborah Rhode, a Stanford University law professor and a leading scholar of legal ethics and gender. "Do we want to suggest that men can't understand ... the challenges facing working mothers and related issues?"

Well, no, we don't, certainly not out loud.

The memories of the distinguished gentlemen from Arizona, Utah and South Carolina haranguing Sotomayor at her Senate

confirmation hearing last summer are too fresh. I, for one, am grateful that no one has turned up any record of a Supreme Court nominee saying, "I would hope that a wise working mother of three, with the richness of her experiences, would more often than not reach a better conclusion than a white male who hasn't lived that life." The howling would be deafening.

Women in general are more "socially compassionate" than men, says Northwestern University social psychology professor Alice Eagly, according to her analysis of decades of research on gender difference in decision-making. As legislators, lawyers and judges, women are somewhat more likely than men to favor what we call, irritatingly, "women's issues," generally child care, reproductive rights, sex discrimination in the workplace, education and health care.

But differences between mothers and non-mothers? "Interesting question," Eagly said in an e-mail. "I don't know of any studies on this question of motherhood and decision-mak-

It seems sensible to imagine that a woman who has juggled it all — the full-time job, the kids, the housework, the aging parents –

has a deeper and more instinctual grasp of the challenges facing similar women. Michelle Obama, a Princeton and Harvard Law grad like Kagan, now living in the White House with a guy who watches "SportsCenter" to chill, frequently tells her audiences of women various versions of "Look, I get it," to loud cheers.

Perception bias bedevils us in all kinds of ways, so it's too bad there is no data to examine whether a mother is a better judge for other mothers. But it's hardly surprising. Examining mothers vs. non-mothers would open a whole new front in the mommy wars; the PhDs who conduct research on gender difference are often women themselves, with little appetite to pick that

Motherhood offers a oneword verifier. It signals a woman with an intensity of life experiences, jammed with joys and fears, unpredictability and intimacy, all outside the workplace. Much of the time, it's the opposite of being strategic and assiduously prepared.

It's a story we understand without needing all the details.

I've been there many times: couples arguing over child custody; people with mental illness; victims of abuse: men and women pleading their cases, wanting to be heard, needing to be understood; everyone claiming to be the innocent party deserving of the ultimate granting of favor. Regardless of the circumstances that brought me to his courtroom, however, I could rely on Judge Elgee to be attentive, to ask intelligent, thoughtful questions, to listen without prejudice and to make a considered judgment after careful review of all of the information he had received.

That kind of integrity is impressive anywhere and, fairly or not, feels particularly precious in Idaho. Caring about the people who appear before you can't be the easiest way to perform one's duties as a judge, but Robert Elgee makes that effort while remaining fair and impartial.

For example, when I was

actively directing the local domestic violence treatment program, he took the extra steps to contact me personally several times to make sure the program was up to date with all state requirements and to stay fully informed about our progress.

It goes without saying that I haven't agreed with every one of Judge Elgee's decisions, but every judge will make rulings that upset someone at least half of the time. More importantly, I have always been grateful that, in Robert Elgee, we have a judge who truly believes in the principle of justice and who works very hard to apply it fairly to all of the citizens of this district. As judges, after all, are human, we cannot ask for more.






Why vote yes just because time is running out for jail?

Inventors say BP ignoring their ideas to clean up spill

NEW ORLEANS - A suggestion box or publicity stunt? BP has received thousands of ideas from the public on how to stop a blown oil well in the Gulf of Mexico, but some inventors are complaining that their efforts are getting ignored.

BP spokesman Mark Salt said the company wants the public's help, but that considering proposed fixes takes

"They're taking bits of ideas from lots of places." Salt said. "This is not just a PR stunt."

BP said Wednesday it hopes to begin shooting a mixture known as drilling mud into the blown-out well in the Gulf by Sunday. The "top kill" method involves shooting heavy mud into crippled equipment on top of the well, then aiming cement at the well to permanently keep down the oil. Even if it works it could take several weeks to complete.

"This is all being done at a depth of 5,000 feet and it's never been done at these depths before," said Doug Suttles of BP PLC, which leased the rig that exploded April 20 off the coast of Louisiana.





A rocky history

From history lessons to bird watching, Massacre Rocks offers a little of everything

AMERICAN FALLS - An image: knives and axes striking death blows through the air, the sharp points felling their victims.

The attack came without warning, and when it ended four people were dead. The next day, when the immigrants had regrouped and decided to fight back, five more people were struck down by Indian blows.


Life as a pioneer wasn't always that tough, but it was hard enough.

So are the rocks, like the twisted, tormented ones at Massacre Rocks State Park, still there today as iconic witnesses to the bloody crime that befell a group of immigrants Aug. 9, 1862, as they walked the Oregon Trail.

The haunting story of the skirmish that left several people dead, their blood soaked into the ground, is retold at the park today.

But it's easy to forget the historic tragedy, especially on a sunny day when the area looks almost happy in its aloneness and which makes an artistic contrast between the blue sky and rock-infested landscape.

The park, which has a visitors center, really isn't alone. A number of kiosks are located through the trail system. They begin at the visitors center, which displays a map of the Oregon Trail. The trail itself is located in the area and is fun to walk to.

Cabin owners appeal Forest Service fee proposal

A number of people presented their oral appeals to regional forest officials this week at the Sawtooth National Forest office in Twin Falls. The informal hearings, which began Tuesday, wraps up today.

"We just want to hear what you presented in your (written) appeals," Claire Huking, regional appeals and litigation coordinator, told participants at the informal hearing Tuesday afternoon.

The Forest Service conducted land appraisals in 2007, and based cabin fee increases on property value. Not satisfied with the appraisals, about 80 cabin owners in the Sawtooths hired a second appraiser, which appraised properties lower than the Forest Service had.

Cabin owners are required to pay 5 percent of the accepted appraisal value. They want fees based on the lower estimate, not the Forest Service's higher value.

David Mead, president of the Sawtooth Forest Cabin Owner's Association, said the Forest Service's proposal is high enough that it would force some permit holders out of their cabins.

Recreational permit holders own their cabins, but the Forest Service owns the land.

Mead said his cabin, which he's owned since the 1960s in the Valley View track near Sun Valley, went from a 1996 estimated value of \$35,000 to \$124,000, according to the first appraisal, increasing the annual fee from \$1,750 to \$6,200 - a 254 percent increase.

The Valley View track includes 34 cabins. The fees would increase incrementally every year until about 2013, he said, then remain steady after that.

Ray Strolberg, president of the Rock Creek Cabin Owners Association, said prior to 1997 he paid \$467 a year, but with the proposed increase he'd be expected to pay \$2,200. In January he paid \$880.

"They're charging incrementally until they get us up to the \$2,200," he said, noting that the Forest Service so far has averaged the two appraisals to come up with a 5 percent rate. But they're starting to feel the crunch. "That's why we're petitioning now. It's getting beyond anybody's capability for funding."

He didn't give any numbers, but said the increase would put a major strain on a number of cabin owners in the Balsam and Deadline tracks of the South Hills.

"We don't feel like we are asking a lot from the Forest Service," said Ellis Robertson, who owns a cabin in the Balsam track.

He said cabin owners are a boon to the Forest Service, because they keep an eve out for illicit activity, but the higher fees will likely turn many owners away.

"We are an extra set of eyes and ears up there," he said. "We've been able to catch poachers and turn them over to (Idaho Department of) Fish and Game. We've also caught people up there destroying federal lands."

Robertson said it's ironic that people, often with disregard to their surroundings, can camp in areas of the Sawtooths without a permit, but cabin owners, who generally take good care of the land, are forced to pay extreme prices.

He said, however, he's grateful for the officials who are considerate and willing to listen to the cabin owners.

"We want this to be a win-win for both of us,"

Melissa Hearst, special use program manager for the Forest Service, said the Sawtooths are a unique study. The office has not had so many appeals at one time, she said.

Permit holders filed their written appeals early this year. They will receive a response from the Forest Service by June 28, Huking said, after which they will have 20 days to respond. A final response from the Forest Service would likely be available by early fall.

The last of the three-day hearings end today. Actor Bruce Willis, who owns property in the Sawtooths, is listed as one of the cabin owners.

Though white-haired and approaching 60, Tom shows no sign of slowing down. To put things mildly, Tom's skill with a shotgun is unearthly. To date, his most noteworthy accomplishment has been to break nine hand-thrown clay targets with as many shots.

Millions of fans welcome him into their living rooms each week as Benelli's American Birdhunter and Benelli's American Safari's genial hunter host. When I met him in person, what immediately

impressed me was his approachability and down-to-earth manner. For several hours while setting up his show, Tom shook hands, signed autographs and joked with anyone and everyone who went up to meet

When engaging targets, Tom admonished us to resist the temptation to shoot instinctively, but rather to "keep your face on the stock and align the front sight, with your hard focus on each individual target." For sights, Tom relies solely on Champion's low-profile, highvisibility EasyHit models. After shouldering one of Tom's guns at the end of the day's show, I have to agree with that choice.

A board outside the center allows visitors to write down the animals they see on their hikes. The area is home to beaver, covote, muskrat, rabbits and more than 200 species of birds and 300 species of plants, according to the Idaho Parks and Recreation website.


"There are a lot of birds and waterfowl," said Alberta Zimmerman, seasonal office manger with the park. "A lot of people come here for bird watching, and they love to walk the trails. They find it peaceful. We have people who come back every vear."

I didn't see any animals on my visit to the area May 13, except for a few lizards that scurried nearby. I did see fishermen and their boats on the Snake River, though, which travels through the area and adds another element of beauty to the otherwise desert landscape. There also were a number of campers interspersed throughout the 40-unit park.

There are four cabins, a selfguided nature trail, and boat

Massacre Rocks - called "Gate of Death" or "Devil's Gate" by the pioneers - was formed millions of years ago by a nowextinct volcano in the area. 



Henry's hybrid cutthroats have tell-tale orange slash marks on their throats. A boat will improve your odds of landing because of the size of the reservoir. Even if you don't succeed in netting a hybrid, there's also rainbow, bass and walleye in the reservoir. Give it a try!

Tips for controlled hunt application period

Question: "Last year I had a problem with my controlled hunt application. I thought I put in for one unit and it showed up different on the application receipt I received from the vendor. What should I do different this year?

Answer: The controlled hunt application period is usually the most chaotic time of the year for many vendors and eager hunters. Many hunters have found it difficult and frustrating to deal with the application period, most often because of miscommunication with the vendor entering the application.

Here are a few suggestions to help sportsmen with the upcoming application period:

1. Read the regulation brochures. This sounds so simple but many individuals don't realize there are changes that can occur from year to year. Hunt numbers, season dates and exceptions can vary from year to year. Doing a little homework before you show up at your local vendor can make your applicaASK THE **OFFICER** Tana Rae Alberti

tion for that prized controlled hunt a lot smoother.

2. Use the Controlled Hunt Worksheet. This worksheet can be found in the Big Game Regulations brochure. Use this worksheet to speed up the application process. Fill in the blanks with your hunting license and controlled hunt number and take this to your local vendor so they can accurately and efficiently enter your application.

3. Double-check your application. While at the vendor make sure the clerk clearly understands which hunt you are applying for. When they hand you your application receipt doublecheck the hunt number, big game unit, hunting dates and your hunting license number before you leave that establishment. Ensure

the applicant or applicants

are all correct on the application as a transposed number may result in application for someone

else. If there is a mistake the vendor can immediately cancel the application and make changes. If you notice errors at a later time or wait to make changes, you must go to your local regional office to cancel the original application. At this time you will be charged again an application fee of \$6.25. Ultimately, it is your responsibility to make sure your application is correct.

4. Don't Wait. Procrastination is a human condition that many people suffer. Every year the rush at the end of the application period is especially chaotic. If possible, don't wait until the last few days to put in for your application.



DEAR DR. GOTT: My

5-year-old grandson sometimes awakens in the night with pain in his legs, ankles or wrists. My daughter says he has growing pains. Is this

DEAR READER: Yes, it is, sort of. Up to 40 percent of children experience "growing pains" during two periods - from the ages of 3 to 5 and 8 to 12. There is no evidence to substantiate that bone growth causes pain.



Edward G. Uhl, co-inventor of M1 bazooka during WWII, dies at 92

BALTIMORE - Edward G. Uhl, an aerospace executive who was a former president of Fairchild Industries and co-inventor of the M1 bazooka during World War II, died May 9 of heart failure at an assisted living facility in Easton, Md. He was 92.

Uhl, pronounced "Yule," served as a regular officer in the Army's Ordnance Corps from 1941 until 1946. In 1942, while assigned to Ordnance Corps headquarters at the Pentagon, he helped develop the first U.S. shoulder-launched bazooka, originally named the M1 Rocket Launcher, with Col. Leslie A. Skinner. "When I met with

Skinner, he was working on rockets. We really had no anti-tank weapon. You can't believe how inept our military was at that point in time," Uhl said in a 2007 interview with Maryland Cracker Barrel Magazine.



Lakers hold off Suns, take 2-game West finals lead

LOS ANGELES — The Los Angeles Lakers are halfway to another NBA finals, and their fans already know who they want their dominant defending champions to play

Pau Gasol scored 14 of his 29 points in the fourth quarter, Kobe Bryant had 21 points and 13 assists, and the Lakers roared away in the final minutes for a 124-112 victory over the Phoenix Suns on Wednesday night to claim a 2-0 lead in the Western Conference finals.

Ron Artest scored 18 points for the Lakers, who won their eighth straight playoff game and moved within striking distance of a tantalizing NBA finals showdown with the Boston Celtics, who lead Orlando 2-0 in the East. For the second straight game, the chants rained down from the Staples Center crowd in the final minutes: "We want Boston!"

The Lakers remained unbeaten at home in the postseason despite a much-improved effort from the Suns, who lost the opener by 21 points. Phoenix tied it at 90-all heading to the final period of Game 2, but Gasol and Bryant flawlessly led the Lakers to another high-scoring victory.


"We've been able to play both styles of basketball," Lakers coach Phil Jackson said. "We like to control the pace, but we feel comfortable if it's an accelerated pace."

The Lakers certainly seem to be accelerating the Suns' exit from the playoffs after hitting better than 57 percent of their shots and scoring a jaw-dropping 252 points in the first two games.

Game 3 is Sunday night in Phoenix. But unless the Suns figure out a way to stop Los Angeles' versatile, poised offense, Beantown and Hollywood could be just a few days away from another chapter in their storied rivalry.

"We can't slow them down," Phoenix coach Alvin Gentry said. "I thought we played well offensively, but every time we tried to make an adjustment to slow them down offensively, they would go somewhere else. There's a good reason they're the world champs, but we'll keep plugging away, keep trying."

The Lakers have lost only one best-ofseven playoff series in franchise history after taking a 2-0 lead, winning the other 41. The 15-time champions haven't won eight straight games in the same postseason since their famous one-loss run through the 2001 playoffs.
