## Nuclear waste disposal problem gains renewed scrutiny in U.S.

had better brace for another year with no increase in Social Security payments. The government is projecting a slight cost-of-living adjustment for Social Security benefits next year,

It's a fair bet that at the moment, at least as many Idahoans oppose the Luna reform initiative as support it. Wait'til next year.
