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## Voters choose change in CSI trustee elections

Voters in Jerome and Twin Falls counties have ousted two longtime College of Southern Idaho trustees, prompting a rare shift in the makeup of the college's five-member board.

LeRoy Craig and Charles Lehrman, both trustees since 1974, were voted out of office in separate contested races. In their place will be Bob Keegan, a retired Twin Falls businessman who won a four-way race for Craig's seat, and Karl Kleinkopf, who challenged Lehrman

after retiring earlier this year from a 33-year career at CSI. Kleinkopf and Keegan will be seated at the next CSI board meeting on Nov. 15, when they'll start four-year terms.

"I want to thank the community because the community's been behind us," Kleinkopf, 64, said. "There's been a lot of people who have helped."

Kleinkopf and Keegan presented themselves as new alternatives with fresh perspectives and ideas for the board.

"It just tells me, like we've been saying, that it's time for

a change t h e r e , " Keegan, 60, said, adding that he'll start familiarizing himself with the college's budget and reading past meeting minutes.

The change also means that the board will have to select a new chairman and vice chairman, positions that were occupied by Craig and Lehrman respectively during their tenure.

"We owe a great deal of

thanks to two board members who have served this community for over 35 years and built a community college that is at the top of the nation," said CSI President Jerry Beck.

Beck, who's been at the college for more than 34 years, said it's hard for him to see Craig and Lehrman leave. But he added that it's important to be open to the perspectives of the new trustees.

"We all have to be open to new ideas and new thoughts and things that are brought to the table," he said. "And we'll just have to see what those are."

Lehrman, 83, of Buhl, expressed his disappointment that there won't be any trustees from western Twin Falls County or Jerome County on the board. Keegan and Kleinkopf will join sitting commissioners Donna Brizee, Allan Frost and Thad Scholes, all of Twin Falls.

"There is no representation in the West End and no representation in Jerome

County," he said, adding that he's called Kleinkopf and wished him well. "I think this is a bad thing."

The trustee seats are not zoned, and board members can reside in Twin Falls or Jerome counties.

Craig, 76, of Jerome, said it's been a "wonderful 36 years."

"It's been due to the three best presidents probably in the West of any college, and the administration and faculty," Craig said.

## Jail funding fizzles

High turnout led to Tuesday ballot shortage

Jerome County voters have denied funding a new jail three times, and on Tuesday more of them meant it.

County officials failed to secure the 66.6 percent voter approval required to take out a \$13 million bond to purchase 80 acres of land and build a new correctional facility, as only 59.4 percent of voters supported the measure. The margin of defeat was 7.2 percent, a harsher result than the first two attempts. In November 2009, a lease-purchase proposal failed by 1.6 percent. In May, it failed by 1.2 percent.

## GOP power surges with Otter, House elections

### Analysis

Getting elected as a Democrat is tough enough in Idaho.

The state hasn't elected a Democratic governor since 1990, when Cecil Andrus was elected to a fourth term. But try doing it against a national backdrop of unhappiness with the Democratic Party's leaders and it's even tougher — even if the bad feelings have more to do with Democrats in Washington, D.C., than those in Boise.

But blaming Keith Allred's election loss on the unpopularity of President Barack Obama and House Speaker Nancy Pelosi would oversimplify the victory that Gov. C.L. "Butch" Otter scored.

Idaho's 2010 gubernatorial election's dialogue was more about the state's affairs and less about the nation's, except when candidates talked about whether lawsuits against the federal government are the right approach to unwelcome

mandates involving wolves, immigration and health care.

Instead, candidates spoke the most about Idaho tax exemptions, state budget cuts to education and balancing the budget in a race that pitted a challenger without experience in elected office against a household name with 30 years in office.

For Otter, the win was about voters supporting his work to ensure that state government lives within its means.

"We're doing the same thing that every family, every small or large business had to do," Otter said in a Tuesday night interview with the *Times-News*.

For Republicans, the race's outcome signaled that the public understands the tough budget decisions they faced.

Sen. Dean Cameron, R-Rupert, and co-chair of the Joint Finance-

Appropriations Committee, said that most Idahoans realize the state's budget problems and limited revenues weren't the fault of legislators or the governor.

"I know that Keith in particular attacked some of the things that we had to do, but the truth is, he never came out completely with what he would do differently and where he would get enough revenue," Cameron said.

"Especially with the governor's race, it seems like people understood what we did — what we had to do — over the last couple years with the budget shortfalls," said Rep. Jim Patrick, R-Twin Falls and a member of JFAC.

Democrats, who likely have lost five seats in the Idaho House — one race is still too close to call — knew

that they faced challenges of being the minority party and an unfavorable mood among many voters.

Democratic House Minority Leader John Rusche of Lewiston said: "In the election, obviously Idaho was no different from the rest of the nation in the tidal wave of anti-Democrat feeling."

Rusche added that Allred was at a disadvantage from the start.

"I think that Keith Allred had a lot to do to get the name recognition that Governor Otter with 30, 40 years in the public sphere had,

but he was running uphill all the way."

Rep. Wendy Jaquet, D-Ketchum, said that voters may not be seeing all the impacts of education cuts if they're more concerned about employment than education.

"I was surprised that Keith Allred did not do bet-

ter," Jaquet said. "I was hoping that he would do better."

Now, with the economy still in a slump, the work is just beginning.

"I think it's a challenge for both parties to figure out how to grow the state and increase the revenues and basically be able to fund what we have not been able to fund," Jaquet said.

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# Mini-Cassia officials welcome changes to Idaho Constitution

BURLEY — Mini-Cassia officials are generally pleased that voters on Tuesday gave hospitals and city-owned electric utilities more options for taking on long-term debt.

Amendments to the Idaho Constitution gave both entities, as well as municipal airports, the ability to pursue such debt as long as it's not repaid with public funds. The amendments were first approved by the Legislature before being sent to voters.

"This is very good for Idaho's economy," said State Rep. Fred Wood R-Burley, who co-authored the amendments with Sen. Joe Stegner, R-Lewiston.

Wood said the pair was prompted to draft the amendments after the Idaho Supreme Court in 2006 ruled that the Boise airport had to get voter approval to build a parking garage, even if the cost wouldn't come from taxpayer dollars.

The decision prompted Minidoka Memorial Hospital officials to spend more than a year working toward turning the county-owned hospital into a nonprofit. They said doing so would make it easier to move forward with a

planned \$6 million renovation.

Now, hospital officials are debating whether to complete that transition. Chief Operating Officer Joel Rogers said Wednesday that the hospital's board of directors plans to meet at 8 a.m. Monday to discuss whether to continue.

The final decision will be made later Monday by the Minidoka County Commission.

"MMH had positioned itself to take advantage of either outcome in the election," Rogers said.

But moving forward with the nonprofit conversion comes at a cost, Rogers said.

"The election has made it so we can move forward with the construction immediately," he said.

Mini-Cassia cities which operate their own electrical systems include Burley, Rupert, Heyburn, Albion, Declo and Minidoka.

Heyburn Acting City Superintendent Earl Andrews said he believes the amendments will help the city maintain favorable electric rates.

"We probably have some of the lowest rates around and this will help us keep them," Andrews said.

Rupert City Superintendent Dennis Andrew said his city will be able to enter into long-term power agreements with Bonneville Power Association and other hydropower generators, which have historically provided the best power deals for the city.

"Without that we would have been at the mercy of the power market and may have had to pay up to 60 or 70 percent higher rates," he said.

Andrew noted that one argument against the amendment was that people shouldn't give up their right to vote on issues. But, he said, apathy sometimes keeps people from voting, or they think the issue is a "no-brainer" and don't vote, leaving a small group of people to make decisions for everyone.

Boise activist David Frazier, whose lawsuit led to the 2006 Supreme Court decision that established the voting requirement, would presumably disagree. In a statement posted Wednesday on his "Boise Guardian" blog, Frazier wrote that he "learned it is impossible to battle the might of government, regardless of the nobility of one's cause."

Jerome County Commission Chairwoman Cathy Roemer called the result "unfortunate."

Sheriff Doug McFall said he was disappointed.

"I was hoping to wake up this morning and be surprised," McFall said.

The jail proposal proved nearly as important to Jerome County voters as the governor's race. Of the 4,753 ballots cast, only 266 voters — approximately 6 percent — abstained from voting on the jail bond. Only 77 chose not to cast a vote for a gubernatorial candidate.

Turnout among registered voters was 57.6 percent.

As ballots began arriving at the courthouse from outlying precincts on Tuesday night, County Clerk Michelle Emerson reported that seven of the 10 precincts ran out of electronic ballots. The polls ended up being 763 ballots short, forcing election officials to hand out paper ballots, which had to be counted by hand.

Only one precinct was counted by midnight.

For the county's commissioners and sheriff, three jail funding defeats in 12 months leaves them pondering, "what now?"

McFall said the jail's safety and overcrowding problems remain. Also, the county will continue to pay to send overflow inmates to other counties.

Roemer said that she and her fellow commissioners will keep an eye on county finances as they

continue to spend money on the current facility to meet state and federal jail standards.

The option remains of seeking judicial confirmation, in which the commissioners would ask a district judge to permit the county to take on long-term debt to fund the jail. Opinions on pursuing that route are mixed among county officials.

Mills, a Republican, will take the county commission's District 2 seat in January, replacing Commissioner Tom Mikesell. He took Tuesday's three-way race with 60 percent of the vote, prevailing over Gary Eller and Randy Carpenter.

He ran on a platform of traditional GOP values: less government, lower taxes and fewer laws. One key-stone idea was to change the policy regarding delinquent property taxes from out-right county seizure to short-selling the property, keeping the owed tax and returning the difference to the former owner.

He also wanted to try to incentivize department savings by allowing a portion of those savings to stay in that department's general fund; he has since said other county officials told him that wouldn't be allowable.

Mills said he's looking at attending a two-day class on government operations for newly elected officials hosted by the state. The assistant supervisor at ConAgra Foods Lamb Weston said he'll probably end that career in mid-December.

"I'm actually pretty excited about (the commissioner position)," he said. "It's just going to be a different thing for me, but I'm going to tackle it."

His soon-to-be colleague commissioners, Republicans Terry Kramer and

George Urie, were purposefully reserved.

"We always work together regardless of who (sits)," said Urie, the chairman, adding that doesn't mean agreement. "Everyone needs to still express their own opinions. That's why there is the three of us."

Kramer echoed that, adding that the commissioners expect to respect Mills and each other's opin-

ions, agree to disagree and to move on.

"We're excited about having a new person here and excited to be meeting with Leon Mills and we're excited to be working with him," Kramer said. "We think Leon will be a good addition. He brings a lot to the table, working for private industry and business, and he has a lot of volunteer time under his belt."

## Washington Street paving begins today

Road crews are working to complete a large portion of the Washington Street North project in Twin Falls before winter.

That, according to an Idaho Transportation Department press release, means the road's southbound lanes between Cheney Drive and Wirsching Avenue will be paved

starting today.

The work will last three weeks, depending on weather. All roads and private approaches on the west side of Washington will be closed during paving. The intersections with Falls Avenue and North College Road will also close during the work, reopening as soon as the asphalt cools.

Washington's two northbound lanes will be converted

into single lanes traveling in each direction. ITD recommends drivers find alternate routes, and use caution when traveling through the construction zone.

DEBCO Construction, of Orofino, is the contractor for the \$6.5 million project sponsored by the city of Twin Falls. ITD is administering the federally funded project for the city.

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## Shoshone council reviews game of Rambo

SHOSHONE — The Shoshone City Council on Tuesday heard concerns from parents and teenagers after police broke up a game of Rambo on Oct. 23.

The game, similar to hide and seek, is played on a city-wide level with the seeker in a car.

Shanyn Schenk — whose 18-year-old daughter, Jessica Lowe, was one of the teenagers involved — said she was upset about how the police handled the incident. She said she appreciated the need for obeying rules to keep Rambo players and citizens safe, but thought the reaction was excessive.

"I think the city police had the opportunity to create an environment where our children felt safe and welcome, and instead they turned it around and made them feel unwelcome and

threatened," she said.

Police Chief Jon Daubner and three of the other officers involved were at the meeting. Daubner said the officers' intent was to respond to suspicious behavior, such as cars making sharp turns. When they realized what they were responding to, he said, the intent changed to emphasize the need for safety and the ramifications trespassing or other offenses could have on students' future school or career choices.

The police, council members and Schenk in the end agreed that the police need to be made aware of future games of Rambo before they take place.

Councilmen David Wendell and Mike Wallace both had daughters who were involved with the game.

"You come to (Daubner) with anything and he'll be more likely to say 'go ahead.' And when it comes to

nighttime, he's got cooler toys than you do and he can see you," Wallace said.

Russell Sweet, 17, who told the council he was the "mastermind" of the quashed game, agreed.

"I would like to start over because we had the intention of staying out of lawns and obeying traffic laws but we didn't really get a chance," Sweet said.

"(Daubner) just assumed the worst and I can't blame him."

The council also revisited which city employee certifications qualify for new \$50 raises. Councilman Dan Pierson suggested designating some certifications for one-time bonuses instead of a monthly raise. Daubner and city maintenance supervisor Aaron Aggeler were tasked with creating lists of certifications in their departments, which will help the council decide which ones receive bonuses or raises.

# Conservative tide swamps most Idaho Democrats

How did the most electable candidate Idaho Democrats have nominated for governor since Cecil Andrus wind up with less than one-third of the votes? Why did Democratic Congressman Walt Minnick blow a 10-point lead in a month and end up losing by 8 percentage points?

And how come an Idaho electorate so wary of taxes approved the most far-reaching expansion of public debt authority since statehood?

Those are just some of the mysteries of the angry, overheated election of 2010.

What’s not a mystery is that Tuesday was a very good day to be a Republican in Idaho. The GOP swept all seven statewide constitutional offices, and the smallest margin of victory was Gov. C.L. “Butch” Otter’s 26.4 percentage-point win over Democrat Keith Allred. Republicans ran the table in congressional races as well, consigning Minnick to retirement after just one term.

And the GOP picked up five seats in the House of Representatives, leaving Democrats with just 13 votes in the 70-member chamber.

Otter, a Republican who recently seemed to be on the ropes politically because of his response to the sagging economy, won 42 of the state’s 44 counties. Allred — a socially conservative Mormon with impeccable bipartisan credentials — actually did worse in heavily LDS eastern Idaho than Catholic Jerry Brady did four years ago, running behind Brady’s percentages in Bear Lake, Bingham, Bonneville, Cassia, Clark, Lemhi, Oneida and Teton counties.

That’s significant, because in six previous statewide races eastern Idaho had been the most troublesome region for Otter.

A comparison between Allred’s performance and that of the last Mormon the Democrats nominated for governor — Larry EchoHawk — is striking. In 14 Idaho counties with LDS majorities in 1994, EchoHawk won 43 percent of the vote. This year, Allred took less than 33 percent.

Was Allred, who holds degrees from Stanford and UCLA and taught at Harvard and Columbia, perceived as too cerebral to be governor of Idaho? Perhaps, but his message of tax reform — eliminating some sales tax exemptions and using the money to reduce corporate and personal tax rates — never really clicked with voters, who also seemed unpersuaded that the Democrat could have done better than Otter in funding public schools.

But at least Allred was consistent with policy positions he staked out years ago when he began The Common Interest, a public interest lobby. Minnick tacked so hard to the right that, for practical purposes, he ceased to be a Democrat. Voters in the conservative 1st Congressional District decided they’d rather have a real Republican instead, so they elected Raul Labrador.

Four constitutional amendments passed with flying colors, including measures to allow airports, public hospitals and municipal power companies to take on debt or sign long-term contracts without first seeking permission at the polls. The amendments require that any debt taken on for projects be paid for with revenue rather than taxes.

In south-central Idaho, legislative and county courthouse incumbents all won Tuesday night — coming off a primary election in which six incumbent commissioners and a state senator lost their seats. Change was in order with the College of Southern Idaho Board of Trustees, though, as voters retired LeRoy Craig and Charles Lehrman — both board members since 1974 — in favor of Bob Keegan and Karl Kleinkopf.

And a third try by Jerome County commissioners to get 66 2/3 percent of taxpayers to sign off to building a new jail failed. There may not be a fourth attempt anytime soon.

What does it all mean? Look for a very conservative 61st Idaho Legislature — which convenes in 10 weeks — and a governor who just received a ringing mandate to continue his tightfisted ways.

How loud a mandate? In Jerome County, for example, where 58 percent of registered voters cast ballots in turnout nearly unprecedented for a non-presidential year, two-thirds said yes to Butch.

# How Obama saved capitalism and lost the midterm elections

If I were one of the big corporate donors who bankrolled the Republican tide that carried into office more than 50 new Republicans in the House, I would be wary of what you just bought.

For no matter your view of President Obama, he effectively saved capitalism. And for that, he paid a terrible political price.

Suppose you had \$100,000 to invest on the day Barack Obama was inaugurated. Why bet on a liberal Democrat? Here’s why: the presidency of George W. Bush produced the worst stock market decline of any president in history. The net worth of American households collapsed as Bush slipped away. And if you needed a loan to buy a house or stay in business, private sector borrowing was dead when he handed over power.

As of election day, Nov. 2, 2010, your \$100,000 was worth about \$177,000 if invested strictly in the NASDAQ average for the entirety of the Obama administration, and \$148,000 if bet on the Standard & Poors 500 major companies. This works out to returns of 77 percent and 48 percent.

But markets, though forward-looking, are not considered accurate measurements of the economy, and the Great Recession skewed the Bush numbers. OK. How about looking at the big financial institutions that keep the motors of capitalism running — banks and auto companies?

The banking system was resuscitated by \$700 billion in bailouts started by Bush, and finished by Obama, with help from the Federal Reserve. It worked. The government is expected to break even on a risky bet to stabilize the global free market system. Had Obama followed the populist instincts of many in his party, the underpinnings of big capitalism could have collapsed.

Saving the American auto industry is a monumental achievement that few appreciate, unless you live in Michigan. After getting their taxpayer lifeline from



Obama, both General Motors and Chrysler are now making money by making cars. New plants are even scheduled to open. More than 1 million jobs would have disappeared had the domestic auto sector been liquidated.

“An apology is due Barack Obama,” wrote *The Economist*, which had opposed the \$86 billion auto bailout. As for Government Motors: after emerging from bankruptcy, it will go public with a new stock offering in just a few weeks, and the United States government, with its 60 percent share of common stock, stands to make a profit. Yes, an industry was saved, and the government will probably make money on the deal.

Interest rates are at record lows. Corporate profits are lighting up boardrooms; it is one of the best years for earnings in a decade.

All of the above is good for capitalism, and should end any serious-minded discussion about Obama the socialist. But more than anything, the fact that the president took on the structural flaws of a broken free enterprise system instead of focusing on things that the average voter could understand explains why his party was routed on Tuesday.

The three signature accomplishments of his first two years — a health care law that will make life easier for millions of people, financial reform that attempts to level the playing field with Wall Street, and the \$814 billion stimulus package — have all been recast as big government blunders, rejected by the emerging majority.

But each of them, in its way, should strengthen the system. The health law will hold costs down, while giving millions the chance at getting care, according to the nonpartisan Congressional Budget Office. Financial reform seeks to prevent the kind of melt-down that caused the global economic collapse. And the stimulus, though it drastically raised the deficit, saved about 3 million jobs, again according to the CBO. It also gave a majority of taxpayers a one-time cut.

Of course, nobody gets credit for preventing a plane crash. “It could have been much worse!” is not a rallying cry. And, more telling, despite a meager uptick in job growth this year, the unemployment rate rose from 7.6 percent in the month Obama took office to 9.6 today.

Obama should hector the companies sitting on piles of cash but not hiring new workers. For those who do hire, and create new jobs, he can offer tax incentives. He should finger the financial giants for refusing to clean up their own mess in the foreclosure crisis. He should point to the long overdue protections for credit card holders that came with reform.

And he should veto, veto, veto any bill that attempts to roll back some of the basic protections for people against the institutions that have so much control over their lives — insurance companies, Wall Street and big oil.

# Maybe — just maybe — it’s time for Social Security reform

The budget deficit figured prominently in much of the discussion surrounding Tuesday’s election. Yet the outcome of the election will do little of meaning to restrain our medium-term deficits — and arguably makes a serious medium-term deficit reduction package less likely. The silver lining is that the election could make Social Security reform more likely — if the administration chooses to jump at the opportunity.

The shift to Republican control of the House won’t help that much in restraining medium-term deficits because most of the proposals that have been put forward are either lacking details and unlikely to be viable once the details are revealed (e.g., restraining non-security discretionary spending well beyond the administration’s freeze), or don’t have that big of an impact (e.g., freezing federal salaries, especially if the military is exempted).

And as I have written previously, meaningfully reducing the deficit over the next five to 10 years

requires a significant increase in revenue — which is even less likely to be enacted given the shift in the House. In the meantime, look for a nasty fight over a debt limit increase early next year.

In contrast to the medium-term fiscal outlook, which is not improved by the election results, Social Security reform may be. Erskine Bowles and Alan Simpson, the co-chairs of the fiscal commission to report at the beginning of December, have both expressed a desire to restore solvency to Social Security. And Republican leaders have previously expressed a willingness to tackle the issue too.

Social Security is not the nation’s key long-term fiscal problem — health care is. But Social Security does face a long-term deficit, and a variety of reasonable reform plans have been proposed to address that deficit.

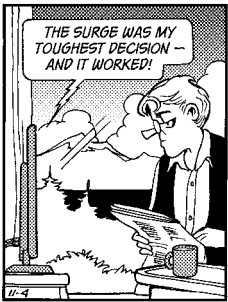
The left, though, seems adamantly opposed to restoring actuarial balance to Social Security now. I have trouble understanding this reluctance for several reasons: the key issue progressives have been concerned about — individual accounts within Social Security — has been definitively won in their favor (for now); they have a president from their party in office, which will not always be the case; acting now would allow changes to take effect more gradually, cushioning the blow; and establishing some credibility on out-year fiscal problems by enacting Social Security reform could open up (admittedly limited) running room to pass necessary additional stimulus legislation in the short run.

Given the left’s strident opposition to any serious discussion of Social Security reform, the issue will provide a key early indicator of the administration’s response to the election results.

# Haven't we been down this road before with GOP?


Talk about fired up and ready to go.

The speaker-in-waiting sounded the alarm: the elites in the White House were snuffing out the America he grew up in. It only took two years to realize that their direction for the country was simply, as he put it, "a contradiction with the vast majority of Americans."

No one gets to take America away from Americans — not even the American president!

"What the American people were saying is 'Enough!' " the speaker-to-be told me, as he savored his own win and his party's landslide, which he said was "a historical tide, not just a partisan election."

Washington had not been listening. Washington had been scorning the deepest beliefs of Americans. And now that would have to change.

"American people are clearly fed up with what they see as the decay of American society," he declared.

The new leader of the House took a more black-

and-white approach than the nuanced president. It's enshrined in the Declaration of Independence that you need the consent of the governed, and the governed did not consent.

Ascending to third in the line of succession for the presidency: a working-class kid who rose in the House as a rabble-rouser willing to throw bombs to score points against powerful Democrats.

Now he'd be helping to run the country, saving it from what he regarded as an arrogant and out-of-touch clique of elites.

In the revolutionary flush of the electoral map glowing red, he was floating, working hard to avoid floating.

But he could not resist taking a few jabs at the "liberal media elite" distorting things, and a few more at a puffed-up White House that got punished for not paying enough attention to people's anxieties.

The next speaker felt that the humbled president should take the election as a cue to be conciliatory, and he proposed they talk in the next few days. He offered to reach out to Democrats who wanted to work with his side, but also noted that the president would not be wise to stand in the way of the conservative agenda.

"I prefer to believe that this president, who is clearly very smart, is quite capable of thinking clearly about a message sent by the American people," he said.

He said that, contrary to what the media elite had been jabbering about, he would not use his subpoena power to rain down a series of investigations on the Democratic administration.

No "witch hunts," he said. Only "legitimate" investigations.

Yeah, that all worked out for Newt Gingrich. He really came through. The quotes above came from Gingrich, when I covered his heady

victory in Marietta, Ga., in the 1994 Republican landslide that made him Speaker.

And, obviously, the Republican House only pursued "legitimate" investigations of Bill Clinton. Sixteen years later, as a weeping John Boehner extolled the American values he learned at his father's bar — in the moment he dethroned

Nancy Pelosi — the new crop of anarchic conservatives are saying all the same things.

God help the Republic. And, Mr. Speaker, in the immortal words of Sharron Angle, man up!

# Fed to buy \$600 billion in bonds to aid economy

WASHINGTON — The Federal Reserve announced a bold plan Wednesday to try to invigorate the economy by buying \$600 billion more in Treasury bonds.

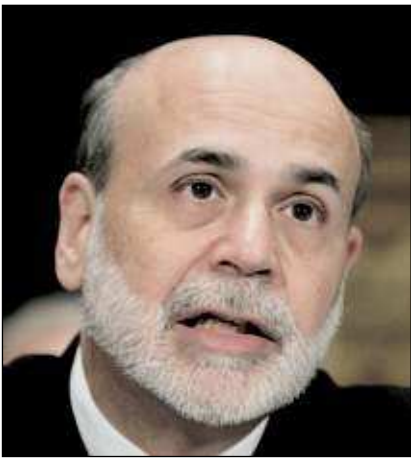
The Fed said it would buy the long-term government bonds by the middle of 2011 to further drive down interest rates on mortgages and other debt. This is in addition to an expected \$250 billion to \$300 billion in Fed purchases over the same period from reinvesting proceeds from its mortgage portfolio.

The idea is for cheaper loans to get people to spend more and stimulate hiring. The Fed said it will monitor whether adjustments are needed depending on how the economy is performing.

Some worry the Fed action will do little to boost the economy because interest rates are already historically low. Others fear the bond purchases could drive inflation too high over the long term and unleash speculative buying in assets like stocks.

In announcing the action, the Fed said the pace of the economy continues to be slow. Companies remain reluctant to hire, housing activity is depressed and consumers are increasing their spending only gradually.

Thomas Hoenig, president of the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City,

dissented for the sixth straight meeting. He says the risks of the Fed's extra stimulus outweigh the potential benefits.

With the economy weak, the Fed doesn't want to take chances that it could get stuck in the kind of economic stagnation and deflation problems that gripped Japan and led to a "lost decade" during the 1990s.

Deflation is a widespread and prolonged drop in prices of goods and services, in wages and in the values of homes and stocks. Deflation makes it harder for people and companies to pay their debts, pushing up home evictions and bankruptcies.

Fed policymakers expressed disap-

pointment that they haven't been able to reduce unemployment — now at 9.6 percent — and raise inflation to levels more in line with a healthy economy. Progress toward those goals has been disappointingly slow, the Fed acknowledged in its post-meeting statement.

The Fed has tried since the 2008 financial crisis to keep credit available to individuals and businesses. It's done so, in part, by keeping the target range for its bank lending rate near zero.

It also pursued the unorthodox strategy of buying long-term bonds. The Fed's purchases are so vast that they push down the rates on those bonds.

In 2009, the Fed bought \$1.7 trillion in mortgage and Treasury bonds. Those purchases helped lower long-term rates on home and corporate loans. The program was credited with helping to lift the country out of recession.

The action comes one day after voters frustrated by unemployment, scant pay gains and soaring home foreclosures punished Democrats and handed control of the House to Republicans. Democrats kept control of the Senate.

The split will make it harder for President Barack Obama to enact any major economic initiatives. That could put more pressure on the Fed to get the economy back on firmer footing.

Once again, the Fed pledged to hold its key interest rate at a record low near zero for "an extended period."

# New jobs multiplying in restaurant industry

LOS ANGELES — Are we becoming a nation of hamburger flippers?

While it remains incredibly tough to find a job in almost any field, the restaurant business has been adding workers at a considerable clip.

In September, restaurants and bars in the U.S. added 34,000 jobs. In that same month, the entire private sector added just 64,000 jobs.

"The economy has recovered a little bit and people want to eat out," said Jack Russo, senior consumer analyst for Edward Jones Investments. That has spurred hiring and prompted enthusiasm on Wall Street, where investors are hungry for any morsel of good news.

Restaurant stocks are soaring.

Shares of McDonald's, for example, are up by a third from this time last year, and some chains are doing even better.

For many young people entering the job market in the aftermath of the recession, jobs waiting tables and tending bar are among the few opportunities available.

Peter Osborne, who owns Pete's Cafe and Pedro's Cantina in San Francisco, recently hired 35 waiters, bartenders and other workers.

"At 25 years old, a lot of these kids have graduated college," Osborne said. "They're taking jobs that you and I might have had while we were in college."

Restaurant executives say more people are looking upon the field as a career rather than a pit stop on the way to another vocation.

### Central Idaho officials to promote tourist area

KETCHUM — The Ketchum City Council and Sun Valley City Council have each voted to approve a \$400,000 contribution to promote the central Idaho tourist region for one year.

Ketchum officials made the decision Monday, while Sun Valley officials approved the money last week.

The \$800,000 total is going to the Sun Valley Marketing Alliance.

Alliance President Jake Peters says San Francisco marketing company Eleven will be hired to develop a marketing plan for \$24,000. How the rest of the money will be spent depends on what plan is developed.

The *Idaho Mountain Express* reports the alliance will also start planning for next summer's USA Cycling Mountain Biking National Championships at Dollar Mountain.

### Ameristar reports lower income in third quarter

LAS VEGAS — Ameristar Casinos Inc. posted third quarter net income of \$12.0 million or \$0.20 per share, compared to \$14.5 million or \$0.25 per share in the prior year quarter. Adjusted earnings per share for the quarter was \$0.21, compared to \$0.27 in last year quarter.

On average, seventeen analysts polled by Thomson Reuters expected the company to report earnings of \$0.21 per share. Analysts' estimates typically exclude special items.

The company said the decrease in adjusted earnings per share from the prior-year third quarter was primarily attributable to higher income tax expense and increased depreciation expense from the Black Hawk hotel, as partially offset by lower borrowing costs.

Consolidated net revenues for the third quarter were \$299.6 million, compared to \$299.4 million in the same period last year.

# Don't let open enrollment pass you by: Costs are rising

INDIANAPOLIS — It's time for workers around the country to think — really think — about health insurance.

Open enrollment has started for many employer-sponsored benefits plans that renew their coverage Jan. 1. Next year's plans may include free preventive care and other changes thanks to the health care law Congress passed earlier this year. They

also are likely to come with a higher premium for employers and employees to pay.

Here are questions to consider as notices from your human resources department about changing or adjusting benefits start trickling into your e-mail inbox.

**Q: How will the health care overhaul affect my benefits?**

A: Several provisions of the new law take effect for plans beginning next year.

Insurers will be required to cover preventive care,

such as immunizations, without charging co-payments or other forms of cost-sharing. Lifetime limits on the dollar value of coverage will be prohibited. Adult children up to age 26 will be eligible to receive dependent coverage.

Your plan may not automatically include all these new elements. Coverage that existed before March 23 and hasn't changed substantially may be grandfathered, in which case the plan will not have to offer

the preventive coverage. Your employer will tell you whether a plan has been grandfathered.

Watts estimates that these changes from the new law could increase premiums by 2 percent or 3 percent, but that will vary depending on the plan, the people covered and the employer.

**Q: Aside from the overhaul provisions, how are benefits changing?**

A: Employers have been asking workers to share

more of the cost for their coverage through higher premiums, deductibles or co-payments or by paying a greater percentage of co-insurance, which is what a patient pays for a medical service after a plan deductible is met. Watts said they've seen this trend develop for several years.

More employers also are adding incentives to their benefits programs, so look for those. Your company may ask you to take a health risk assessment and dangle a

break on your premium or a contribution to your health savings account as motivation to get you to do it.

**Q: How much are premiums rising next year?**

A: Mercer says health care costs are expected to rise between 9 percent and 10 percent next year, but employers expect to keep premium increases to around 6 percent on average. They've increased around that percentage every year for the past five years, Watts said.

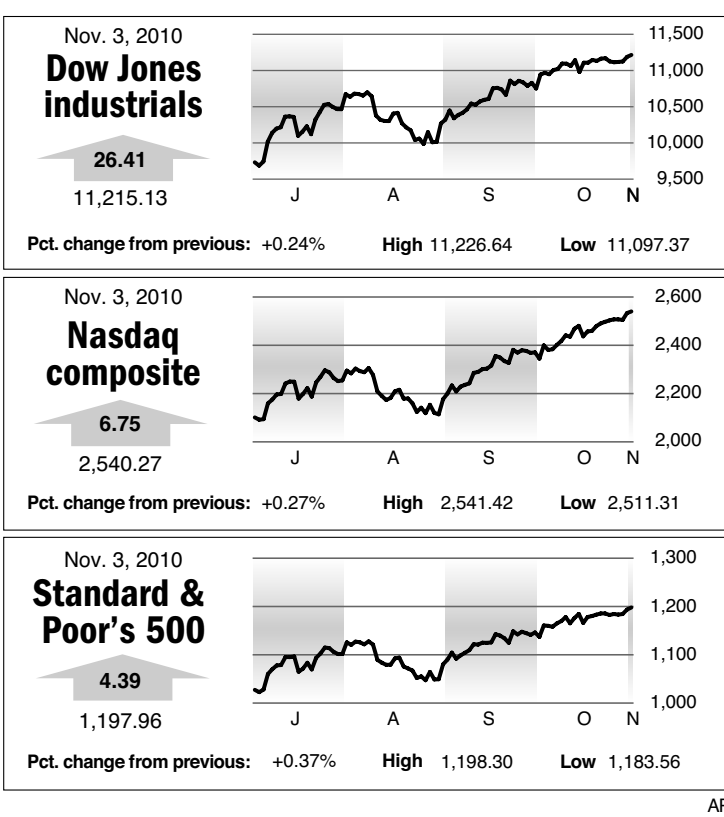

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See me, Obi-Wan Kenobi: Scientists seek 3-D video

NEW YORK — Scientists say they have taken a big step toward displaying live video in three dimensions — a technology far beyond 3-D movies and more like the “Star Wars” scene where a ghostly Princess Leia image pleads, “Help me, Obi-Wan Kenobi.”

In that classic movie, the audience sees her back before a new camera perspective shows her face. Such a wraparound view of a moving image was just movie-trick fantasy in the 1977 film, but now?

“It is actually very, very close to reality. We have demonstrated the concept that it works. It’s no longer something that is science fiction,” said Nasser Peyghambarian of the University of Arizona.

Actually, the results he and colleagues report in Thursday’s issue of the journal Nature look more like a

slide show than a video. In experiments, the technology displayed a new image only every two seconds. That’s only about one-sixtieth as fast as the system would need to produce true video.

The image also gave only a 45-degree range of viewing angles because the original was shot with 16 cameras laid out in an arc.

But Peyghambarian figures that with more development — and more cameras — his team can produce a true 3-D video screen that might reach living rooms in perhaps a decade. And you wouldn’t need those funny glasses to enjoy it.

Apart from the possibilities for entertainment, it might allow doctors in multiple places around the world to collaborate on live surgery, he said. If the screen were placed flat on a table, they could get different angles of view by walking around, just as if the patient were lying there.

Other possibilities, he

said, including eye-catching ads at shopping malls and a technique to enable designers of cars or airplanes to make changes more quickly. Live 3-D video could also help the military train troops, he said.

We see objects by perceiving the light that bounces off them. Pegyghambarian’s technology uses holograms, two-dimensional images that reconstruct the light that would have bounced off a physical object, making it look 3-D.

Many people have seen holograms of still images. The Arizona group is one of maybe half a dozen around the world that are trying to move that technology into 3-D video, said V. Michael Bove Jr. of the MIT Media Lab.

Bove said several groups, including his own, have in fact produced such videos, achieving the magic rate of 30 frames a second. But those displays are only about the size of a postcard or smaller, he said.

“We are seeing more applicants coming to us not only for the hourly jobs, but for the management programs that we have,” said Mike Mirkil, spokesman for Irvine, Calif.-based Habit Restaurants Inc., which owns 31 Habit Burger locations. “There are more people now who are really looking at the restaurant industry as a means for a career path.”

Long Beach, Calif., resident Kiri Meas, 50, didn’t hesitate last month before quitting her job of seven years as manager of a

Cinnabon bakery.

“I did not at all worry about finding another job,” she said. “The food industry is all around.”

Within three weeks she’d been scooped up by the Panda Restaurant Group to be general manager of a Panda Express restaurant. She is now one of dozens of new recruits going through training at the company’s Rosemead, Calif., headquarters, learning skills as varied as cooking Chinese food and dealing with armed intruders.

Many of the new workers will stay for years, said Gigi

Cheung, who heads hiring operations for the 18,000-employee chain.

The attraction of restaurant jobs may have increased in the aftermath of the recession, but it’s part of a long-developing trend. Over the past 20 years, the number of people working at restaurants and bars in the U.S. has increased by about 3 million, according to a Los Angeles Times analysis of data from the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics. Such work accounts for 9 percent of all private-sector jobs in the U.S., up from

Home ownership remains low; number of empty properties dips

The home ownership rate was unchanged at a 10-year low in the third quarter as banks stepped up property seizures from borrowers who defaulted on mortgages.

The home ownership rate was 66.9 percent, matching the second-quarter level that was the lowest since 1999, the Census Bureau said in a report Tuesday. The homeowner vacancy rate, or the share of properties vacant and for sale, was unchanged at 2.5 percent, according to the report.

Lenders are repossessing properties as borrowers fall behind in mortgage payments after the worst housing crash since the Great Depression. Banks seized a record 288,345 homes in the third quarter, up 22 percent from a year earlier, according to an Oct. 14 report from RealtyTrac Inc. in Irvine, Calif.

“A lot of foreclosed homes are sitting on the

market,” said Brian Bethune, chief U.S. financial economist for IHS Global Insight in Lexington, Mass. “Demand for them is weak because of the economy.”

The home ownership rate fell from 67.6 percent in the third quarter of 2009. The rate reached a record high of 69.2 percent in the second and fourth quarters of 2004.

There were 18.8 million vacant homes in the third quarter, including foreclosures, residences for sale and vacation homes, down from 18.9 million in the second quarter, according to the Census report.

Foreclosures are included in a part of the Census Bureau report that also

includes vacation homes intended for year-round use and homes that are unoccupied because they are under renovation or tied up in legal proceedings. There were 3.6 million such properties empty in the third quarter, down from 3.7 million in the second quarter, the report said. A year earlier, the number was 3.4 million.

Foreclosures could also be counted as vacant homes for sale or rent, or as owner-occupied properties if lenders have not yet evicted previous owners, the federal agency said.

There were 1.9 million empty properties on the market, down from 2 million in the second quarter, according to the report.

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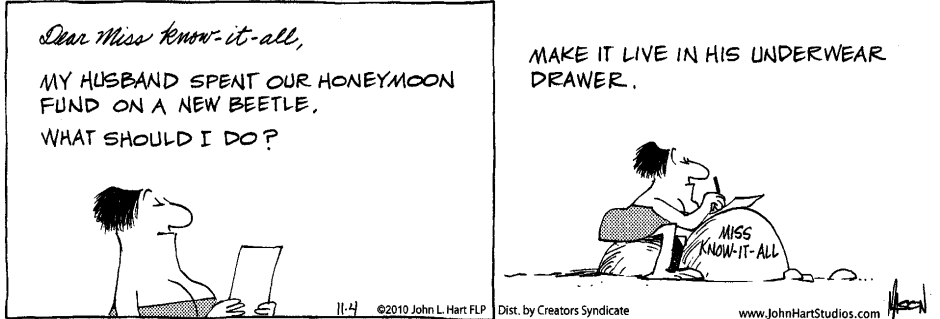

# New reality: Obama, GOP talk compromise, conflict

WASHINGTON — A chastened President Obama signaled a new willingness to yield to Republican demands on tax cuts and jettisoned a key energy priority on Wednesday, less than 24 hours after he and fellow Democrats absorbed election losses so severe he called them a shellacking.

But he bluntly swept aside any talk of repeal of his signature health care law — right after the House Speaker-in-waiting, Rep. John Boehner of Ohio, vowed Republicans would do everything they could to wipe the legislation off the books.

Boehner, a 60-year-old veteran of two decades in Congress, spoke at what amounted to his national debut as head of an incoming conservative majority that will include long-experienced lawmakers and tea party-backed political newcomers alike. He declared, “Our new majority will be the voice of the American people as they expressed it so clearly yesterday.”

Separately, the Federal Reserve announced new steps designed to further lower interest rates on loans and lead to more job creation, using powers denied mere politicians.

Taken together, the fast-paced series of events confirmed the primacy of the economy as an issue in a country with 9.6 percent unemployment, record home foreclosures and disappointingly slow growth.

In purely political terms, they also underscored a dramatic overnight power realignment after two years of grinding partisanship in Congress followed by a coarse and costly campaign.

For all the uncertainty they loosed, there was little that was ambiguous about the election results. House Republicans picked up 60 seats to capture a majority and led for five more, ending a four-year span in which Nancy Pelosi served as the first female speaker in history.

The GOP picked up at least six seats in the Senate in races reflecting both the peril and the potential of a tea party movement that emerged during the campaign. Tea party favorites were elected to Senate seats in Florida, Kentucky and Utah, but they lost in Nevada, Delaware and Colorado — at a time when Republican victories in all three would have created a 50-50 tie.

Speaking to reporters in the Capitol, Boehner said he and fellow Republicans hope the

president “will continue to be willing to work with us” on the priorities of creating jobs and cutting spending.

But, he added, “We’re going to continue to renew our efforts for a smaller, less costly and more accountable government here in Washington, D.C.”

Obama struck similar themes at his own news conference a few hours later, saying he was eager to sit down with the leaders of both political parties “and figure out how we can move forward together.” He added, “It won’t be easy,” noting the parties differ profoundly in key areas.

Sounding more conciliatory than in the past, the president said he was open to compromise with Republicans on their demand for an extension of all of the Bush-era tax cuts due to expire on Jan. 1, including those that apply to upper-income earners.

“My goal is to make sure we don’t have a huge spike in taxes for middle-class families,” he said. He omitted

mention of his campaign-long insistence that tax cuts be permitted to expire on upper-income families. The issue produced pre-election skirmishes in Congress and frequent disagreement during the campaign.

Obama also virtually abandoned legislation, hopelessly stalled in the Senate, that includes economic incentives to reduce carbon emissions from power plants, vehicles and other sources.

“I’m going to be looking for other means of addressing this problem,” he said. “Cap and trade was just one way of skinning the cat.”

Republicans have long slammed the bill as a “national energy tax” and jobs killer, and numerous Democrats sought to emphasize their opposition to the measure during their own re-election races.

Boehner, too, was asked about the expiring tax cuts, and he replied simply that he continues to believe they should all be extended.

## 20 tons of pot found near tunnel under Mexican border

SAN DIEGO — Federal authorities in San Diego have made one of the largest marijuana seizures in the United States, confiscating 20 tons of pot near an underground tunnel connecting warehouses on either side of California’s border with Mexico, officials said Wednesday.

Mexican authorities seized another four tons of pot from the warehouse on their side of the border. Officials said the lightning-speed, 12-hour operation started Tuesday night when U.S. authorities watching a warehouse under surveillance followed a tractor-trailer as it left the building.

U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents called in the California Highway Patrol, whose officers stopped the rig near Temecula and authorities found 10 tons of marijuana inside. The driver, a U.S. citizen, and his Mexican wife were arrested and will be arraigned in San Diego today.

Authorities quickly obtained a federal search warrant to go inside the warehouse, where they discovered 10 to 15 tons of marijuana — worth an estimated \$20 million, said ICE director John Morton.

They also found a wood door that opened to a hole leading to the tunnel, running the length of six football fields, under the border and into a warehouse in Mexico, Morton said.

Officials found packets being readied to be moved into the United States from the tunnel, which had lighting, ventilation and a rail system to send loads of illegal drugs into California.

## New eruption at Indonesian volcano

MOUNT MERAPI — Indonesia’s most dangerous volcano sent searing gas clouds down its scorched flanks Wednesday, while in the country’s other disaster zone, tsunami survivors were thinking twice about rebuilding homes along battered coastlines.

The twin disasters, which unfolded simultaneously just over a week ago, have claimed nearly 470 lives and sent tens of thousands fleeing to crowded emergency shelters. They were settling in for the long haul Wednesday, with relief operations expected to take weeks, possibly months.

No casualties were reported in Mount Merapi’s latest blast, which spewed hot ash and fiery rocks three miles down the mountain’s largely evacuated slopes at 8:11 a.m.

“This was a big one,” said Safari Dwiyo, a state volcanologist, who believes multiple eruptions since the mountain sprang back to life on Oct. 26 has helped ease pressure building up inside the crater.

The government has ordered airlines to circumvent Merapi for safety reasons and two international carriers briefly canceled flights altogether to airports in nearby Yogyakarta and Solo.

## Mom happy that her 10-year-old gave birth

MADRID — A Romanian Gypsy woman whose 10-year-old daughter just gave birth in Spain says she’s delighted to have a new granddaughter and doesn’t understand why the birth has shocked anyone — let alone become an international sensation.

Spanish authorities have released few details about the case to protect the girl’s privacy. But in comments published Wednesday, her mother told reporters that the baby’s father is a 13-year-old boy who is still in Romania and is no longer going out with her daughter.

The 10-year-old girl and her baby daughter plan to stay in Spain because the young couple separated, said the girl’s mother. She identified herself only as Olimpia and appeared to be in her 30s but did not give her age.

She also said she didn’t understand the attention the case was getting, because the custom of Romanian Gypsies is to allow girls to marry young even though it’s against the law in Romania.

## Kimberly woman climbs Idaho's highest peaks

The air is thinner at 12,000 feet, but the view is better.

Brenda Hughes would know.

Idaho has nine peaks over 12,000 feet tall and Hughes, of Kimberly, is one of few women recorded on IdahoSummits.com to have climbed them all, something she didn't plan on doing when she first set out to tackle Mount Borah in 2005. The goal came later, after reaching the top.

"I didn't decide until probably three years ago," she said. "I determined that I had climbed (several of the mountains) already and might as well finish them."

She started with 12,662-foot Borah and ended this year with 12,078-foot Lost River Peak on Aug. 14.

"It was a personal goal of mine," Hughes said about tackling Idaho's highest peaks. "I wouldn't recommend it for everyone."

Not everyone could climb mountains even if they wanted to. Good health and physical fitness are required, as is mental clarity.

Hughes tries to keep in good physical shape all year by regular exercise and maintaining a high-protein, low-carb diet. She said she doesn't do anything special to prepare for a climb, except about a month and a half before when she starts to jog and ride her bicycle more often.

"My rule of thumb is if you can run two miles without stopping, you're probably ready for Borah," said Dan Robbins, founder of IdahoSummits.com.

Robbins, a former Gooding resident who now lives in Boise, started climbing in the mid-1990s — "I don't know why," he said. "The mountain was there, so I climbed it" — and finished with Idaho's nine highest peaks in about 2005.

He cut his teeth with mountains close to home,

then worked his way up to larger peaks, conditioning himself for the taxing climbs. He recommends the same training for others so they can experience how their bodies react to the stress of exertion, elevation gains, et al.

Sure, people have climbed tall mountains without first trying smaller peaks, "but I wouldn't recommend it," Robbins said.

"You are going to be there for 10 hours exerting yourself. If you have bad knees, your knees will be hurting like hell. If you're scared of heights, that's going to bother you. It's time consuming, there's loose rock, it's

steep. You just never know what it's going to take."

Tools sometimes are required, depending on the

mountain and time of year of the climb. In winter, for instance, there'll be ice.

Hughes works at First

Norman Wright, who's gone on the climbs with her. He, in fact, has conquered the 12ers more than once.

"We're very fortunate to live in a state where there's a lot of great mountains," Wright said.

Besides Idaho mountains, the friends tackled New Mexico's 13,161-foot Wheeler Peak and California's 14,505-foot Mount Whitney, the tallest peak in the contiguous U.S.

Wright said he was a bit surprised when Hughes approached him about climbing Borah in 2005, but he's proud of her accomplishments.

"There's a lot of stick-to-it-ness," he said, noting that once a person climbs a mountain they often find they can accomplish other things in life.

"Other things don't seem so big," he said.

Hughes said for her mountain climbing is a stress reliever, something to take her mind off the busyness of daily work at the bank.

## Falconers keep sport of kings alive

MIAMI — Adam Grayson strode through an open field, kicking at tufts of Mexican clover. One kick flushed a dove, which flew about 10 yards before Grayson’s falcon, a guided missile with wings, intercepted it in an explosion of feathers.

The falcon, named Obi, then flew a short distance away to enjoy the fruits of his hunt.

After a few minutes, Grayson whistled and waved a lure — a piece of leather attached to a line — and Obi returned to his master’s shoulder. Grayson rewarded him with dessert, consisting of chunks of raw, defrosted quail.

Grayson, a 35-year-old Sunrise, Fla., biologist, is one of about 370 licensed falconers in Florida. It is an “all-consuming” passion, said Neal Ottoway, president of the 45-member Florida Hawking Fraternity.

Falconry — training raptors and other birds of prey to hunt — has been around for thousands of years, peaking in Europe in the Middle Ages, when it was considered the sport of kings. But in modern times, its popularity has declined as hunting with firearms took over.

Today, falconry enjoys a small, devoted following among nature lovers, hunters and outdoors enthusiasts who say it’s beneficial to the falcons and to the environment. With hunting season under way, falconers are taking to forests and fields to watch their lethal raptors do what they do best: hunt birds and small mammals.

Grayson has been captivated by birds of prey since he was 10 and saw a demonstration of their skills. He’s been a licensed falconer for

eight years and bought Obi, an aplomado falcon, from a breeder three years ago. Falconers are allowed to hunt with a variety of raptors, protected species excluded. Among the most popular in Florida are the Cooper’s hawk; red-tailed hawk; red-shouldered hawk; kestrel; Merlin; Harris hawk; goshawk; and peregrine falcon, which was taken off the federal endangered species list in 1999.

Caring for a falcon is almost like managing a prizefighter. Ottoway says the falconer must weigh the bird daily, keep track of its diet and excretory habits, and generally treat it like an Olympic athlete in training.

Becoming a licensed falconer requires jumping through several regulatory and certification hoops. Even becoming an apprentice involves passing a 100-question written exam administered by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. The

falconer-in-training must then find a licensee to sponsor and train him or her for two years.

Under the sponsor’s guidance, the apprentice learns how to trap a red-shouldered or red-tailed hawk from the wild and train it to hunt. The bird’s eight-by-eight-foot living quarters must pass inspection by a state wildlife officer.

The sport can cost anywhere from just a few hundred dollars to several thousand.

Costs include \$100 for a falconer’s permit, which is on top off the cost of a regular hunting license. With more experience, falconers may obtain general and — ultimately — master’s permits, which allow them to hunt with a greater variety of birds.

Birds of prey usually hunt in fall and winter for pigeon, dove, quail, gray squirrel, rabbit and duck. Some raptors are taken to farms and ranches, where they are helpful in controlling undesirable birds that

raid crops, including starlings and exotic invaders like the purple swamphen. During the summer, raptors rest while they molt, or grow new feathers.

Some falconers equip their birds with tracking devices in the event they fly too far away. Grayson said Obi doesn’t wander too far because “he trusts me.”

Unlike gun hunters, most falconers don’t eat what is caught, according to Eric Edwards of Lake

Hamilton, president of the Florida Falconers Association.

“Guys are not doing this to procure food. The vast majority of falconers use the game to feed the birds,” Edwards said. “It’s an enjoyment of getting out there in nature and watching what these birds do.”

Grayson says he and fellow enthusiasts treat their birds like members of the family.

“It’s totally a partnership,” he said.

you and the mountain and you have to pay attention.”

What’s the toughest Idaho mountain Hughes has climbed?

“Without a doubt, Mount Church in the Lost River Range,” she said. “The ridge

line going to the summit is more technical, definitely more challenging. You have to mentally prepare yourself to go across that.”

There are a lot of variables, but on average it takes anywhere from seven to 12 hours

to climb one of Idaho’s highest peaks, Hughes said. Coming down is much easier and quicker — taking about half the time it takes to get up.

“I always said once I was done (with the nine peaks), I was done,” Hughes said.

She since has reconsidered. Hughes likely will climb Mount Borah again next summer with her sons Scott Holmes, who she’s climbed with previously, and Casey Holmes. She’s also thinking about climbing Arizona’s

highest mountain, 12,637-foot Humphreys Peak in Coconino County.

Mountain climbing is a rewarding adventure, she said. Besides accomplishing a personal goal, the view on top is spectacular.

“There’s no better place to experience the majesty of God’s beauty than atop a mountain peak,” she said.

# Unleaded loads for waterfowl and upland game hunting

I've always subscribed to the philosophy that if it isn't broken, don't fix it. When I reminisce about my experiences with the first steel shotshells, I distinctly recall that they were seriously broken. The year was 1991 and the federal government had just mandated the use of nontoxic shot for all migratory bird hunting (excluding doves).

Several dismal seasons later, biologists realized what savvy hunters had suspected all along: more waterfowl were being crippled and lost to the ballistically-inferior nontoxic steel shot than had ever succumbed to poisoning by ingested lead pellets.

Despite public outcry, the federal mandate remained in effect and ammunition manufacturers set about the task of perfecting the new nontoxic technology. I'm pleased to report that some remarkable advances have been made in alternative nontoxic shot types and with improved powders

and wads.

Currently, no less than 15 hybrid-shot types have found a niche in the marketplace. The standard formula combines iron (steel) or bismuth with some exotic blend of tungsten, tin, nickel, bronze or polymer. All of these alternative shot blends are ballistically comparable to lead and wonderfully effective. Most also are inordinately expensive, unless you count yourself among the tweed and briar pipe set.

As an ordinary working Joe, what I needed was an economically-priced shot shell that would take the wind out of a big Northern mallard or honking Canadian gander at reasonable ranges and not cost me my kids' college funds. I'm happy to report that I have

found a number of worthy candidates.

In previous columns I've sung the praises of Winchester's Xpert High Velocity steel loads. Results from this year's hunts have only bolstered my confidence in these wonderfully effective and modestly priced shells. They are available in both 20- and 12-gauge. The 20-gauge loads can be had in 2 3/4 and 3-inch lengths, while the 12-gauge hulls are cut to 2 3/4, 3, and 3 1/2-inch dimensions. Both are loaded for all our most popular waterfowling shot sizes.

Realizing that perhaps it is only a matter of time before nontoxic bullets and shot will be required for the hunting of all game species on Wildlife Management Areas and public lands, I decided to give Winchester Xpert Game/Target steel loads a try this year on doves, grouse, and pheasants. They have proven every bit as effective on big pheas-

ants as my traditional lead game loads, perhaps even more so.

It seems that the enhanced velocity of the steel shot required less lead on crossing shots, and the size No. 6 and No. 7 shot put the early season birds down with authority.

Now, later in the season, I simply stuff my Remington 1100's magazine with Winchester Xpert No. 3 and No. 4 shells, and I'm ready for mallards rising out of an irrigation ditch or a nervous late-season rooster flushing wildly 30 yards out.

My advice to you: the next time you prepare to head out for a mixed bag hunt of upland game and waterfowl, considering "getting the lead out." You won't be disappointed with the performance of today's high-tech steel shot loads.

The agency says the fish released Monday in eastern Idaho are for catch and release because conditions in the river do not allow the

fish to reproduce.

Gregg Losinski of Fish and Game tells KIFI-TV that the fish can live up to 100 years and grow to between 12 and 20 feet.

He recommends anglers attempting to catch a sturgeon first go with someone who has fished for them before because the fish possess great strength.

The north and northeast entrances to Yellowstone will be open on Thursday, Nov. 11 to honor veterans.

All other park entrances and interior roads will close at 8 a.m. Monday, Nov. 8.

All entrance fees will be waived at all National Park Service sites on Veteran's Day for all visitors, not only for veterans and military personnel. The free admission day to honor veterans was established in 2006.

# Au revoir, Yellowstone

YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK, Wyo. — Dicey weather, closed campgrounds and scarce amenities make it a bit of a gamble to visit Yellowstone National Park in the fall, but a few savvy travelers and hardy locals are getting lucky with a last pass through the park before it closed to autos for the season.

"Everybody knows about Old Faithful, so I figured it was something special I better see," said Ken Steiner, who was traveling through Yellowstone and Grand Teton national parks two weeks ago as part of a bus tour group.

Steiner and others in his group were marveling at the scenery and raving about seeing Old Faithful without the crush of summer crowds. They also bragged about getting a bargain rate on the off-season trip.

"I don't mind the cooler weather, because it's like this on the East Coast now," said Steiner, who lives in Connecticut. He gave Old Faithful top marks as a travel

attraction, putting it on a par with the Great Sphinx of Giza in Egypt.

"Coming from the East Coast, we're definitely not used to seeing scenery so dramatic as this. It's like the Alps," he said, describing panoramas of splendid fall color set against imposing mountains.

Steiner's group had stopped on the way south from Yellowstone at the Colter Bay Visitor Center in Grand Teton. Though the center was closed, the glass-still waters around the empty marina offered a perfect chance to photograph a mirror image of mountains

reflected in the bay.

While the tourists discussed a morning moose sighting and basked in 70-degree sunshine, bus driver Phil Theisen said he was happy to be free of the maddening traffic of summer.

"June was the craziest I've ever seen it," said Theisen, who was taking his last scheduled group through both parks after starting with his first tour of the season on May 15.

Yellowstone already has seen a record 3.4 million visitors this year.

But while drivers can count on fewer traffic jams, Mother

Nature is known for fall surprises in Yellowstone country.

"This is great. This time last year, there were six inches of snow on the ground and we couldn't get through Craig Pass," Theisen said. He had to detour through Rexburg, Idaho, after that storm, and his group missed seeing the Tetons.

Near Roosevelt in Yellowstone, a couple zipped along the road in a Mini Cooper convertible. Though the top was down, their windows were up, and they sported scarves, hats and coats in simultaneous defiance and acknowledgment of the brisk fall weather.

A day later in Cooke City, Mont., the Friday after the Columbus Day closure of the Beartooth Highway, Leo Gaertner was grilling burgers in front of his Buns and Beds Deli and Cabins.

"It really doesn't affect us that much when that gate closes," Gaertner said, gesturing down the road toward the park's Northeast Entrance. "It's when the Beartooth Highway closes that it's like they've cut off a spigot."

## Steelhead season still open

There's still time for anglers to pull in some nice steelhead, as the harvest season is still open on several waters.

Fish can still be harvested on the Clearwater, Salmon, Little Salmon and lower Snake rivers.

The steelhead limit on the Snake, Salmon and Little Salmon is three per day and nine in possession. The limit on the Clearwater River is two fish per day and six in possession. Anglers may keep 20 steelhead for the season. Once limits are reached, the angler must stop fishing, even catch-and-release.

Steelhead anglers may use only barbless hooks, and may keep only hatchery

steelhead marked with a clipped adipose fin. All other steelhead must be released unharmed immediately.

Anglers must have a valid Idaho fishing license and steelhead permit. In the boundary waters on the Snake River, anglers with a valid Idaho fishing license and steelhead permit may fish where the river forms the boundary between Idaho and Oregon or Washington, but may not fish from the shoreline, including wading, and may not fish in sloughs or tributaries on the Oregon or Washington side.

## Weightlifting can be a pain

**DEAR DR. GOTT:** I have osteoarthritis, bursitis and tendinitis in both shoulders and upper arms. I hurt both shoulders while lifting weights. What is the best treatment to reduce the inflammation? Is it ice or ultrasound? Would it help to immobilize my shoulder joints with arm slings? Lifting my arms away from my body and above my head causes the most pain.

Would it hurt to try and do light exercise? Is it better to wait until the inflammation and pain go away? With proper treatment, how long do you think it will take to heal?

Would an MRI test on both shoulders help to determine how much inflammation is present and whether there are any muscle tears in the shoulder joints? I would appreciate any insight and information you can provide.

**DEAR READER:** Bursitis and tendinitis are common conditions that cause inflammation of the soft tissue around muscles and bones of the shoulders, elbows, hips, knees, ankles or wrists.

A bursa is a cushioning, fluid-filled sac located between bones, muscles, ten-

dons or skin. Bursitis occurs when a bursa becomes inflamed. Bursitis is often caused by trauma or overuse.

A tendon is a flexible band of fibrous tissue that connects muscle to bone. Tendinitis is inflammation of a tendon that commonly occurs with the repetition of an act such as weightlifting, swinging a hammer, golfing, playing tennis or a musical instrument, or other activities that place stress on joints.

There are two types of tendinitis that can affect the shoulder. Biceps tendinitis results in pain in the front or side of the shoulder. That pain may radiate to the elbow or forearm. Rotator-cuff tendinitis may result in shoulder pain at the upper outer arm and tip of the shoulder. Pain can be worsened by raising the arm above shoulder level or by lying on the affected side. Activity such as weightlifting can cause irritation to the bursa or rotator cuff and could lead to inflam-

mation and impingement.

Diagnosis can be made through medical history and examination. Physicians and/or therapists might use manual testing known as selective tissue tension to determine which tendon is involved. X-rays might be helpful in ruling out problems with arthritis or bone but will not reveal tendons and bursae. Magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) should confirm or deny any tear and its extent. An anesthetic-injection test could also confirm the diagnosis of tendinitis. During this test, lidocaine hydrochloride is injected into the painful area. If the pain is relieved temporarily, the diagnosis is confirmed.

Treatment is directed toward healing the injured bursa or tendon.

Mild symptoms are commonly relieved with rest, elevation of the affected joint and over-the-counter medications such as ibuprofen or naproxen. Ice is often used following an initial injury for up to five days but isn't generally helpful for chronic cases of either disorder. Corticosteroid injections may be given for control but should be used with caution

because they can lead to weakening or rupture of tendons, primarily those that bear weight, such as the knees and ankles. In cases where bursitis is caused by infection, antibiotics will likely be ordered. Controlled, limited exercise or physical therapy can be performed prior to complete healing. When all else fails, surgery may be necessary.

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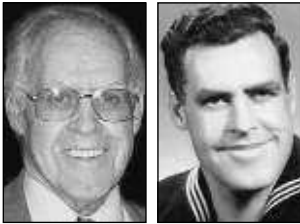
## Allen Tilley

WASHINGTON — Even after a suspected test run in September, last week's attempted mail bombings from Yemen were a shot in the dark for al-Qaida, which could not have known exactly where its packages were when they were set to explode, U.S. officials said Tuesday.

When investigators pulled the Chicago-bound packages off cargo planes in England and the United Arab Emirates Friday, they found the bombs wired to cell phones. The communication cards had been removed and the phones could not receive calls, officials said, making it likely the terrorists intended the alarm or timer functions to detonate the bombs.

"The cell phone probably would have been triggered by the alarm functions and it would have exploded mid-air," said a U.S. official briefed on the investigation, who like other officials spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss the case.

The official also said Tuesday that each bomb was attached to a syringe containing lead azide, a chemical initiator that would have detonated PETN explosives packed into each printer cartridge. Both PETN and a syringe were used in the failed bombing last Christmas of a Detroit-bound airliner.

Officials on three continents thwarted last week's mail bomb plot, the culmination of more than a month of intelligence-gathering, officials said. The Obama administration, which has been monitoring intelligence on possible mail plots since at least early September, was

preparing new security rules for international cargo in response to the attempted attack.

In response, the Obama administration intends to tighten security on U.S.-bound cargo. Security officials are considering requiring that companies provide information about incoming cargo before planes take off, one U.S. official said. Currently, the U.S. doesn't get that information until four hours before a plane lands.

A second official said the U.S. will also expand its definition of high-risk cargo, meaning more cargo will be screened from countries known as hotbeds of terrorism.

President Barack Obama stressed the need for stronger security for air cargo in a telephone conversation Tuesday with Ali Abdullah Saleh, Yemen's president, the

White House said.

Investigators believe al-Qaida mailed three innocent-looking packages from Yemen to Chicago in mid-September to watch the route they took.

One of those packages contained a copy of British author George Eliot's 1860 novel "The Mill on the Floss." Authorities were investigating whether it was a subtle calling card from Anwar al-Awlaki, the U.S.-born Yemeni cleric who has inspired a string of attempted attacks against the West.

The militant cleric is now a fugitive, targeted by a U.S. kill or capture list. Yemeni authorities put him on trial in absentia Tuesday, charging him as a new defendant in the October killing of a French security guard.

Al-Awlaki became well versed in English literature while in prison in Yemen from 2006 to 2007 and later posted

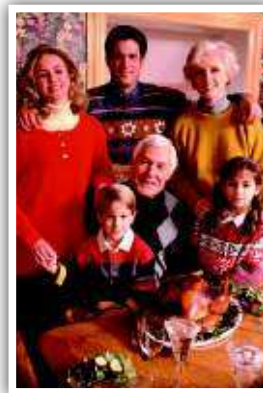
online book reviews slamming Shakespeare and praising Charles Dickens. Beyond that, however, there was no immediate connection between al-Awlaki and the book found in the package mailed in September, one U.S. official said.

Shipping carriers allow Internet users to monitor packages from point to point through the international cargo system.

While a test run would have given al-Qaida a sense of the shipping routes, there was no guarantee the route would be the same a month — or even a day — later, officials at UPS and FedEx said Tuesday. Routes change based on the weather, cargo volume and plane schedules, they said.

Neither company lets customers see precisely which planes their packages are on. Sometimes they are packed on cargo planes, sometimes on passenger planes.

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# CSI men open season at Phoenix College

Today's matchup will feature teams of similar styles

CSI is expected to start three guards, including sophomore Pierre Jackson and freshmen



Jerrold Brooks and Fabyon Harris. Freshman Mitch Bruneel will start at forward with sophomore Kenny Buckner in the post.

Harris said the season-opening road trip is a chance to "see where our strengths and our weaknesses are at, bond together as a team and get the wins."

Freshman forward Gerson do Espirito Santo has been hobbled with a sore knee of late, but an MRI Tuesday night showed no damage. Freshman guard Darius Smith is

questionable for today's game. He's had issues getting his breath ever since a car accident in Chicago shortly before coming to Twin Falls.

Smith sat out practice Tuesday and said he would likely miss this week's games before returning for the Nov. 11 home opener. But Gosar said he is hopeful Smith can play after "taking it easy" for a couple days.

The Eagles host three games next week as part of the Gordon Paving Invitational. They hope to enter that tournament with a 2-0 record.

Said Harris: "If we play together we should win."

# Eyes on the prize

## CSI volleyball focused ahead of region tournament

At last the urgency has hit home: For the College of Southern Idaho volleyball team, the chances of defending its 2009 national championship come down to one day.

This weekend CSI heads to Coeur d'Alene for the Region 18 Tournament, where the Golden Eagles will have to win two matches Friday to earn the right to defend their crown.

The coaches and players aren't panicking despite losing their last three matches and five of their final eight to close the regular season. But they clearly understand what's at stake.

"The girls are completely prepared. They know exactly what they have to do," said CSI coach Heidi Cartisser. "For them, it's all going to be about execution. If they can execute, we're going to be fine."

The Golden Eagles (22-10), ranked eighth in the country in the final poll released last week, have No. 17 Salt Lake firmly in their sights. The Bruins have taken two of the three meetings this season, including a straight-set romp in Salt Lake City last Saturday.

But CSI experimented with several ways to try to gain more productivity and fewer errors, and Cartisser hinted that the match provided some points for the Golden Eagles to ponder and might have revealed the way to properly optimize the lineup against Salt Lake's formidable front-row trio of Kellie Turner, Erika Charry and Ame' White.

If CSI can knock off Salt Lake, it will have preserved a little bit of history.

This is the third unified Region 18 Tournament with all six schools in the same bracket. Previously, there were two three-team tournaments to determine Region 18a and 18b champions.

In the past two seasons, the third seed has upset the second seed and reached the national tournament. North Idaho did it to CSI two years ago, and the Golden Eagles returned the favor on their way to the national title last season. This season CSI can do it to their bitter rivals from Utah's capital.

An early matchup with sixth-seeded Colorado Northwestern, while all but a formality in

# Ex-T.F. star Coats commits to UW

Near the end of his senior high school season, Jacob Coats began picturing himself as a Pac-10 pitcher.

Two years, two colleges and a conference reshuffling later, the former Twin Falls star will be a Pac-12 pitcher next season.

Coats confirmed to the *Times-News* Wednesday a verbal commitment to the University of Washington, where he'll join the Huskies next season with two years of eligibility after spending this season just up Interstate 5 at Everett Community College.

"They came up here and watched me in a fall game up here and I was throwing 87 to 91 (mph), which I was really happy about," Coats said. "They pulled me aside and said they really liked me, and after I visited I knew it was just a first-class program and everything had fallen into place. I really liked the idea of the Pac-10 — or the Pac-12 now — and with the respect they showed my family, it really felt like a no-brainer."

Coats played last season at the College of Idaho, with which he signed in 2009 after earning Gatorade Idaho Baseball Player of the Year honors as a senior for Twin Falls High School. He initially had his head turned by an overture from the University of Oregon, which was just starting its baseball pro-

gram at the time, but opted to remain closer to home.

He got along well with the coaching staff in Caldwell, but said it just wasn't the right fit. He played summer ball in Everett, Wash., and got to know the pitching coaches up there. Despite struggling, he earned an offer to join the team this season.

"Everett believed in me when no one else did," Coats said. "I'm feeling really good with the group I'm around. This is the perfect program, I love it here, and all the coaches around the program have been drafted or played high (college-level) ball."

Everett signed Coats up for a sophomore showcase event, where he dazzled with velocity and stuff. It was there that phone calls started coming from major colleges, and discussions with college and pro scouts began to take place.

"I've never seen that many scouts in my life, but I guess the right people saw me," he said, adding that some suggested the Huskies might be looking for his replacement around this time next season. "A lot of the scouts I talked to said I might not be back for my senior year (because of draft status)."

Coats, who said he will sign during this month's early period, said the Huskies — who were short on left-handers in their program — envision him as a potential No. 1 or No. 2 starter depending on his development.

# Titans claim WR Randy Moss off waivers

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — The Titans felt that Randy Moss was just too good to pass up twice.

So they didn't. After skipping Moss in the 1998 draft, Tennessee claimed him off the waiver wire Wednesday.

"Timing is everything," coach Jeff Fisher told The Associated Press on Wednesday night. "I really think the quicker we get him on the field, the longer he's here, the more productive he'll be. We think that he can help us, and I'm looking forward to seeing him run under

those deep balls."

The Titans didn't seem to be the front-runner to get Moss, ranking 23rd among NFL teams in the waiver system. But Tennessee was the only team to put in a claim on the talented, but much-traveled wideout.

Concerned about Moss' characer in 1998, Tennessee, then the Oilers, drafted Kevin Dyson with the 16th pick overall instead.

Fisher said the Titans did their "due diligence" on Moss. That included talking to Moss and former teammates like current Titans

backup quarterback Kerry Collins. Fisher said Moss was excited about the move, and the NFL's longest-tenured coach with his current team isn't concerned about how the 13-year veteran now with his third team this season.

second touchdown of his career with Daniel Hardy, the team's primary tight end, sidelined with a leg bruise.

"I'm very excited about Taylor Elmo's future," Akey said. "I like him now also, but as he continues to grow up, I think he's got a chance to be a special player here and in this conference."

Said offensive coordinator Steve Axman: "We really feel he has the potential to be a big-time college receiver, and we saw that last year during his redshirt (year)."

Redshirt players typically spend the bulk of their time with the scout team. But the Vandal coaches were so tantalized by Elmo's talent as a

true freshman that they kept him in the main rotation in case of an injury to seniors Kevin Small or Peter Bjorvik.

The need to remove his redshirt never materialized, and Elmo has since put another 10 to 15 pounds onto his already well-built frame.

"Oh, it's helped me a lot more," he said of the extra weight. "Last year I was a little hesitant when I went to block. That also (comes) with experience, getting an extra year of knowledge."

Last year during Elmo's first fall camp with the Vandals, the coaching staff debated whether to stick him at defensive end or tight end. Akey said at the time that his defensive and offensive assistants, who experi-

mented with Elmo at both positions, were fighting over the rookie.

After a day at defensive end, Elmo was asked by coaches which position he preferred. To him, the answer was obvious.

"I was like, 'Well, I kind of like of having the ball in my hands,'" he recalled.

Elmo threw for nearly 2,400 yards and 23 touchdowns in two years as a QB at Eisenhower while also starting at safety. Yet he drew only minimal interest from other FBS schools, perhaps because he didn't fit into a clear-cut position at the collegiate level.

Since joining the Vandals, he's gained enough trust from Enderle and the coach-

ing staff that he's lined up on the outside as a receiver and been on the field — and come up big — during key passing situations near the end zone.

"You're seeing he's a very, very good athlete and he's making some great catches and doing some great things athletically," Akey said.

**Notes:** Akey is optimistic that Hardy, Idaho's senior standout tight end, will play Saturday against Nevada. Tailback Princeton McCarty and guard Tevita Halaholo, both of whom missed the Hawaii game due to injuries, practiced Tuesday. ... He has one more year. Harris has been tearing it up on the cross country course since eighth grade when he qualified for nationals, placing seventh.

"I realized then this was my thing," Harris said. You think?

He's led the Bruins to two cross country championships, won the 4A state championship this spring in the 800 meters and is running at the Nike Northwest regional race in Boise on Nov. 13 with a goal of qualifying for nationals.

He runs a 4:26 mile, a 1:56 half-mile and trains all year long.

Said Harris: "You set your own limitations. I like the fact that in order to get really good you have to do it year

round and there really is no end to the season. ... I get jittery just talking about plans and goals and training."

Harris and teammate Karl Lundgren are training together for the Nike race, with Harris' dad planning the workouts. With a top-five finish in Boise, Harris could qualify for nationals in Portland, held on Dec. 4.

"What I like about the sport is that you can be as good as you want to be as long as you commit," said Harris.

Chojnacky knows a thing or two about commitment.

She burst onto the scene as a sophomore with a 3rd-place finish at state and talks began of her winning a state title the next year.

It didn't happen. She finished a disappoint-

ing 24th, but this season offered a chance for redemption.

"I had a completely new mindset this year. I had been feeling kind of down during the first of the season, and so I set my focus on running to chase away my problems. I went into every race with a new type of attitude, that I would always do my best no matter what," Chojnacky said.

She cruised through the season, winning every race except two — both times she finished behind two-time state champion Emily Nist of Bishop Kelly.

Saturday, however belonged to Chojnacky, as she outran Nist, finishing in 19:19 to join Laura Jensen (1984) and Carissa Lee (2004) as the only girls' state

champions in Jerome's rich cross country history.

"It has just begun to sink in. I had never imagined myself winning state. So many coaches have told me I could do it and finally I did. They say my hard work has finally paid off," Chojnacky said. "When I was just five feet from the finish line, the realization had kicked in that I had just won state. A huge smile emerged on my face when I realized that I had made my last senior race worthwhile."

Glad I learned how to spell Chojnacky's name and you can expect to see Harris' name prominent in the *Times-News* this time next year.

# No. 1 Duke goes uptempo in bid for fifth title

DURHAM, N.C. (AP) — Mike Krzyzewski wants everyone to choose their words carefully.

He says his top-ranked Duke team isn't defending a national title. Krzyzewski says the Blue Devils aren't trying to repeat as champions. And he points out "replacing" is the wrong verb to use when discussing the holes left by a senior class that helped hang a fourth NCAA championship banner in the Cameron Indoor Stadium rafters.

If that sounds familiar, it should: That wordplay wound up serving the Blue Devils pretty well once before.

"I think I said that about 20 years ago when we were coming off" Duke's first national title in 1991, Krzyzewski said. "And, really, it makes sense. Like Kyrie Irving and the freshmen, they haven't been a part of it. So to say you're defending something that they weren't a part of ... if I said it, it would be dumb."

Semantics aside, what Krzyzewski is saying is that he's chasing the first championship for this particular collection of Blue Devils.

Instead of simply plugging two big bodies into the lineup to fill the holes left by a pair of graduated post players, he's changing the way they'll play at both ends of the court to better

take advantage of a lineup that returns a few familiar faces but otherwise will operate at a distinctly faster pace.

"The reason 'replace' isn't so good is because we're not running the same system," Krzyzewski said. "Coaches that run a system every year — there's nothing wrong with that — then they're trying to plug in somebody, like 'I need this point guard to do what that point guard did.' We try never to do that, so you never feel like you have to be like somebody. Be yourself. Let's develop a system and go from there."

# Cheering their hometown heroes

## Thousands applaud S.F. Giants at parade

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Tens of thousands of baseball fans flocked downtown Wednesday to toast the San Francisco Giants' World Series championship and see their hometown heroes take a victory lap in a ticker-tape parade reminiscent of the one held when the team moved west from New York 52 years ago.

"This is Christmas, New Year's and your first-born all rolled into one," said Steve Williams, 51, an usher at AT&T Park as he gathered with Giants employees at the start of the parade in the financial district. "I'm on cloud nine."

Fans crowded the sidewalks and flooded Civic Center to salute a team of self-described misfits and castoffs. The die-hards showed up before dawn to stake out spots ahead of the festivity. Many skipped work and pulled their children out of school so they could catch what they said was a once-in-a-lifetime celebration.

"I want to see all the hometown heroes and share the smiles of all the fans who've been waiting their entire lives for this," said Teddy Hutcherson, 31.

Under a sunny sky, confetti rained on team members and civic dignitaries as they rode down the parade route in convertibles and cable cars on wheels. Street lamps were

festooned with orange and black — the team's colors. Large banners proclaimed the Giants as this year's World Series champions, as if the crowd needed to be reminded the team had won baseball's highest honor.

City officials did not have a specific estimate of the crowd size. But Tony Winnicker, spokesman for Mayor Gavin Newsom, said officials "believe it is the largest parade and civic event

turnout in the city's history."

Marching bands, floats and costumed mascots added to the street party atmosphere as the parade moved from the financial district, then down Market Street to the Civic Center where Mayor Gavin Newsom presented the team a key to the city.

"I've never seen anything like this is my life," center-fielder Andres Torres said as he greeted fans behind a barricade. "The parade has

been amazing."

Newsom was giddy as he described growing up a "fanatical Giants fan" and dreaming about playing for the team one day.

"I thought I'd see (a World Series championship) in my lifetime, but never thought I'd see it as mayor," Newsom said. "It's incomprehensible that this happened."

He swept aside talk of politics when asked about his victory in the state's lieutenant governor's race on Tuesday.

"Nobody here cares about that, this puts it all in perspective," he said.

Fans of Brian Wilson, the quirky reliever whose facial hair has become a local obsession, paid tribute to him by painting beards on their faces and wearing T-shirts that read, "Fear the Beard." He stoked the crowd by jumping up and down and giving people high-fives.

Sluggish Aubrey Huff, who threatened to unveil his lucky red thong at the parade, made good on his words by waving it at fans. They roared with deafening approval. He later pulled out the "rally thong" while addressing raucous fans at Civic Center.

Fans climbed onto trees and streetlights to get a better view of the stage, the police unable to reach most of them over the crush of bodies. The scent of marijuana wafted in the air even though a ballot measure aimed at legalizing pot was defeated on Election Day.

Wilson acknowledged the odor when he joked about having a heart attack. "I'm not sure where it's coming from, maybe from the electricity of the crowd or maybe from the smell of Prop. 19," he said, referring to the failed proposition.

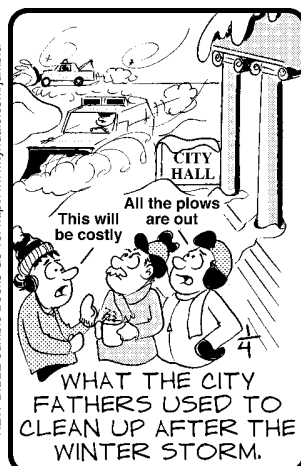

THE ACES ON BRIDGE®

In today’s auction West’s two-no-trump bid promised the minors, and over your takeout double North found an imaginative “choice-of-games” cue-bid. After West leads the club king to your ace, how do you plan the play in four spades?

Since West can have at most three major-suit cards, he is more likely to hold only one trump than any other holding. If you start from that assumption, you should attempt to cut your four top losers in spades and diamonds to three by trying to ruff your fourth diamond in dummy.

After winning the club ace, cross to the trump king in dummy and lead a diamond back to the ace. A heart to dummy’s ace allows another diamond to be led toward your hand. Because East knows he cannot gain by ruffing a loser with a master trump, your diamond king will win.

Now you put West on lead with a diamond, planning to ruff the fourth round of diamonds in dummy. Because West began with only one spade, he cannot prevent you from executing this plan. If he returns a diamond, you ruff with dummy’s five. All the defenders will score is two trump tricks to go with their diamond trick. If instead West returns a club, you will trump this in hand and lead a fourth round of diamonds, ruffing in the dummy.

Note that this line succeeds even if West has one heart and two spades; the defenders can maneuver a heart ruff, but East has one fewer natural trump trick.

ANSWER: Your partner’s cue-bid shows a game-forcing hand, but he tends not to have heart support. (With heart support he would raise to the appropriate level or jump in a short suit.) Initially, he is looking for a diamond stopper for no-trump. Since you do not have that, but do have a fifth heart, rebid your heart suit to find out where partner is going.

Trish had told me previously that she had cut people out of her life, so I guess this is just something that she does. Regardless, it hurts.

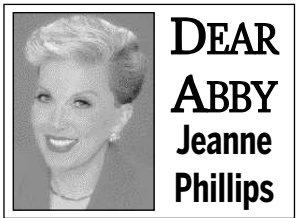

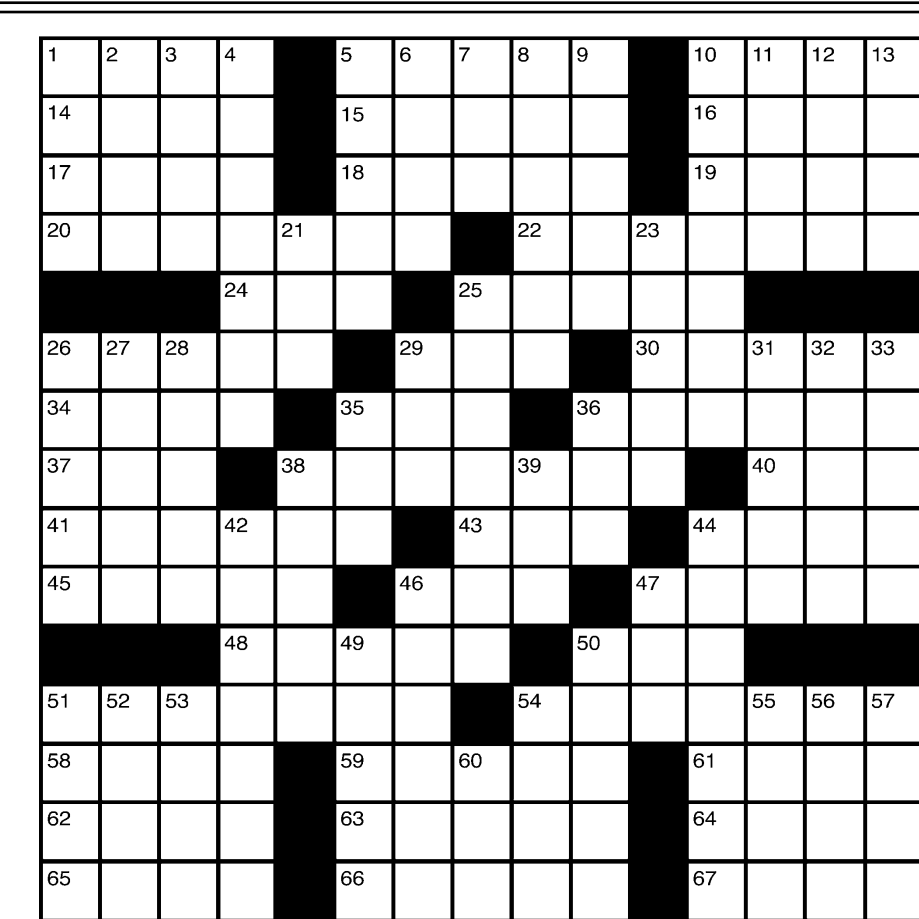
