## Amid Idaho's budget trainwreck, an ongoing Medicaid disaster

E
 omes atime when enough is enough. Anew report by the Legislature's Office f Performance Evaluations shows that problems with the state's Medicaid payment system could cost Idaho several million dollars in advanced payments to providers that may not bereturned. That's in addition tolowered reimbursements from the federal government because of delays in payments.
Among OPE's recommendations is that the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare, which oversees th Medicaid program, slow down payments to Molina Healthcare, aprivate compa

time that Idaho took a harder line on Molina Healthcare's misfeasance in handling payments to Medicaid providers.
ny it hired to process Medic providers. It's about time. Molina's trouble-plagued daho operation went online last June and triggered payent delays for doctors, hos pitals and other Medicaid providers. That led Gov. C.L "Butch" Otter to promise fix ments
OPE has made several rec ommendations, including encouraging Health and Wel fare to delay payments to Molina, a LongBeach, Calif.-based managed care firm, until the company gets its act together. According to the Idaho Reporter, the state has al ready paid Molina and Unisys - whichinitially won the Medicaidmanagement contract and was later bought by Molina - $\$ 18.6$ million for the system and Molina has billed the state another $\$ 9.1$ million for op erating costs. The contract runs through 2014 Medicaid providesinsurance to more than 200,000 Idahoans who are childrenfromlow-income families, have disabilities, are elderly, or are pregnant and ow week making an average of $\$ 25$ millionin cayments providers. Typically heath care providers provide providers. Typically, health care providersprovide services topeople onMedicaid, thenbill the state. cut checks to providers for $\$ 117$ million as interimpay cut checks to providers for \$117 million as interimpay Medicaid claims in subsequent months. Almost $\$ 50$ million has been paid back to the state, but more than $\$ 16$ million is unlikely to be repaid by a June 30 deadline, according to the Idaho Reporter. OPE says Health and Welfare is having trouble collecting more than $\$ 2$ million from providers who have gone out of business or are no longer asking for Medicaid dollars. This in a state that's about to slash $\$ 35$ million more in Medicaidfunding, which will almost certainly force other providers out of business.
According to OPE, Molina's system had almost 20,000 claims waiting more than a month at the start of the year. By paying those claims in 2011 rather than 2010, Idaho's Medicaid program gave up 3 cents on every dollar. As of last week, there were almost 19,000 such claims from providers for $\$ 16.2$ million in Medicaid money. If all those claims get paid in after today, the

Molina has responded by nearly doubling its support staff. The number of pending claims has dropped by more than half since September and providers calling Molina about issues are spendingless time on hold.

So why didn't Molina bring its A- game last June? A publicly traded company, Molina has annual rev enue of $\$ 4.1$ billion, net income of $\$ 55$ million and 4,200 employees. Cleary, it has the resources to fixits Idaho problem.
